PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Donald Sims - Appalachian State

Sims averaged 30.5 points a game last week as the Mountaineers went 1-1. He scored 21 points in just 23 minutes against Montreat College last Tuesday. Sims then scored 40 points on the road at Mississippi State Friday night as the Mountaineers fell to the Bulldogs, 76-74 in Starkville, Miss.

He knocked down seven three-pointers at Mississippi State and came just two points shy of MSU's Humphrey Coliseum scoring record. Sims finished the week with nine assists, eight rebounds and five steals. His 40 points are the second-highest by any NCAA Division I player this season. He moved into sixth place on the ASU all-time scoring list with 1,612 career points and is just the sixth Mountaineer to reach the 1,600-point plateau.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included Andrew Goudelock (CofC), Austin Dahn (CIT), Brendan McKillop (DAV), Amu Saaka (FUR), Ben Drayton III (GSU), Josh Davis (SAM), Mike Williams (WCU) and Jamar Diggs (WOF).

TEAM REPORTS

APPALACHIAN STATE MOUNTAINEERS



- Donald Sims lit up Mississippi State for 40 points last Friday and pulled his season scoring average up to 26.3 points per game in the process. Alongside guard Omar Carter, the pair is the highest-scoring duo of teammates in the nation with a combined 46.3 points per game.
- Through one full week of games, ASU finds itself

at the top of the Southern Conference statistics tables in numerous categories. ASU is first in scoring offense (88.0 ppg), scoring margin (+10.3) and rebounding (43.0 rpg).

- Appalachian State visits Tennessee Tech Thursday night.

ELON PHOENIX



- Freshman Jack Isenbarger has made an immediate impact for the Phoenix. Isenbarger leads the team and ranks tenth in the conference with 15.8 points per game. His 4.5 assists per game is tied for the third best mark in the league. Isenbarger has made 90 percent of his free throws.

- Elon has seen a dramatic increase in its scoring through the first four games this season. The Phoenix average 81.0 points per contest, 14 points better than 2009-10 when Elon averaged 66.9 points per game.
- The Phoenix visit Maryland Friday night.

UNCG SPARTANS



- Junior transfer Aloysius Henry leads the Southern Conference in field goal percentage. Henry has connected on 69.6 percent of his field goal attempts and is four percentage points ahead of College of Charleston's Jeremy Simmons who ranks second.

• UNCG has been one of the best teams on the offensive glass in the conference through the first two weeks of the season. The Spartans rank third in the SoCon with 14.0 offensive rebounds per game. UNCG is second in offensive rebound percent (.396).

- UNCG visits East Carolina Saturday afternoon. The Spartans return home to host North Carolina A&T on Monday.

SAMFORD BULLDOGS



- Samford's 79-68 victory at Auburn on Friday was the Bulldogs first win against the Tigers since Jan. 27, 1940. In the triumph, Samford snapped a 21-game losing streak versus Auburn and knocked down 18 3-point baskets. The Bulldogs also shot a sizzling 54.5

percent from beyond the arc and 57.8 percent from the field. The 18 3-pointers set an Auburn school record for most 3-point field goals allowed at home.

- Samford's Josh Davis and Jeffrey Merritt were both named to the all-tournament team of the 2010 Global Sports Hoops Showcase hosted by Auburn University at the brand-new Auburn Arena.
- Samford hosts Jacksonville Wednesday night in Birmingham.

CHATTANOOGA MOCS



- Three of the Mocs five games have come down to the final possession. Austin Peay made a three-pointer with 0.2 to top UTC, while the Mocs won at Kennesaw State with Josh Odem's two free throws with 4.6 remaining cementing the four-point win. Keegan Bell took a charge as time expired to give UTC a 69-68 win at Marshall.

- Chattanooga has the fourth longest active streak of making at least five three-pointers in a game with 30 consecutive games. VMI leads with 74 followed by St. Mary's (41) and Northern Colorado (33).
- Chattanooga hosts Jackson State Wednesday.

WESTERN CAROLINA CATAMOUNTS



- The Catamounts scored the program's second-ever – and second consecutive – win over a Big East foe with the win over DePaul last Tuesday. Western Carolina knocked off Louisville (91-83) last season.

• Western Carolina routed mountain-neighbor Warren Wilson to stretch its home, nonconference winning streak to seven-straight – WCU has won 28 of its past 32 home games.

- Western Carolina will participate in the Legends Classic this weekend. The Catamounts face Mercer on Friday and take on Gardner-Webb Saturday afternoon.

COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON COUGARS



- CofC currently ranks 26th nationally in field-goal percentage shooting 50.3 percent from the floor. The Cougars shot a season-high 63.6 percent at Holy Cross on Nov. 13 and 55.6 percent versus Illinois-Chicago on Nov. 20 in the subregional round of the 2K Sports Classic benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer in Toledo, Ohio.

- Andrew Goude-lock was named to the 2K Sports Classic All-Tournament Team. He averaged a team-leading 22.0 points, 3.3 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game against Rhode Island, Illinois-Chicago and host Toledo combined.
- College of Charleston visits North Carolina Sunday evening.

THE CITADEL BULLDOGS



- When Chuck Driesell's squad tips off with High Point it will mark the first of four head-to-head battles with players turned coaches from the Atlantic Coast Conference. Driesell, who played at Maryland from 1981-85, and Panthers Head Coach Scott Cherry, who captured the 1993 National Championship while at North Carolina, mark the first of these meetings.

- The Bulldogs eight four-year seniors have won 29 games at McAlister Field House during their careers, placing them in a three-way tie for 34th among the all-time most successful classes.
- The Bulldogs host High Point Tuesday.

DAVIDSON WILDCATS



- Davidson placed fourth in the Honda Puerto Rico Tip-Off after going 2-1 in the tournament. Minnesota won the tourney, West Virginia was second and Vanderbilt was third.

• Davidson has 10 underclassmen (four sophomores, six freshman) on its roster. The Wildcats have 11 total years of Division I experience in the rotation; only 25 teams in the country have less experience than Davidson.

- The Wildcats travel to face Rhode Island Saturday afternoon and host Monmouth Monday night.

FURMAN PALADINS



- Amu Saaka notched his second double-double of the season with 21 points and 11 rebounds at Kent State. His 11 boards were a career-high. Saaka is tied for fourth in the league in scoring (17.7 ppg) and ranks second in rebounds (8.0 rpg).

• The Paladins have carried over their strong defensive play from a season ago. Last year Furman held its opponents to just 68.6 points per contest, the fourth-best mark in the league. This year Furman is limiting its opponents to just 66.3 points, the second-lowest mark in the conference.

- The Paladins travel to face South Carolina State Tuesday night. Furman visits Penn State Sunday afternoon.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN EAGLES



- After connecting on just 42.8 percent of its field goal attempts last season, Georgia Southern is shooting 47.1 percent from the floor this year. It is the second-best mark in the Southern Conference. Freshman Eric Ferguson leads the team in field goal percentage (.525).

- The Eagles have continued their tough interior defense. Georgia Southern averages 4.0 blocked shots per game, including 3.0 per contest by junior Rory Spencer.
- Georgia Southern takes part in the South Padre Island Invitational this week, facing Texas Tech and Chicago State.

WOFFORD TERRIERS



- The Terriers took third place in the 2010 Charleston Classic, with Jamar Diggs named to the All-Tournament Team. Wofford's lone loss last weekend was to Georgetown, which won the tournament championship.

• Wofford has been one of the best teams in the league in taking care of the basketball. The Terriers are second in the conference in turnover margin (+1.2) and lead the SoCon in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.2).

- The Terriers host Air Force Wednesday at the Benjamin Johnson Arena.

CONFERENCE NOTES

FAMILIAR FACES

A total of 116 lettermen returned to the Southern Conference in 2010-11. Seven schools boasted at least 10 returnees from last season. League teams averaged 9.7 returners from 2008-09.

- Conference teams returned 35 starters from last year, an average of 2.9 per team. Furman is the only team in the league to return all five starters from last season. Wofford and The Citadel each return four starters.
- Eight of the ten members from the 2010 Coaches All-Conference team return for 2010-11.

HEAD COACHES

Ten of the league's 12 head coaches returned to the bench in 2010-11. The current head coaches have a combined 59 years of experience within the SoCon.

- Jason Capel took the reigns at Appalachian State after serving as an assistant for the Mountaineers during the 2009-2010 season. Chuck Driesell is in his first season as head coach at The Citadel. Driesell had spent the previous four seasons as an assistant at Maryland.
- Five SoCon coaches have won at least 100 games at their current school. Bob McKillop is approaching the 400-win plateau at Davidson while Samford's Jimmy Tillette has topped 200 wins. UNCG's Mike Dement, Chattanooga's John Shulman and Wofford's Mike Young all have at least 100 wins at their current school.

FOUR FOR 20

For the first time since the 1952-53 season, the Southern Conference had four teams win at least 20 games in 2009-10. League champion Wofford totaled 26 victories last season while North Division champion Appalachian State won 24. College of Charleston and Western Carolina each won 22 games.

- League champion North Carolina State (26), Wake Forest (22), Furman (21) and Richmond (20) all won 20 games during the 1952-53 campaign. The SoCon featured 17 teams during that season.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULING

Ten of the 12 SoCon teams are scheduled to participate in an exempt tournament this winter, from Puerto Rico (Davidson) to Cancun, Mexico (Appalachian State).

- SoCon teams will take part in the 2K Sports Classic, Charleston Classic, Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Global Sports Showcase, Legends Classic, South Padre Island Invitational, Cancun Govern's Cup, MSG Holiday Festival and Las Vegas Classic.

CONFERENCE NOTES

ANNUAL LEADERS

Appalachian State has led the league in rebounding each of the past two seasons. The Mountaineers averaged 38.5 rebounds per game last season and were +7.8 on the glass. The last time a SoCon team led the league in rebounding three straight years was Davidson from 1993-1995.

The Citadel limited its opponents to just 59.8 points per game last season. It was the third-lowest single-season average in Southern Conference history. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the league in scoring defense.

- Samford limited its opposition to 60.7 points per game last year, the eighth-best mark in league history. Wofford ranked ninth all-time in scoring defense as the Terriers held their opponents to just 61.0 points per contest.
- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

College of Charleston led the league with 326 made three-pointers in 2010. It was the third highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson and Appalachian State each tallied 279 triples a season ago. It was the ninth-highest total in league history.

MAKING THE GRADE

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in June 2010, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 950, ten points higher than the national average of 940 for Division I men's basketball programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores on October 27, 2010. Nine of the 12 SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average (65 percent) for men's basketball Division I programs. The teams scores included four-class averages taken from the 2000-2003 cohorts.

SoCON TOURNAMENT

The 2011 Southern Conference Tournament will be held March 4-7 in Chattanooga, Tenn at McKenzie Arena. The conference tournament was recently held in Chattanooga in 2005 and 2009.

The oldest league tournament in the nation, the first tournament was held in 1922 and 2011 marks the 90th year of the post-season classic.

CONFERENCE NOTES

POSTSEASON PLAY

The Southern Conference tied its league-best mark with four teams in the postseason for 2010. The league also placed four teams in postseason tournaments in 2009.

- The Wofford Terriers made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2010. Wofford fell to Wisconsin 53-49 in the first round in Jacksonville, Fla.
- Western Carolina earned a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The Catamounts fell to former SoCon member Marshall, 90-88 in Huntington, W.Va.
- Appalachian State defeated Harvard (93-71) and Marshall (80-72) in the CIT but dropped a 64-56 decision to Pacific in the semifinal.
- After defeating Eastern Kentucky (82-79) in the first round of the College Basketball Invitational, College of Charleston fell at VCU (93-86) in the second round.

BRACKETBUSTERS 2011

Five Southern Conference teams are scheduled to take part in the 2011 Bracket-Busters event on February 19. The SoCon has had at least two teams participate in the event every year since 2004. League teams went 3-1 in 2010

- College of Charleston, Western Carolina and Wofford have been designated as home teams this year while Davidson and Appalachian State will be on the road.
