PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Noah Dahlman - Wofford

Dahlman averaged 28.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and shot 73 percent from the floor as the Terriers knocked off Appalachian State (74-65) and Western Carolina (75-66) last week.

The senior opened the week with a team-high 23 points at Appalachian State. He was 9-of-16 from the field against the Mountaineers and added six rebounds, three assists and three steals in 33 minutes of action. He followed that performance with a game-high 34 points against the Catamounts. Dahlman connected on 15-of-17 field goal attempts, grabbed four rebounds and added three assists against Western Carolina.

Dahlman ranks third in the league in scoring (20.6 ppg) and leads the Southern Conference in field goal percentage (.630). The Braham, Minn., native is third in the SoCon with 2.5 offensive rebounds per game.

Other top performers in the Southern Conference included The Citadel's Cameron Wells, UNCG's Brandon Evans, Chattanooga's Ricky Taylor, Samford's John Peterson and Western Carolina's Trey Sumler.

TEAM REPORTS

APPALACHIAN STATE MOUNTAINEERS



- Omar Carter scored a team-high 26 points as ASU held off UNCG, 80-78 in overtime Wednesday night. Carter knocked down two free throws with less than 30 seconds left in overtime to lift the Mountaineers to the victory.

- Senior Donald Sims scored 23 points in Wednesday's victory. He now has 1,998 points for his career. Sims is second in the SoCon in scoring with 21.1 points per game. He is third in the league with 2.5 made three-pointers per game.

- The Mountaineers play their final Southern Conference road game of the season at Elon Saturday.

ELON PHOENIX



- Junior Drew Spradlin is nearing the 900 career point mark with 889 points. Spradlin is ninth in the conference in scoring with 14.6 points per game. He ranks seventh in the league with 2.0 made three-pointers per game.
- The Phoenix are in the midst of a three-game homestand. Elon is 7-3 at Alumni Gym this year, including a 3-3 mark in conference play.
- The Phoenix will play host to Appalachian State Saturday night. Elon will welcome College of Charleston to Alumni Gym February 9.

UNCG SPARTANS



- UNCG has dramatically increased its offensive output during its last five games. The Spartans have averaged 71.5 points per game this season, but UNCG has scored 86.3 points per contest during its last five games.
- The Spartans have five players averaging double figures. Korey Van Dussen leads the team with 10.8 points per game while Aloysius Henry has scored 10.7 points per contest. Trevis Simpson and Kyle Randall average 10.5 points while Brandon Evans averages 10.0 points per game.
- The Spartans travel to Western Carolina Saturday.

SAMFORD BULLDOGS



- Samford's Josh Davis tallied 10 points last week to move into 19th place on the school's all-time scoring list. In home games against Elon and UNCG, Davis improved his career total in points to 1,035 and moved past former Bulldog greats Mario Lopez and Trey Montgomery on Samford's all-time scoring list.
- The Bulldogs are ranked fifth in the nation in 3-point field goals per game. So far this season, Samford is averaging 9.4 3-point baskets per contest and has reached double figures in 3-pointers per game eight times.
- The Bulldogs host Davidson Thursday night.

CHATTANOOGA MOCs



- Ricky Taylor scored a career-high 41 points as Chattanooga held off UNCG 111-110 in double overtime Thursday. Taylor's 41-point output is the highest single-game scoring mark by a SoCon player this season and the highest point total for a Moc in McKenzie Arena since the program moved to Division I.
- Keegan Bell continued to add to his superior numbers at with 15 assists (7.5/gm) and just 2 turnovers (7.5 A/TO). He also averaged 19.5 pts and 3.0 rebounds playing 85 of a possible 90 minutes last week.
- Chattanooga hosts Georgia Southern Thursday night.

WESTERN CAROLINA CATAMOUNTS



- Western Carolina will welcome its men's basketball alumni on Feb. 5 as the Catamounts play host to UNCG for the first meeting between the divisional foes this season. WCU will honor its most recent former men's basketball players that were inducted into the WCU Athletics Hall of Fame – Anquell McCollum and Gaston Seal.
- The Catamounts' 74-58 win over Elon Wednesday night gave WCU its first season sweep over the Phoenix since 2005. WCU took the first meeting this year, 70-63, and picked up its first win at Alumni Gym since 2005.
- Western Carolina will host the UNCG Spartans on Saturday.

COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON COUGARS



- The Cougars are among the top 30 NCAA statistical leaders in field goal percentage (27th, 47.7) and three-point field goals per game (24th, 8.3). Senior big man Jeremy Simmons currently ranks sixth nationally shooting 61.5 percent from the floor this season which is third-best in the SoCon.
- Andrew Goudelock ranks among the top five players in the country in points per game (5th, 23.5) and three-pointers made (5th, 3.2 avg). He ranks second nationally among active NCAA Division I players this season in career points (2,210) behind national-leader Charles Jenkins of Hofstra (2,280).
- The Cougars host Wofford Thursday night.

THE CITADEL BULLDOGS



- Senior Austin Dahn became the third current member of the team to score 1,000 points. He reached the milestone with 13 points against Western Carolina. Dahn joins Urbanus (1,219), Demetrius Nelson (1,264) and Cameron Wells (1,882) as the 15th set of teammates with 1,000 career points to play alongside each other.
- Wells scored a game-high 28 points as The Citadel earned its fifth straight victory with an 85-75 win over Davidson last Wednesday. Mike Groselle added 13 points for the Bulldogs while Daniel Eykyn chipped in 12 points off the bench.
- The Citadel hosts Furman Thursday.

DAVIDSON WILDCATS



- Senior guard Brendan McKillop needs six three-pointers to move into the top five on the school's career list. McKillop has knocked down 182 career triples. He is fourth in the SoCon this season with 2.4 made three-pointers per game.
- Davidson has 10 underclassmen (four sophomores, six freshman) on its roster. The Wildcats have 11 total years of Division I experience in the rotation; only 25 teams in the country have less experience than Davidson.
- The Wildcats visit Samford Thursday night. Davidson will host Chattanooga Saturday at Belk Arena.

FURMAN PALADINS



- Furman held Appalachian State to just 61 points in Saturday's victory over the Mountaineers. The Paladins lead in the SoCon in scoring defense, as they give up just 64.4 points per game.
- The Paladins have been the most accurate team from beyond the arc in the Southern Conference. Furman has connected on 39 percent of its attempts from three-point range. Senior Noah States leads the league in three-point field goal percentage (.500).
- Furman visits The Citadel Thursday. The Paladins will travel to College of Charleston Saturday afternoon.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN EAGLES



- Junior Ben Drayton needs just 11 points to become the 37th member of the 1,000-point club at Georgia Southern. Drayton is seventh in the conference with 15.4 points per game and ranks fourth in assists with 4.1 helpers per contest.
- GSU shot 9-for-10 from the free throw line against CofC. It was the 11th time since the 2002-03 season that the Eagles have shot at least .900 from the stripe. The last time GSU was perfect from the line was Nov. 23, 2002 when the Eagles went 10-for-10 at Maine.
- Georgia Southern travels to Chattanooga Thursday.

WOFFORD TERRIERS



- The Terriers picked up wins at Appalachian State and at home against Western Carolina last week. Wofford is 6-0 against SoCon North Division opponents this season. The Terriers are also 4-0 on the road in conference games.
- Noah Dahlman has scored in double figures in 70 straight games, dating back to January 24, 2009. Dahlman is third in the conference in scoring with 20.6 points per game.
- The Terriers will visit College of Charleston Thursday. The game will be televised on ESPNU.

RECORD WATCH

Many of the impressive accomplishments from this season have placed Southern Conference teams in the league's record book.

- Samford knocked down 18 three-pointers against Auburn (Nov. 19) and UT-San Antonio (Dec. 21), which tied for the sixth-highest single-game output in league history.
- UNCG made 17 triples at Chattanooga January 27. The Spartans' 43 attempts from three-point range was the sixth highest single-game mark in league history.
- Chattanooga grabbed 60 rebounds against Reinhardt (Dec. 21). It was the sixth-highest single game rebound total in the SoCon's 90-year history.
- Western Carolina recorded 18 steals against Warren Wilson (Nov. 22), which tied for the tenth-highest steals total in the Southern Conference.
- The Mocs attempted 53 free throws against UNCG on January 27 which ranked as the tenth-highest total in the SoCon.
- Wofford's Noah Dahlman became just the ninth player in SoCon history to be perfect from the floor with at least 10 field goal attempts. Dahlman was 10-for-10 from the field against Georgia Southern on January 12.
- College of Charleston's Andrew Goudelock has made 821 career field goals, the tenth-highest total in league history. He needs 23 field goals to pass West Virginia's Jerry West (1958-60) for ninth place.

MAKING THE GRADE

In addition to achieving success on the court, SoCon teams boast impressive academic credentials. In the latest data released by the NCAA in June 2010, Southern Conference men's basketball teams posted an Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 950, ten points higher than the national average of 940 for Division I men's basketball programs. It was the third consecutive season that the SoCon average was higher than the national rate for Division I.

- The NCAA released its Graduation Success Rate scores on October 27, 2010. Nine of the 12 SoCon teams met or exceeded the national average (65 percent) for men's basketball Division I programs. The teams scores included four-class averages taken from the 2000-2003 cohorts.

CONFERENCE NOTES

FOUR FOR 20

For the first time since the 1952-53 season, the Southern Conference had four teams win at least 20 games in 2009-10. League champion Wofford totaled 26 victories last season while North Division champion Appalachian State won 24. College of Charleston and Western Carolina each won 22 games.

- League champion North Carolina State (26), Wake Forest (22), Furman (21) and Richmond (20) all won 20 games during the 1952-53 campaign. The SoCon featured 17 teams during that season.

HEAD COACHES

Ten of the league's 12 head coaches returned to the bench in 2010-11. The current head coaches have a combined 59 years of experience within the SoCon.

- Jason Capel took the reigns at Appalachian State after serving as an assistant for the Mountaineers during the 2009-2010 season. Chuck Driesell is in his first season as head coach at The Citadel. Driesell had spent the previous four seasons as an assistant at Maryland.
- Five SoCon coaches have won at least 100 games at their current school. Bob McKillop is approaching the 400-win plateau at Davidson while Samford's Jimmy Tillette has topped 200 wins. UNCG's Mike Dement, Chattanooga's John Shulman and Wofford's Mike Young all have at least 100 wins at their current school.

ANNUAL LEADERS

Appalachian State has led the league in rebounding each of the past two seasons. The Mountaineers averaged 38.5 rebounds per game last season and were +7.8 on the glass. The last time a SoCon team led the league in rebounding three straight years was Davidson from 1993-1995.

The Citadel limited its opponents to just 59.8 points per game last season. It was the third-lowest single-season average in league history. It marked the seventh consecutive season that a different team led the SoCon in scoring defense.

- Samford limited its opposition to 60.7 points per game last year, the eighth-best mark in league history. Wofford ranked ninth all-time in scoring defense as the Terriers held their opponents to just 61.0 points per contest.
- College of Charleston's 1999-2000 team had the best scoring defense in league history, holding opponents to just 58.6 points per contest.

College of Charleston led the league with 326 made three-pointers in 2010. It was the third highest single-season total in league history.

- Davidson and Appalachian State each tallied 279 triples a season ago. It was the ninth-highest total in league history.

CONFERENCE NOTES

POSTSEASON PLAY

The Southern Conference tied its league-best mark with four teams in the post-season for 2010. The league also placed four teams in postseason tournaments in 2009.

- The Wofford Terriers made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2010. Wofford fell to Wisconsin 53-49 in the first round in Jacksonville, Fla.
- Western Carolina earned a berth in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. The Catamounts fell to former SoCon member Marshall, 90-88 in Huntington, W.Va.
- Appalachian State defeated Harvard (93-71) and Marshall (80-72) in the CIT but dropped a 64-56 decision to Pacific in the semifinal.
