Appalachian State wrapped up at least a share of its fourth consecutive Southern Conference championship with a 24-16 win over Elon Saturday ... The Mountaineers became the fourth SoCon team in history to win at least four league titles in a row (full list on page 3) ... With one week remaining until the FCS playoff selection show (Sunday, Nov. 23 at 7-7:30 p.m. on ESPNU), Appalachian State is guaranteed a berth while Elon and Wofford have surpassed the minimum requirement of seven Division I wins ... Furman needs to defeat Wofford Saturday to reach seven DI victories ... Andre Roberts' fourth-quarter punt return TD against Chattanooga Saturday was his third of the season, tying a SoCon record set by Carlos Frank, also of The Citadel, in 1997.

Appalachian Sits Atop SoCon Mountain Again: Appalachian State wrapped up at least a share of its fourth straight Southern Conference championship last Saturday with a 24-16 win over Elon. The Mountaineers joined an exclusive list of teams who have won at least four SoCon titles in a row.

SoCon Teams Set Winning Standard This Decade: In research compiled by the Big Sky Conference, the Southern Conference boasts three of the top five winningest teams in FCS football this decade (2000-present). Appalachian State's 88 overall victories during that span trail only Montana (101) while Furman (77) and Georgia Southern (76) sit in the fourth and fifth spots, respectively.

Evans Crosses the 1,000-Yard Plateau Again: Samford sophomore running back Chris Evans became the first SoCon player to surpass the 1,000-yard mark this season in the Nov. 8 27-17 win at Georgia Southern. His season rushing total now sits at 1,150 yards. Evans rushed for 1,033 yards as a freshman in 2007. With 2,183 yards in just 21 career games (104.0 ypg), Evans ranks seventh among all active FCS players in career yards per game average. He is also the leading active rusher in the FCS among sophomores.

Georgia Southern Sets FCS Overtime Record: In its 44-41, triple overtime victory over The Citadel on Nov. 1, Georgia Southern became the first team in the 31-year history of the FCS to play in four overtime games in one season. The Eagles are 3-1 in overtime games this season, coupling a loss to Wofford with extra-session victories against Northeastern, Western Carolina and The Citadel. Seven FCS teams have played three overtime games in a season - most recently done in 2007 by Morgan State (MEAC) and Rhode Island (Colonial).

SoCon Pair Among Nation's Rushing Elite: Appalachian State junior quarterback Armanti Edwards and Samford sophomore running back Chris Evans are among the nation's elite when it comes to 100-yard rushing games. Through Nov. 15, both rank in the FCS top 25 in active career 100-yard games; however, a deeper look at the rankings shows the each is tops nationally among his classmates. Edwards' 17 100-yard performances are equaled only by fellow junior David McCarthy of Albany, and Evans' 10 games over the century mark ties Texas State's Karrington Bush and is three ahead of the next highest sophomore.

Edwards Becomes SoCon's Career Total Offense Leader: With 440 yards of total offense on Oct. 31 against Wofford, ASU's Armanti Edwards became the SoCon's all-time leader in total offense, surpassing the mark of former Mountaineer quarterback Richie Williams (9,370, 2002-05). Edwards now boasts 9,976 total yards in 37 games (269.6 ypg).

Hudgins Rewriting Record Books: Elon junior wide receiver Terrell Hudgins continues to shatter records with his latest entry into the SoCon record book coming in the form of a career mark. With a seven-catch, 120-yard effort against Western Carolina on Nov. 8, Hudgins surpassed Marshall's Mike Barber for the most receiving yards in league history. Hudgins broke the league records for career receptions and receiving touchdowns earlier this season. Close on Hudgins' heels is The Citadel junior Andre Roberts whose three touchdowns against Wofford (Nov. 8) moved him to second all-time on the career charts with 29.

Experienced Coaches: Appalachian State head coach Jerry Moore and Wofford head coach Mike Ayers are the deans of SoCon coaches, having combined for 270 victories while coaching in the Southern Conference ... Moore's 176 wins at Appalachian are the most in league history ... Ayers is third on the list behind Moore and Duke's Wallace Wade ... Furman's Bobby Lamb (56 victories) needs eight victories to enter the top 10.

SoCon Players Make NFL Impact: 23 players (21 on active roster, 2 on practice squads) with SoCon ties are currently on NFL rosters ... the list includes Efram Hill and Courtland Finnegan of Samford who played in the OVC and four Marshall players who competed in the SoCon ... Appalachian State leads the way with five players while Chattanooga has three ... SoCon Well-Represented on Payton/Buchanan Watch Lists: Three Southern Conference players were named to the Payton Award watch list while SoCon preseason defensive player of the year Pierre Banks from Appalachian State was chosen for the Buck Buchanan Award watch list ... ASU QB Armanti Edwards is joined on the Payton Watch List by wide receivers Terrell Hudgins (Elon) and Andre Roberts (The Citadel) ... Georgia Southern's Jayson Foster was the 2007 Payton Award winner, marking the fourth SoCon winner of that award.

SoCon to Begin League Hall of Fame: The Southern Conference will induct its first-ever hall of fame class in the spring of 2009 with a ceremony in Spartanburg, S.C. ... the 88-year old league is the fifth-oldest Division I conference in the country and has seen such stars as Arnold Palmer (Wake Forest), Jerry West (West Virginia), Terrell Owens (Chattanooga) and "Hot Rod" Hundley (West Virginia) play in the league in addition to legendary coaches such as Adolph Rupp (Kentucky), Everett Case (North Carolina State), Wallace Wade (Alabama, Duke), Bear Bryant (Kentucky), General Robert Neyland (Tennessee) and Lefty Dreisell (Davidson).

Southern Conference Tiebreaker Procedure

NCAA Automatic Bid: The Conference champion shall be awarded an automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs, provided it is eligible to compete in the post-season under NCAA guidelines. In the event that co-champions are declared, the automatic bid will be awarded as follows:

- A. In the case of a two-way tie, the automatic bid will be awarded to the winner of the game between the tied teams during the regular season;
- B.
 1. In the event of a three-way tie, the won-loss records of the tied teams against each other is first considered (i.e., head to head concept).
 2. If the teams are still tied, then each team's record against the highest seeded team not involved in the tie is considered.
 3. If the tie is still not broken, the teams' won-loss record against the next highest seeded team not involved in the tie is considered and so on down the line until the tie is broken.
 4. If the tie is still not broken, the team with the fewest points allowed among the tied teams shall be considered.
 5. If this does not resolve the tie, then the automatic bid will be determined by a random draw conducted by the Commissioner;
- C. In the event of multiple ties after a three-way tie, the same procedure as used to break a three-way tie will be applied until the tie is broken.

This Date in SoCon History

Nov. 22, 2003: Furman exploded for 635 yards of total offense, the second highest in school history, as the Paladins defeated Chattanooga, 63-21, in the season finale for both teams. Paladin kicker Danny Marshall kicked nine PATs to become the SoCon's all-time kick scoring leader with 312 points.

Nov. 22, 1997: Wofford rushed for 519 yards on 69 carries as it defeated Charleston Southern, 51-21. The Terriers had two rushers over 100 yards

for the day as both Brad Smothers and Ricky Hagood surpassed the century mark. The Terriers took a 38-7 halftime lead on the Bucs.

Nov. 22, 1997: Furman defensive end Bryan Dailer set a school record for sacks in a game with seven as the Paladins defeated Chattanooga, 43-21. Dailer, playing in his last game as a Paladin, tied the school record for career sacks, held by Kelly Fletcher, with 35.5.

Game Times Decrease with New Rule Changes in 2008

When the revised rules regarding the play clock went into effect this year, many thought game times would decrease again, much like during the 2006 season. Rules changes for the 2008 season include the institution of a 40-second play clock that begins immediately following the completion of a play, except in dead ball situations. Also, when a ball carrier runs out of bounds, the clock is stopped, but it is started again when the ball is set for play (except for the final two minutes of each half.)
