UNCG's Kyle Hines Player of the Week

UNC Greensboro

UNC Greensboro forward Kyle Hines was named Southern Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 19. Hines averaged 18.7 points and 8.0 rebounds in three games, leading the Spartans to a 3-1 mark.

UNC Greensboro opened the season with an 83-74 victory over Georgia Tech and also beat Texas-Pan American (70-54) before falling at Missouri State (79-52).

Averaging 34.7 minutes per game, Hines shot 47.8 percent from the field and 66.7 percent from the free throw line with seven steals and eight blocked shots. He also dished out five assists in the three contests.

Hines became UNCG's all-time leading scorer in the game at Missouri State. He has tallied 1,647 career points, eclipsing the mark of 1,646 set by Jay Joseph. Hines' streak of consecutive double-figure games stands at 53 — the longest current streak in the nation.

Other notable performances were turned in by Western Carolina Nick Aldridge, Davidson's Stephen Curry, Chattanooga's Kevin Goffney, Georgia Southern's Louis Graham, Appalachian State's Kellen Brand and Elon's Montell Watson.

NORTH DIVISION

Appalachian State



■ Appalachian State shot a blistering 68.4 percent from the field in an 84-79 victory at Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 17. It was the second best shooting night against a Division I opponent in Mountaineer history. Five Mountaineers players scored in double figures.

■ Mountaineer opponents are outrebounding ASU 61-25 on the offensive boards. However, with the Mountaineers hot shooting, the team has had 52 fewer opportunities on the offensive boards than its opponents.

■ Kellen Brand, a native of High Point, N.C., averaged 16.5 points the first four games of the season. The sophomore guard is shooting 63.2 percent from the field.



Elon

■ With a 77-58 victory over Erskine, Elon improved to 4-1 in home openers under coach Ernie Nestor.

■ Guard Montell Watson averaged 15.0 points with 12 assists and just six turnovers in the first three games of the season. The native of Clifton Forge, Va. grabbed 10 rebounds and had four steals.

■ The 49 points allowed by Elon in its 71-49 triumph against Georgia State was the fewest points permitted by the Phoenix since surrendering 48 in a 50-48 win over Western Carolina on Jan. 21, 2006.



UNC Greensboro

■ UNCG's 2-0 start marked just the third time in the last 20 seasons that the Spartans have opened the season with two wins.

■ Kyle Hines became UNCG's all-time leading scorer when the Spartans played at Missouri State. Hines has tallied 1,647 points, eclipsing the record of 1,646 points held by Jay Joseph. Hines streak of double figure scoring games stands at 53 --- the longest streak in the nation.

■ UNCG's win at Georgia Tech was its first-ever against an ACC opponent. The Spartans are 1-24 against ACC competition.



Chattanooga

■ The Mocs will play back-to-back games against ranked opponents for the first time since Dec. 5-6, 1997 in the Harris-Teeter Pepsi Challenge in Charlotte, N.C. After playing No. 8-ranked Indiana, the Mocs will face No. 23-ranked Southern Illinois on Nov. 22 in the opening round of the Anaheim Classic.

■ The Mocs played just one non-conference road game (Indiana on Nov. 12). After three games at the Anaheim Classic, the Mocs are home for nine straight games in December.

■ Junior forward Kevin Goffney scored 13 points with nine rebounds against the Hoosiers.



Western Carolina

■ Nick Aldridge averaged 20.3 points in Western Carolina's first four games of the season. He has scored in double figures in 24 consecutive games dating back to last season.

■ Aldridge was named to the Peggy Cronin all-tournament team after averaging 19.7 points and 4.3 rebounds. He scored a game-high 22 points against Methodist and blocked three shots.



SOUTH DIVISION



College of Charleston

- Freshman Andrew Goudelock scored 27 points in the season-opener at UNC Wilmington. It marked the most points scored by a freshman since Rodney Conner tallied 29 points in College of Charleston's 70-57 triumph over South Carolina on Nov. 29, 1993.

- Trailing 50-25 at halftime against Temple, the Cougars rallied from the largest halftime deficit in school annals to post a 79-76 victory over the Owls.

- Dustin Scott's three-pointer at the buzzer gave the Cougars the win over the Owls. The shot became ESPN's Top Play of the Day for Nov. 17.



The Citadel

- The Citadel enjoys a two-game homestand with contests on Nov. 24 (Webber International) and Nov. 26 (Charleston Southern).

- The Bulldogs traveled to Philadelphia to play in the historic Palestra, falling to Pennsylvania, 93-77 on Nov. 20.



Davidson

- Sophomore Stephen Curry has already cracked Davidson's top 10 three-pointer list. Curry scored 24 points as the Wildcats fell to No. 1-ranked North Carolina, 72-68.

- Jason Richards moved into sixth place on Davidson's all-time assist list. The Bob Cousy nominee ranks second in the nation with 9.0 assists per contest.



Furman

- Freshman Justin Dehm leads the Paladins in scoring with a 13.7 average. He has scored in double figures in each of Furman's first three games of the season and has converted 9-of-13 three-point goal attempts.

- The Paladins have made 28-of-64 (43.8 percent) of their three-point attempts in the first three games. Dehm and Bobby Austin have combined to make 12-of-17 (70.6 percent) treys.



Georgia Southern

- Freshman Willie Powers has scored in double figures in each of his first four collegiate games. He is second on the squad in scoring, averaging 12.8 points per game. He is shooting 52.8 percent from the field.

- Louis Graham averaged 14.0 points and 7.5 rebounds in the first four games of the season. He had 18 points against Cleveland State and tallied 16 against UAB.

- Graham was named to the Glenn Wilkes Classic All-Tournament Team after averaging 14.3 points and 8.7 rebounds in three contests.



Wofford

- In a win against Lees-McRae, freshman Noah Dahlman posted a double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds.

- Wofford opened the season without the services of senior Shane Nichols. A preseason All-Southern Conference selection, Nichols is expected to be out of the line-up until mid-December. Teammate Matt Estep is also on the sidelines.

- Wofford closes out the month of November with home games against Virginia-Wise and Toccoa Falls.
