News & Notes

- The Citadel has the only non-conference home game this weekend as six league schools are on the road in non-conference play to open the season.
- Two coaches make their debut this weekend as Bruce Fowler and Jason Swepson begin their head coaching careers at Furman and Elon, respectively.
- Appalachian State was tabbed the preseason favorite in the Southern Conference by the league's head coaches. The SoCon media picked Georgia Southern to win the league's regular season championship.
- ASU's Jerry Moore, the league's all-time wins leader, needs just one more victory to reach 200 for his career with the Mountaineers.
- When Georgia Southern and Samford face off Saturday night, it will be the first time either team has opened the season with a league game as a member of the SoCon.

Quick Hits

- The Southern Conference begins its 90th season of football this weekend.
- Georgia Southern and Samford square off Saturday evening in the league's only conference game this weekend.
- SoCon teams take on four FBS opponents this weekend. League teams have a total of 25 wins over FBS opponents.
- The league's nine teams return a combined 68 percent of their starters from last season.
- SoCon teams went 15-4 in FCS nonconference games last season.

THREE FOR TEN: Three teams finished the 2010 season with 10 wins. Appalachian State and Wofford concluded the year at 10-3, while Georgia Southern was 10-5. It was the first time in the history of the Southern Conference that three league teams won at least ten games in the same season.

• The SoCon has had two teams win at least 10 games on 12 different occasions (1983, 1987, 1988, 1992, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1998, 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2010).

Rankings: The Southern Conference placed four teams in each of the preseason polls (FCS Coaches & Sports Network). The last time the league had at least four in the preseason rankings was at the start of the 2008 season when five SoCon teams cracked the preseason polls (Appalachian State, The Citadel, Elon, Georgia Southern and Wofford).

- The Mountaineers were picked second in both polls, while Georgia Southern was slotted third (FCS Coaches) and fourth (TSN) respectively.
- Wofford was selected eighth in both polls while Chattanooga was picked 21st in the Sports Network rankings and 23rd in the coaches poll.

MAKING THE GRADE: In addition to achieving success on the gridiron, SoCon teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in May, Southern Conference football teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 954, ten points higher than the national average of 944 for Division I football programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The Southern Conference's overall APR score of 978 was the ninth-highest among 31 Division I conferences.
- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores last October. Seven of the nine SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average (64 percent) for FCS programs. The teams scores included four-class averages taken from the 2000-2003 cohorts.

POLL POSITION: The Southern Conference placed three teams in the final top 25 poll in 2010. Appalachian State (4th), Georgia Southern (5th) and Wofford (6th) were all ranked in the top ten of both the FCS Coaches Poll and the Sports Network rankings.

• The last time the league placed three teams in the season-ending polls was in 2005. ASU was slotted first after winning the FCS National Championship, while Furman (3rd) and Georgia Southern (9th) were also ranked in the top ten.

Southern Conference News and Notes

CAUGHT IN THE DRAFT: The Southern Conference had five players taken in the 2011 NFL Draft in April. The five draftees were the most taken in the draft since 1992 when five SoCon student-athletes were also selected.

- Defensive Back Cortez Allen of The Citadel was the first SoCon player taken off the board when he was chosen 128th overall (4th round) by the Pittsburgh Steelers.
- Chattanooga's Buster Skrine (DB) was selected in the fifth round (#137 overall) by the Cleveland Browns.
- Appalachian State had a trio of players taken. Defensive Back Mark LeGree was selected in the fifth round by Seattle (#156) while offensive lineman Daniel Kilgore was taken with pick #163 by San Francisco. Linebacker D.J. Smith was chosen by the Green Bay Packers in the sixth round (#186).

SoCon Sports Network: This summer the conference office announced a three-year partnership with Public Television to carry Southern Conference football games. The agreement provides state-wide distribution of SoCon football games throughout Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. Additional affiliates in Birmingham, Ala., and Chattanooga, Tenn., have also signed on to carry Southern Conference football games. The distribution platform will reach more than 12 million homes through 34 affiliates.

- Each of the eight games produced this fall for public television will be streamed online live through ESPN3.com, the Southern Conference website, as well as the respective public television websites.
