QUICK HITS

Three of the six ranked SoCon teams were idle on Saturday (Appalachian State, Wofford, The Citadel), but the three who played each picked up victories ... the SoCon is now one of just two conferences to have six teams ranked in both major polls, along with the CAA ... due to the difference in each conference's size, however, two-thirds (6 of 9) of all SoCon teams are ranked compared to one-half (6 of 12) of teams from the CAA ... Elon and Georgia Southern kick off the conference portion of the SoCon schedule Saturday night in Statesboro ... the Phoenix edged Georgia Southern, 36-33, in double overtime last season to earn their first ever victory in the eight-game series ... Elon set a new school record with 667 total yards in its rout of Presbyterian.

Henton accounted for all five GSU touchdowns, including a 25-yard TD run that proved to be the game-winner in overtime.

Phillips led all defenders with a season-high 16 tackles, including four solo stops against Liberty. WCU limited the Flames' offense to 27 points below its season average.

Harris rushed for a career-high 91 yards and three touchdowns on just seven carries in Elon's 66-12 win over Presbyterian. Harris also caught three passes for 41 yards.

SoCon News and Notes



Experienced Coaches: Appalachian State head coach Jerry Moore and Wofford head coach Mike Ayers are the deans of SoCon coaches, having combined for 256 victories while coaching in the Southern Conference ... Moore's 168 wins at Appalachian are the most in league history ... Ayers is third on the list behind Moore and Duke's Wallace Wade ... Furman's Bobby Lamb (50 victories) needs 14 victories to enter the top 10.

SoCon Players Make NFL Impact: 23 players (21 on active roster, 2 on practice squads) with SoCon ties are currently on NFL rosters ... the list includes Efram Hill and Courtland Finnegan of Samford who played in the OVC and four Marshall players who competed in the SoCon ... Appalachian State leads the way with five players while Chattanooga has three ... Rob Bironas, Jerome Felton, Courtland Finnegan, Chris Hanson, Randy Moss, Terrell Owens and Chad Pennington were all in the starting lineup during week one.

Nationally-Ranked Teams: Six SoCon teams enter week four ranked in the FCS Coaches Poll and the Sports Network Poll ... Appalachian State is the consensus No. 1 team ... in the Coaches' poll, Wofford is 12th, Georgia Southern 14th, Elon 18th, The Citadel 22nd and Furman 23rd ... Wofford is 11th, Georgia Southern 16th, Elon 17th, The Citadel 21st and Furman 24th in the Sports Network rankings ... the six SoCon teams equals the Colonial Athletic Association (6).

SoCon Well-Represented on Payton/Buchanan Watch Lists: Three Southern Conference players were named to the Payton Award watch list while SoCon preseason defensive player of the year Pierre Banks from Appalachian State was chosen for the Buck Buchanan Award watch list ... ASU QB Armanti Edwards is joined on the Payton Watch List by wide receivers Terrell Hudgins (Elon) and Andre Roberts (The Citadel) ... Georgia Southern's Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, marking the fourth SoCon winner of that award.

Non-Conference Schedule Notes: The nine SoCon schools have 32 non-conference games on the schedule this season ... 10 games are against FBS opponents, including five against the SEC and four versus the ACC ... Chattanooga ventures into Big 12 territory to face preseason No. 4 Oklahoma ... among the 17 FCS non-conference games, seven come against the Big South and four are against CAA opponents ... SoCon teams will face six non-Division I teams in 2008 ... the most common SoCon opponent is Presbyterian, which will battle four SoCon teams (Appalachian State, Elon, Western Carolina and Wofford) ... the last team to face at least four SoCon opponents in the same season was Coastal Carolina, which went 2-3 against league teams in 2006 ... two-time opponents include Florida State (WCU, Chattanooga) and Liberty (Elon, WCU).

Rebuilding and Reloading: SoCon teams return 57 percent of their starters from last season (133 of 233) ... the most experienced group are the specialists (63%) followed by defense (60%) and offense (53%) ... Elon has the most experienced group of returning starters as 21 of 25 (84 percent) return from a Phoenix team which finished 7-4 overall and 4-3 in the SoCon last season ... Elon boasts the most experience group in all three categories while Samford (seven offense, eight defense, four specialist) has the second-most experience group with 70.4 percent returning ... although Georgia Southern returns nine starters on defense, the Eagles bring back a SoCon-low three starters on "O".

The Running Backs (and QBs) Keep Marching: Georgia Southern led the nation in rushing last season for the seventh time in the past nine seasons ... the Eagles' 326.27 yards per contest edged out second place Wofford (309.69) and third place Appalachian State (287.40) giving the SoCon the top three rushing teams ... individually, GSU's Jayson Foster was second in the FCS in rushing yards per game with 167.64 (1,844 total yards), and ASU quarterback Armanti Edwards (144.4 ypg/1,558 yards) would have ranked sixth had he played in the NCAA-minimum 75 percent of his team's games ... Edwards missed the minimum by one game, seeing action in 11 of 15 contests (73.3 percent).

Samford Begins SoCon Play: Samford became the Southern Conference's 12th current member and 43rd all-time when it joined the league officially on July 1 ... the school based in Birmingham, Ala. has 4,500 students, and it most recently competed in the Ohio Valley Conference ... the Bulldogs will be under the guidance of 1971 Heisman Trophy winner Pat Sullivan for the second season in 2008, and they play their first SoCon contest at Elon on Sept. 27 ... when Samford hosts Appalachian State on Oct. 11, it will mark the first Southern Conference game played in the state of Alabama since Dec. 3, 1932 when Auburn played South Carolina to a 20-20 tie in Birmingham ... the last time a SoCon team from Alabama won a league game was Nov. 24, 1932 when Alabama shut out Vanderbilt, 20-0, in Birmingham.

SoCon to Begin League Hall of Fame: The Southern Conference will induct its first-ever hall of fame class in the spring of 2009 with a ceremony in Spartanburg, S.C. ... the 88-year old league is the fifth-oldest Division I conference in the country and has seen such stars as Arnold Palmer (Wake Forest), Jerry West (West Virginia), Terrell Owens (Chattanooga) and "Hot Rod" Hundley (West Virginia) play in the league in addition to legendary coaches such as Adolph Rupp (Kentucky), Everett Case (North Carolina State), Wallace Wade (Alabama, Duke), Bear Bryant (Kentucky), General Robert Neyland (Tennessee) and Lefty Dreisell (Davidson).

Strength in the Classroom Matches Strength on the Field: In addition to boasting eight national championships and semifinal appearances in 21 of the past 25 seasons, SoCon teams also excel in the classroom ... five SoCon players earned CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All District honors in 2007, trailing the SEC's seven and leading the ACC (4), Conference USA (3), Big South (2), Pioneer (2) and CAA (1) ... Furman's Jerome Felton and Scott Shuford were joined on the list by ASU's Pierre Banks and Wofford's Dan Tavani and Kevin Adleman.

Samford Helping Out Tulane: Due to mandatory evacuations in New Orleans, the Tulane University football team practiced at Samford's Seibert Stadium earlier this month ... The New Orleans area had been evacuated due to Hurricane Gustav ... The Green Wave practiced at Seibert Stadium Monday through Thursday of that week ... In addition to Seibert Stadium, the team also used Samford's weight-training facilities, film rooms, locker rooms and other facilities.

Game Notes

SoCon teams are 20-64-5 all-time against Ivy teams, but only four of those contests have been played at SoCon sites ... the last SoCon/Ivy game was a 46-0 Marshall win over Brown on Sept. 28, 1991 ... The Citadel has two games under its belt in 2008 while Princeton is opening up the season.

Sept. 13 - Liberty 19, Western Carolina 16
 Western Carolina scored nine unanswered points in the final frame - including a 78-yard touchdown pass from senior Andy Horn to Marquel Pittman and the first career field goal from junior Blake Bostic, but it was not enough as Liberty escaped with a three-point, 19-16, victory Saturday night.

Game Notes

Presbyterian faces the third of four SoCon opponents this season ... the Blue Hose previously lost to Wofford (38-21) and Elon (66-12) and will visit No. 1 Appalachian State on Sept. 27 ... WCU defeated PC, 33-20, in 2007 - the Catamounts' only victory of the season ... despite not throwing an interception all season, WCU ranks last in the league in turnover margin (-1.00 per/G) as it has fumbled three times and has not forced a turnover in its first three games.

Game Times Decrease with New Rule Changes in 2008

When the revised rules regarding the play clock went into effect this year, many thought game times would decrease again, much like during the 2006 season. Rules changes for the 2008 season include the institution of a 40-second play clock that begins immediately following the completion of a play, except in dead ball situations. Also, when a ball carrier runs out of bounds, the clock is stopped, but it is started again when the ball is set for play (except for the final two minutes of each half.)
