Junior Jason Richards was named Southern Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Dec. 19.

He averaged a double-double with 11.0 points and 14.0 assists in two games. He broke the Davidson record and tied the Southern Conference mark with 19 assists in a 116-55 victory over Mount St. Mary on Dec. 15. Edwards scored 19 points, including 17 in the game's final 10 minutes, to help lead the Wildcats to a 92-80 SoCon win at Chattanooga.

He currently leads the nation in total assists with 100 and ranks second in assist average at 8.2 apg.

Appalachian State



■ Appalachian State can credit its effectiveness at the free throw line in part for the team's quick start this season. Twice this season the Mountaineers have gone to the free throw line more than 30 times. Appalachian State attempted 33 free throws in an 84-71 win over Campbell on Nov. 27. On Dec 12, the Mountaineers went to the line 32 times in a 93-53 victory.

■ D.J. Thompson's 14 points against Brevard on Dec. 14 moved him ahead of Tyson Patterson into 19th place on Appalachian State's all-time scoring list. Thompson currently has 1,250 career points and needs just one more point to pass Kevin Phillips and 17 points to pass Sam Gibson and move into 17th place.

College of Charleston



■ The College of Charleston has won its last 123 games when the Cougars score at least 84 points. The last loss was a 95-93 setback to Limestone on Dec. 2, 1978.

■ College of Charleston coach Bobby Cremins donated 50 pairs of gently-used shoes to the South Carolina Federal Credit Union's Shoe Drive. The organization provides thousands of shoes to underprivileged.

Chattanooga



■ The Mocs are in a stretch of eight home dates in nine games between Dec. 16-Jan. 10. Chattanooga has a 3-1 record at home in 2006-07. The lone road contest is a Jan. 3 date at SoCon foe Furman.

■ Senior Keddrick Mays is seventh in the league in scoring with a 15.9 ppg average. He leads the league with 46 three-pointers (4.1 treys per contest).



SoCon News and Notes



The Citadel

- Following a Dec. 20 date at West Virginia, The Citadel takes 10 days off for the holiday before returning to action on Dec. 30 against Atlanta Christian in Charleston, S.C.
- Kevin Hammack leads the SoCon in steals with 3.0 per game. Teammate J'Mel Everhart is seventh in the conference in scoring with a 15.9 ppg average.



Davidson

- Junior Jason Richards broke the school record and tied the Southern Conference mark for assists in a game with 19 when the Wildcats topped Mount St. Mary, 116-55, on Dec. 15.
- The Wildcats posted their fifth consecutive victory, a 92-80 win at Chattanooga on Dec. 18. Davidson guards Stephen Curry, Max Paulhus Gosselin and Jason Richards combined for 71 points in the win at McKenzie Arena.



Elon

- Elon plays two games in a 25-day span. Between game5 at High Point on Dec. 4 and at the Kent State Tournament on Dec. 29-30, the Phoenix play just at Notre Dame on Dec. 16 and host Wofford on Dec. 20.
- Senior LeVonn is third in the Southern Conference in scoring with a 17.8 ppg norm.



Furman

- The Paladins have earned their wings this season. Furman has played games in Ohio (Bowling Green), North Dakota (North Dakota State) AND California (San Diego and California) as well as six games in South Carolina.
- Senior Moussa Diange needs just one point to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Teammates Robby Bostain and Eric Webb have already scored more than 1,000 points in their careers.



Georgia Southern

- Louis Graham and Matt Fields each recorded double-doubles in Georgia Southern's 101-67 triumph over Flagler on Dec. 12 at home. Graham scored 11 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the win, marking the fourth time in 2006-07 that he had posted a double-double. Fields recorded his first double-double of the season with 10 points and 10 boards.
- Jimmy Tobias made 10-of-11 field goal attempts against Flagler on Dec. 12. The 90.9 shooting percentage ranks second in Eagle history behind Michael Curry, who made 12-of-13 shots from the floor against Samford on Jan. 6, 1990.



UNC Greensboro

- Returning after a 12-day break, the Spartans take on non-conference foes St. Peter's (Dec. 21) and Delaware (Dec. 23) at home before taking a week off for the Christmas holiday. UNC Greensboro lost to St. Peter's, 80-76 in overtime, in the BracketBusters last season.
- Just three of UNC Greensboro's first nine games were at home. The Spartans are 1-2 at home and 2-4 on enemy courts in 2006-07.



Western Carolina

- Antonio Russell shook off a 1-for-14 shooting performance at Dayton to score 21 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the field. He also dished out a career-best seven assists against the Flyers.
- Kyle Greathouse connected on four three-pointers at Dayton and two against The Citadel to give the senior 176 career treys, placing him third on WCU's all-time list. He needs 15 treys to move into second place.



Wofford

- The Terriers played eight games in November and will have eight dates in January but play just five games in December. All five games in December are on the road.
- Senior Eric Marshall leads Wofford in both scoring (15.5 ppg) and assists (2.45 apg).
