### Two-Minute Drill

- The Southern Conference has four teams ranked in the Sports Network top 25 poll this week. Furman held on to its #2 ranking, followed by Georgia Southern at fourth, Wofford checking in at #22 and Appalachian State breaking into the poll at #25. The SoCon has the second-most teams in the top 25, bettered only by the Atlantic 10 with six.

- This week's conference opener between Furman and Western Carolina pits the only two coaches in the league to be coaching at their alma mater.

- Six teams will play non-conference games this week, including three against Division I opponents: Wofford at West Virginia, Appalachian State at Kansas and The Citadel at nationally-ranked Florida State

- Two of the top 10 rushing leaders in the country are from the SoCon: Jermaine Austin is third after a 199 yard performance on Saturday, followed by teammate Jayson Foster with 142 yards.

- The SoCon will enjoy time on two TV networks this weekend. Furman heads to Western Carolina for a 6:00 kick that will be broadcast on WBTV in North Carolina and upstate South Carolina. The Citadel travels to Florida State for a 6:45 p.m. kickoff on ESPNU.

- Furman quarterback Ingle Martin compiled 233 yards on offense...to go along with his punting duties, averaging 42 yards per punt.

## Players of the Week

### OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Jermaine Austin, Georgia Southern

A senior from Darien, GA, Austin rushed for 199 yards in Georgia Southern's 41-38 overtime win over Northeastern on Saturday. He averaged 10 yards per carry on 20 attempts, including a 60-yard touchdown run just two minutes in the second half to tie the game at 24. Austin broke Georgia Southern's record for most yards in a season opener, which was previously held by Adrian Peterson with 192 yards. The performance was his second-highest single game rushing total and the 24th time in his career that he has run for 100-plus yardage. He was one yard shy of being the first SoCon player since 2003 to rush for 200 yards. Ironically, he was one of the last to do it with 207 yards against Florida International during the 2003 season. Appalachian State's Allen Atwater also rushed for 207 yards against Chattanooga in 2003.

### DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK Jeff Phillips, Chattanooga

Phillips, a redshirt freshman from Knoxville, TN, led the Mocs defense in a 30-23 Chattanooga overtime win over Tennessee Tech. Phillips picked off a pass late in the third quarter and ran it back 35 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 20. He also compiled 10 tackles, seven solo and one for a nine-yard loss, one sack and two pass breakups, leading Chattanooga to its first season-opening win since 2001. Phillips did not play in the 2004 season due to two broken ankles.

### FRESHMAN PLAYER OF THE WEEK Zach McAlister, Elon

A free safety from Anderson, SC, McAlister led the Phoenix defense with 11 tackles, including four solo stops, in Elon's 17-10 loss to Coastal Carolina. He was second on the team in tackles behind all-conference linebacker Chad Nkang.

## This Date in Southern Conference History

**Sept. 10, 1977:** Bob Tillman accounted for all of The Citadel's points in the Bulldogs 21-2 loss to the Naval Academy when he blocked a Navy punt for a safety in the second quarter.

**Sept. 10, 1977:** Chattanooga opened its 1977 campaign by busting out of the box with 337 total yards, including 292 on the ground, in a 27-13 victory over Western Kentucky. Joe Morrison's team was led on the afternoon by freshman Mike Smith, who rushed the ball 13 times for 105 yards and two touchdowns. Smith scored the first points of the second half for the Mocs when he scored on a 56-yard scamper in the fourth quarter.

**Sept. 10, 1983:** Western Carolina was shut out for the first time as a team in 64 contests in their second straight loss to an ACC foe to start 1983, falling 21-0 to Wake Forest in Winston Salem, N.C.

**Sept. 10, 1983:** The Bulldogs unveiled head coach Tom Moore's new pass-oriented, pro set offense by throwing for 319 yards and five touchdowns in the Bulldog's 35-7 season-opening win over Presbyterian before a crowd of 17,240 at Johnson Hagood Stadium.

**Sept. 10, 1983:** Appalachian State's Alonzo Upshur scored on an 85-yard pass from quarterback Randy Joyce with 5:38 left to play in the game to pull within four of James Madison, a member of the Eastern College Athletic Conference at the time. Neither would score again with the Dukes holding on to the slim 24-20 victory.

**Sept. 10, 1994:** Western Carolina gave the ACC's Georgia Tech a real scare, trailing only 31-26 to the Yellow Jackets with six minutes to play in Georgia Tech's eventual 45-26 win over the Catamounts. Western Carolina quarterback Chad Greene threw for 254 yards in the game.

**Sept. 10, 1994:** Tim McClain recovered a Georgia Southern fumble at the one-yard line with seven seconds remaining to preserve an improbable 15-14 upset win for West Georgia at Paulson Stadium.

**Sept. 10, 1994:** Furman's 26-21 win over S.C. State gave the Paladins their first win of the year, while at the same time giving Bobby Johnson his first win as a head coach. The Paladins win over the Bulldogs was also the eighth straight win for the Paladins over S.C. State since 1984.

**Sept. 10, 1994:** 2003 NFL Co-MVP Steve McNair of the Tennessee Titans led Alcorn State to a 54-38 victory over Chattanooga at the 10th annual River City Classic at Chamberlain Field.

**SoCon Student-Athletes Among the Elite:** Five Southern Conference football players are among the most prominent in the country as the Payton and Buchanan Award watch lists were announced...Only the Atlantic 10 placed more student-athletes on the list with six while the Big Sky tied the SoCon with five mentions...Appalachian State quarterback Richie Williams, Furman quarterback Ingle Martin and Georgia Southern running back Jermaine Austin were among the 16 names on the Payton Award watch list. Furman's William Freeman and Wofford's Katon Bethay were slated as Buchanan Watch list candidates...The SoCon has picked up three Payton awards and two Buchanan awards over the years...Georgia Southern's Adrian Peterson and Furman's Louis Ivory picked up back-to-back Payton Awards in 1999 and 2000 while Dexter Coakley did the same in 1995 and '96 with the Buchanan Award.

**Excelling in the Classroom:** Elon's Brandon Mason and Wofford's Ben Whitney were selected 2004 ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-Americans...Mason and Whitney joined five other SoCon student-athletes on the 2004 All-District III team...Katon Bethay, Matt Beavin, Josh Smith, Shane Fast and Jonathan Wheeler represented Wofford...For the fifth consecutive year, the Southern Conference led all District III conferences in the number of selections to the CoSIDA Academic All-District football team . . . The Academic All-District team is selected by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) . . . District III includes Division I-A and I-AA teams in Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia . . . Seven Southern Conference student-athletes earned mention on the 2004 All-District team. The Atlantic Coast Conference had the second-most selections with five student-athletes on the team . . . In 2003, the SoCon led all District III conferences with eight selections while seven student-athletes were honored in 2002...The SoCon had 10 representatives on the team in both 2001 and in 2000...To be eligible for the Academic All-District team, football players must carry a 3.2 cumulative grade-point average or higher, have reached sophomore academic and eligibility status and have played in 50 percent of their team's games.

**New Face In 2005:** The fraternity of Southern Conference head coaches experienced little change following the 2004 season...There was one head coaching change as The Citadel hired Kevin Higgins to replace John Zernhelt who left the Bulldogs to become an assistant coach with the New York Jets of the NFL...Higgins joined The Citadel from the Detroit Lions but previously was the head coach at Lehigh where he led the Mountain Hawks to playoff appearances in each of his last three seasons from 1998-2000.

**Service Academies have SoCon flavor:** The head coach at each of the three national service academies has strong ties to the Southern Conference... Navy's Paul Johnson is a graduate of Western Carolina University and was the head coach at Georgia Southern from 1997-2001, leading the Eagles to back-to-back national championships in '99 and 2000...Army head coach Bobby Ross played in the SoCon at VMI before becoming the head coach at The Citadel from 1973-77...Air Force head coach Fisher DeBerry is a graduate of SoCon member Wofford College and spent 10 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State

**58 Percent of Starters Returning:** The eight Southern Conference schools will return 58 percent of their starters for the 2005 season...Appalachian State, The Citadel and Elon will each return a total of 15 starters on offense and defense (not including specialists)...The Citadel returns a league-high eight offensive starters while Appalachian's nine defensive starters returning is a league-best...Wofford has 13 returning starters followed by Western Carolina and Furman with 12 each, and 11 for Georgia Southern...Chattanooga has the fewest returning starters with nine.

**National Rushing Leaders:** Georgia Southern led the nation in rushing in 2004 with an average of 369.9 yards per game. That marked the fourth straight season that the Eagles won the national rushing crown. In fact, Southern Conference teams have led the country in rushing yardage six times in the last 11 seasons. Before GSU's current streak, the Eagles wore the rushing crown in 1999 while The Citadel was the top running team in 1994. The Citadel also led Division I-AA in rushing in 1992.

**Spectacular Offensive Performance:** One of the greatest offensive games in SoCon history took place on Oct. 30, 2004 at Finley Stadium in Chattanooga. The Mocs defeated Appalachian State 59-56 in a game that saw numerous school and conference records set. The 115 points were the second-most ever scored in a SoCon game. Appalachian set a SoCon record for the most points scored in a loss. Quarterback Cedric Stevens of Chattanooga threw for 515 yards while ASU's Richie Williams threw for 410. The 925 yards passing by the two QB's exceeded the previous SoCon record of 898 yards. Stevens' 515 yards through the air were the second-most by a SoCon QB while Williams tied a SoCon record by throwing for three TDs in the fourth quarter. Stevens' 570 yards of total offense set a SoCon record while Williams' 517 yards were the third-most in the conference. The two teams combined for an NCAA record 16 touchdowns in the contest. The game lasted 3:40 and included 1,337 total offensive yards and 115 total points.

**Broken Record:** Thirty-four SoCon records were broken in 2005, seven team and 24 individual...Georgia Southern broke four records in its 84-3 win over Johnson C. Smith, including most rushing touchdowns (11), most points scored, most touchdowns scored (12) and largest margin of victory...GSU also set the record for most points scored in a season with 564 and most touchdowns with 77...Furman set the record for most first downs in a season with 318...Appalachian State's Richie Williams set 10 SoCon records and returns for his senior season...Fellow Mountaineer DaVon Fowlkes set 12 records, including eight season records and the career record for most punt return yards with 1,276...Chattanooga's Cedric Stevens set the record for most passing yards in a game with 570 against Appalachian State...Georgia Southern's Chaz Williams set the record for most touchdowns responsible with 38 in 2004 and 85 in his career...He also set the career record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 62.

**THE COACHES:** The winningest coach in Southern Conference football history, Jerry Moore (Baylor '61) enters his 17th season at the helm of the Mountaineer program in 2005 ... Moore has a 129-64 mark at Appalachian over the course of his 16 seasons with the school...He is also 156-112-2 over 22 seasons as a head coach... Mark Mangino (Youngstown State '87) is in his fourth year as head coach of the Jayhawks in 2005 ... Kansas has gone 13-24 since he took over the reins.
