SoCon Players of the Year (Coaches)

Offensive

Armanti Edwards, Appalachian State Jr., 6-0, 175, QB

Edwards accumulated 3,036 yards in total offense to become the SoCon's all-time total offense leader in just three seasons, and he was responsible for 34 touchdowns, including 25 passing and nine rushing.

Defensive

Jacque Roman, Appalachian State Jr., 6-1, 240, LB

He ranked second in the conference in total tackles at 107 and second in fumbles recovered with three. Roman also recorded six tackles for loss, three sacks and two interceptions on the campaign.

Freshman Dustin Taliaferro, Samford Fr., 6-3, 215, QB

Taliaferro completed 151-of-225 pass attempts for 1,745 yards and 13 touchdowns, compared to just five interceptions. He guided the Bulldogs to a 4-4 SoCon mark in their inaugural SoCon season.

Edwards Wins Walter Payton Award: Appalachian State quarterback Armanti Edwards was named as the recipient of the 2008 Walter Payton Award, which recognizes the top offensive player in FCS football. Edwards is the second straight SoCon QB to win the award, following Jayson Foster (Georgia Southern) in 2007. In total, five SoCon student-athletes have been honored with the award.

LeGree Equals League INT Mark: Appalachian State sophomore safety and first-team All-America selection Mark LeGree picked off his 10th pass of the season in ASU's 37-21 first round playoff win over South Carolina State. LeGree became the first SoCon player in 33 seasons to intercept 10 passes in a season, equaling the league's all-time single season mark shared by Furman's Vince Perone, Jr. (1972) and East Carolina's Jim Bolding (1975)

Appalachian Sits Atop SoCon Mountain Again: Appalachian State wrapped up at least a share of its fourth straight Southern Conference championship on Nov. 15 with a 24-16 win over Elon and completed the perfect SoCon season a week later at WCU. The Mountaineers joined an exclusive list of teams who have won at least four SoCon titles in a row.

SoCon Teams Set Winning Standard This Decade: In research compiled by the Big Sky Conference, the Southern Conference boasts three of the top five winningest teams in FCS football this decade (2000-present). Appalachian State's 90 overall victories during that span trail only Montana (105) while Furman (77) and Georgia Southern (76) sit in the fourth and fifth spots, respectively.

Evans, Romero Cross the 1,000-Yard Plateau: Samford sophomore running back Chris Evans became the first SoCon player to surpass the 1,000-yard mark this season in the Nov. 8 27-17 win at Georgia Southern. He finished his sophomore campaign with 1,284 yards. Evans rushed for 1,033 yards as a freshman in 2007. With 2,317 yards in just 22 career games (105.3 ypg), Evans ranks seventh among all active FCS players in career yards per game average. He is also the leading active rusher in the FCS among sophomores.

Evans was joined by Wofford All-American fullback Dane Romero, who totaled 1,078 yards and 23 touchdowns on the season. Romero, a first-team All-America honoree by The Sports Network, capped his collegiate career with an 87-yard, four touchdown effort at No. 1 James Madison in the first round of the FCS playoffs.

Georgia Southern Sets FCS Overtime Record: In its 44-41, triple overtime victory over The Citadel on Nov. 1, Georgia Southern became the first team in the 31-year history of the FCS to play in four overtime games in one season. The Eagles finished 3-1 in overtime games this season, coupling a loss to Wofford with extra-session victories against Northeastern, Western Carolina and The Citadel. Seven FCS teams have played three overtime games in a season - most recently done in 2007 by Morgan State (MEAC) and Rhode Island (Colonial).

SoCon Pair Among Nation's Rushing Elite: Appalachian State junior quarterback Armanti Edwards and Samford sophomore running back Chris Evans are among the nation's elite when it comes to 100-yard rushing games. Through Nov. 22, both rank in the FCS top 25 in active career 100-yard games; however, a deeper look at the rankings shows the each is tops nationally among his classmates. Edwards' 17 100-yard performances are equaled only by fellow juniors David McCarthy of Albany and Trevyn Smith of Weber State, and Evans' 11 games over the century mark are the most nationally among sophomores.

Edwards Becomes SoCon's Career Total Offense Leader: With 440 yards of total offense on Oct. 31 against Wofford, ASU's Armanti Edwards became the SoCon's all-time leader in total offense, surpassing the mark of former Mountaineer quarterback Richie Williams (9,370, 2002-05). Edwards now boasts 10,783 total yards in 39 games (276.5 ypg).

Hudgins Rewriting Record Books: Elon junior wide receiver Terrell Hudgins continues to shatter records with his latest entry into the SoCon record book coming in the form of a career mark. With a seven-catch, 120-yard effort against Western Carolina on Nov. 8, Hudgins surpassed Marshall's Mike Barber for the most receiving yards in league history. Hudgins broke the league records for career receptions and receiving touchdowns earlier this season. Close on Hudgins' heals is The Citadel junior Andre Roberts whose three touchdowns against Wofford (Nov. 8) moved him to second all-time on the career charts with 29.

Wilcox Kicks His Way into SoCon Record Book: Elon senior place kicker Andrew Wilcox completed one of the best seasons by a kicker in league history by booting 22 field goals in 27 attempts. Wilcox made at least one field goal in all 12 games, establishing a new SoCon mark for consecutive games with a field goal.

For his career, Wilcox made 59 field goals, placing him second on the league's career ledger behind Western Carolina's Kirk Roach (1984-87) who had 71. Additionally, the senior ended his tenure at Elon at the FCS national leader in career field goals among active players.

Game Times Decrease with New Rule Changes in 2008

When the revised rules regarding the play clock went into effect this year, many thought game times would decrease again, much like during the 2006 season. Rules changes for the 2008 season include the institution of a 40-second play clock that begins immediately following the completion of a play, except in dead ball situations. Also, when a ball carrier runs out of bounds, the clock is stopped, but it is started again when the ball is set for play (except for the final two minutes of each half.)


