PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cameron Wells

The Citadel

SPARTANBURG, S.C. - The Citadel's Cameron Wells has been named the Southern Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week for all games February 10-16 the league office announced Tuesday (Feb. 17). Wells helped the Bulldogs earn wins last week against Appalachian State (78-73, OT) and College of Charleston (72-58). He averaged 24.0 points and 4.5 assists last week. He added six rebounds and four steals over the two games.

Wells posted a career-high 30 points in The Citadel's overtime win against Appalachian State. He tied his personal best with seven assists against the Mountaineers. A native of Houston, Texas, Wells scored 18 points against the Cougars. He shot better than 58 percent (18-31) from the field in two games and was 12-for-12 from the free throw line during the week. Wells is the fifth-leading scorer in the conference (15.7 ppg) and ranks sixth in assists (3.1 apg) and seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.2).

TEAM REPORTS

APPALACHIAN STATE MOUNTAINEERS



- The Mountaineers lead the conference and rank eighth in the nation in rebounding margin (+7.3). ASU is second in both rebounding offense (39.5) and defense (32.2). Isaac Butts leads the Mountaineers with 9.0 boards per game.
- Appalachian State will face Winthrop as part of the 2009 ESPNU BracketBuster. The Mountaineers have participated in the event each of the past two seasons and are 1-1.
- The Mountaineers travel to take on UNC Greensboro Thursday night.

CHATTANOOGA MOCS



- Senior Nicchaeus Doaks passed Lance Fulse (1985-88) for first place in career rebounds in the school's Division I era in the win over Elon. Doaks now has 765 career rebounds. He scored his 1,300th point (1,310) in the win over UNCG. He needs 15 points to pass Fulse for fourth place on the career scoring list.
- Stephen McDowell became the school's all-time leader in three pointers made in the win over Elon passing Keddrick Mays (2006-07). McDowell now has 217 and is also owner of the career mark for three-pointers attempted. McDowell is nine three-pointers shy (109) of Mays' single-season mark of 118.
- The Mocs host Samford Saturday.

ELON PHOENIX



- Senior guard Brett James continues to climb Elon's career scoring chart. James now ranks 16th in program history with 1,247 points. He ranks third in the conference in blocked shots (1.5 bpg), sixth in steals (1.6 spg) and 18th in rebounding (5.4 rpg).
- Elon will face UNC Wilmington in the 2009 ESPNU BracketBuster Saturday night at 7:00 p.m. The Phoenix own a 6-3 advantage over the Seahawks in the all-time series. Elon is 0-2 in its previous BracketBuster games.
- The Phoenix host Western Carolina Thursday.

UNC GREENSBORO SPARTANS



- Mikko Koivisto's eight three pointers at Chattanooga was one shy of a school record. His 15 three-point field goal attempts broke a school record, eclipsing the mark of 14 co-held by Kevin Oleksiak and Scott Hartzell.
- The Spartans have been one of the top teams in the league defensively this season. UNC Greensboro is fourth in the conference in three point field goal defense, allowing its opponents to shoot just 35 percent from beyond the arc. The Spartans are second in the conference in blocked shots, averaging 3.7 blocks per game.
- UNC Greensboro hosts Appalachian State Thursday night.

SAMFORD BULLDOGS



- Josh Davis continued his stellar play as he scored 16 points against both UNC Greensboro and Elon last week. Over the last five games, Davis is averaging 16.8 points, 2.4 rebounds and 4.4 3-point field goals per contest.
- The Bulldogs closed out the home portion of their schedule last week, improving head coach Jimmy Tillette's record to 87-32 against conference opponents at home.
- Samford visits Chattanooga Saturday night at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised on SportSouth.

WESTERN CAROLINA CATAMOUNTS



- With 13 wins on the season, Western Carolina has matched the most victories in Larry Hunter's tenure in Cullowhee. Hunter won 13 games in his first season at the helm of the Catamount program (13-17) in 2005-06.
- Western Carolina's eight conference victories is its highest total since winning 10 games during the 1995-96 season, which was WCU's only divisional title and tournament championship.
- The Catamounts visit Elon Thursday night.

COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON COUGARS



- Monday's win at Appalachian State gave the Cougars their 19th win this season, marking the 25th time in the last 30 years that CofC has won at least 19 games. The Cougars have averaged 23.2 wins and 7.2 losses over that period.
- Sophomore Jeremy Simmons recorded his first career double-double in Monday night's win. Simmons tallied 10 points and 11 rebounds against the Mountaineers.
- The Cougars visit Georgia Southern Thursday. The Cougars travel to face Chattanooga Monday night.

DAVIDSON WILDCATS



- With 2,414 career points, junior Stephen Curry is fifth all-time on the Southern Conference's career scoring list. Curry needs 10 points to move past Gay Elmore (VMI, 1983-87) into fourth place.
- Davidson leads the conference and ranks sixth in the nation in turnover margin (+5.8). The Wildcats average just 11.9 turnovers a game and force their opponents into 17.7 miscues per contest.
- The Wildcats entertain Butler in a BracketBuster matchup Saturday at noon. The game will be televised on ESPN.

FURMAN PALADINS



- Sophomore Connor Nolte scored a career-high 17 points and pulled down seven rebounds in Furman's 70-60 win over Georgia Southern last Thursday. Nolte is averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game over his last four contests.
- Sophomore guard Jordan Miller is 12th in the conference in scoring. Miller is averaging 14.1 points per game and also ranks sixth in the conference in free throw percentage (.811). He has been Furman's leading scorer in 15 of 25 games this year.
- The Paladins host Wofford Saturday afternoon.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN EAGLES



- Antonio Hanson has knocked down 69 triples this season, the fifth-highest total in school history for juniors at Georgia Southern. He needs 23 more to break Elton Nesbitt's school record.
- Head coach Jeff Price is just two wins shy of 300 for his career. Price, in his 16th season as a head coach, has captured 164 wins at Georgia Southern, the 13th-highest win total among all coaches to coach at a Southern Conference school.
- The Eagles host College of Charleston Thursday night. GSU then plays host to Jacksonville State as part of BracketBusters Saturday evening.

THE CITADEL BULLDOGS



- The Bulldogs own a 10-game winning streak, the longest run for the Bulldogs since the 1926-27 season when the The Citadel won 13 games in a row. At 13-4 in league play, the Bulldogs have the most conference wins in school history.
- The Citadel's 72-58 victory over College of Charleston Saturday gave the Bulldogs their first regular-season sweep since the 1932-33 season. The Citadel had not beaten CofC twice in a season since 1937.
- The Citadel will host Furman February 26.

WOFFORD TERRIERS



- Sophomore Noah Dahlman continues to be a consistent performer for the Terriers. Dahlman has led the team in scoring 15 times this season and has scored at least 10 points in 21 of 23 games played. He has also led the team in rebounding six times.
- Wofford begins the week at 8-7 in league play, marking the fifth time since joining the league in the 1997-98 season that the Terriers have posted at least eight conference wins. One more win will give Wofford its highest conference win total since joining the SoCon.
- The Terriers visit Furman Saturday. Wofford will play host to Western Carolina Monday night in Spartanburg, S.C.

The Southern Conference ranks 22nd in the Men's Basketball RPI Report, released February 2. The league has garnered the most difficult strength of schedule rating among 31 Division I conferences. Davidson (50) and College of Charleston (123) rank in the top 150.

BRACKETBUSTERS 2009

ESPN announced the pairings for the 2009 BracketBusters event (Feb. 20-21) on February 2. Davidson will host Butler at noon in a game to be televised on the ESPN family of networks. MOVING FORWARD

The Citadel has won 13 conference games this season after going 1-19 in league play during 2007-08. The Bulldogs' 12-game improvement is the best mark in league history for biggest turnaround in consecutive seasons.

TWO FOR THREE

The Southern Conference was the first league to implement a three-point line, establishing the mark at 22 feet during the 1980-81 season. Western Carolina's Ronnie Carr made the first three-point field goal in college basketball history in a game against Middle Tennessee State on November 29, 1980.

- Georgia Southern's Willie Powers made the first three-point field goal for the 2008-09 season, knocking down a triple against Houston on November 10. It was the first made three-point field goal from the new distance of 20-feet, nine inches.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULING

Southern Conference teams took on some of the top competition across the country. Seven of the 12 SoCon teams participated in at least one exempt tournament this winter, spanning from Cancun, Mexico (The Citadel) to Alaska (Western Carolina).

- SoCon teams participated in the Air Force Classic, Cancun Challenge, Charleston Classic, Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament, Drake Invitational, Great Alaska Shootout, Jimmy V Classic, NIT Season Tip-Off, Puerto Rico Tip-Off and Wooden Tradition.

SCHEDULE CHANGE

The 2008-09 season will mark the final year of the 20-game conference schedule in the Southern Conference. The SoCon Council of Presidents decided in early November 2008 to move to an 18-game conference schedule beginning with the 2009-10 season.

The Southern Conference announced the inaugural Hall of Fame class for 2009. SoCon Tournament

The 2009 Southern Conference Tournament will be held March 6-9 at The McKenzie Arena (11,218) in Chattanooga. All 12 members of the Southern Conference will take part in the conference tournament. The championship game, scheduled for March 9, will be televised by ESPN. It marks the second time that the league tournament has been held at the facility. The SoCon Tournament was held at The McKenzie Arena in 2005.

The oldest league tournament in the nation, the first tournament was held in 1922 and 2009 marks the 88th year of the post-season classic.

NEW MEMBERSHIP

Samford University, located in Birmingham, Ala., is in its first season as a member of the Southern Conference after officially joining the league on July 1, 2008. Only two teams in the history of the league have won the regular season conference title or a division crown in their first season (College of Charleston - 1999; West Virginia - 1951). EXPERIENCE ON THE COURT

The 12 Southern Conference schools combined to return 105 lettermen from the 2007-08 season, an average of 8.75 returners per team. Eleven of the 12 SoCon teams returned at least eight lettermen from 2007-08.

- Three schools (College of Charleston, The Citadel and Furman) returned all five starters for 2008-09. Ten of the 12 league schools returned at least three starters from 2007-08.

EXPERIENCE ON THE BENCH

All 12 head coaches returned to the bench for 2008-09. The current league head coaches have a combined 84 years of experience within the Southern Conference.

- Davidson's Bob McKillop is the longest tenured coach in the SoCon, entering his 20th season on the bench for the Wildcats. Bobby Cremins (College of Charleston), Ed Conroy (The Citadel) and Jeff Jackson (Furman) are all in their third season with their current school.

PRESEASON PLAUDITS

The Davidson Wildcats were ranked 20th in both preseason polls released by the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today. It was the first time a SoCon team has appeared in the preseason rankings since Davidson was ranked fifth to start the 1969-70 season.
