

SoCon Player of the Week



Nick Aldridge Western Carolina Freshman, Forward South Webster, Ohio

Western Carolina's Nick Aldridge was named the Southern Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Feb. 6.

Aldridge averaged 32.0 points and 7.5 rebounds in games against The Citadel and the College of Charleston.

The freshman scored 25 points to help Western Carolina defeat The Citadel, 78-68, on Feb. 3. He scored a career-best 39 points in a 74-64 loss at the

College of Charleston on Feb. 5.

The 39-point salvo was the most points scored by a Southern Conference player this season.

In addition, Aldridge played a total of 79 minutes of a possible 80 minutes in the two contests.

Other nominees for SoCon Player of the Week included Moussa Diagne (Furman), Stephen Curry (Davidson), D.J. Thompson (Appalachian State), Shane Nichols (Wofford), J'Mel Everhart (The Citadel), Philip McCandies (College of Charleston) and Casey Long (Chattanooga).

Appalachian State

- · Appalachian State has not lost back-to-back games all season. Winners of five of their last six contests, the Mountaineers (18-6, 10-3) are off to their best start since the 1999-00 Southern Conference Championship team posted a 23-9 overall mark with a 13-3 record in league play.
- Coach Houston Fancher needs one victory to reach the 100-victory plateau at Appalachian State and tie former head coach Bobby Cremins for fourth-most in school annals. Davidson's Bob McKillop and Georgia Southern's Jeff Price are the only current SoCon coaches with 100 wins at their respective school.



College of Charleston

- When Western Carolina's Nick Aldridge scored 39 points against the Cougars on Feb. 5, it marked the first time a College of Charleston opponent scored 30 points since Elton Nesbitt scored 30 points in Georgia Southern's 91-79 win over the College of Charleston on Feb. 13, 2006 --- a stretch of 27 games.
- The College of Charleston is 13-2 since Dec. 14 and the Cougars are 13-1 when leading with 10:00 remaining in the game.



Chattanooga

- Chattanooga's four remaining home games feature teams with a combined 30-62 (.326) record. The Mocs play two road contests to end the regular season against teams with a combined 27-20 (.574) mark.
- Chattanooga is second in the SoCon in rebound margin (+3.2) but has no one listed among the top 10 rebounders in the league. The key to success has been team play with Nicchaeus Doaks (5.7 rpg), Casey Long (5.0 rpg), Khalil Hartwell (4.8 rpg) and Ricky Hood (4.5 rpg) all banging the boards.



The Citadel

- Attendance at The Citadel has increased 51.2 percent over 2005-06. A year ago, the Bulldogs averaged 1,182 fans at 14 games at McAlister Field House. A wave of enthusiasm engulfed the program with the hiring of new coach Ed Conroy and average attendance has increased to 1,787 for 11 home dates.
- The Bulldgos have recorded three victories over the SoCon's 2006 North and South Division champions. The Citadel has defeated Elon twice and topped Georgia Southern. The Bulldogs earned their fourth conference win of the season, equaling the number of league wins from a year ago.



Davidson

- After an 81-74 loss to Appalachian State on Jan. 20, Davidson has won five consecutive games. During the streak, the Wildcats are outscoring the opposition by a margin of 19.8 points per game.
- Stephen Curry broke the Davidson freshman single-season scoring record and finished with 24 points in an 87-57 win over Chattanooga. Curry has scored 502 points in 2006-07, topping the record of 500 set by Chris Dodds (1977-78).
- Attendance at Belk Arena has increased 24.9 percent this season. After averaging 3,015 fans per game in 2005-06, the Wildcats are averaging 3,766 fans per game this season, tops in the league.



- Coach Ernie Nestor's team will play five games in a 10-day span. Elon plays two games in North Carolina (Feb. 10 vs. Furman at home and Feb. 12 at UNC Greensboro) and a pair in Georgia (Feb. 15 at Georgia Southern and Feb. 17 at Georgia State) before finishing at Chattanooga on Feb. 19.
- Sophomore forward Ola Atoyebi recorded career high in both points and rebounds during the week. He grabbed a career-best 10 boards against Davidson on Jan. 30 and scored a career-high 16 points at Wofford on Feb. 3.
- Coming off the bench, Chris Chalko scored 13 points at Wofford and 16 against The Citadel while shooting 45.5 percent (5-of-11) from three-point range.



Furman

- With a 76-72 overtime victory over division-leading Appalachian State on Feb. 3, Furman improved its winning streak at Timmons Arena to six consecutive games.
- Forward Moussa Diagne notched a career-best 28 points (10-of-12 from the field and 6-of-10 from the free throw line) in the 76-72 overtime win over Appalachian State on Feb. 3. It marked the first time this season that Furman won after allowing more than 70 points. The Paladins were 0-7 when allowing 70 or more points.























SoCon News and Notes



Georgia Southern

- Junior Louis Graham recorded his league-leading 11th double-double of the season and the third in a row when he turned the trick against Appalachian State on Feb. 5. He has amassed a total of 10 double-doubles in his first two seasons in a Georgia Southern uniform.
- Freshman Antoine Johnson made the first two starts of his career and averaged 8.5 points and three rebounds in games against Chattanooga (Feb. 3) and Appalachian State (Feb. 5). Johnson had seven points and three boards against Chattanooga and 10 points and three rebounds versus Appalachian State.



UNC Greensboro

- Kyle Hines continues to dominate Southern Conference play. Hines is the only SoCon player averaging 20 points. His 21.9 average is tops in the league. He also leads the SoCon in rebounding (9.4) and blocked shots (2.17).
- UNC Greensboro is second in the conference is defense, yielding just 67.5 points per game. But coach Mike Dement's team has picked it up recently, permitting just 64.0 points in the last seven games. The Spartans are 5-2 during the stretch.



Western Carolina

- Western Carolina will play four of its final six games at the Ramsey Center. The Catamounts are 5-2 at home this season and 4-12 in games away from Cullowhee. N.C. Coach Larry Hunter's team hosts Georgia Southern (Feb. 10) and Chattanooga (Feb. 12) as well as Davidson (Feb. 17) and Appalachian State (Feb. 19). The Catamounts play road contests at UNC Greensboro (Feb. 14) and at Elon (Feb. 22).
- Forward Nick Aldridge tallied 64 points in two contests during the week. He scored 25 points in a 78-68 win at The Citadel on Feb. 3 and a career-high 39 points at the College of Charleston on Feb. 5. The performance in Charleston marked the second time the freshman has scored 30 or more points this season. Aldridge also grabbed 15 rebounds in the two games while playing 79 of a possible 80 minutes.



Wofford

- Shane Nichols scored 20 points in each of Wofford's two victories during the week. The junior made 12-of-25 field goals and shot 9-of-18 from three-point range while making 7-of-8 free throws in wins over UNC Greensboro (80-75 in overtime on Feb. 5). With 165 three-pointers, Nichols has moved into fifth place on Wofford's career list.
- The Terriers have had nine consecutive games decided by seven or fewer points dating back to Jan. 3. With the wins over Elon and UNC Greensboro, Wofford in 2-0 in February.
