
2 This injunction applies only to the named plaintiffs James Akiyama, Leilani Akiyama, and  
3 Jay Drangeid. No other plaintiffs have shown a bona fide demonstrable objection to the bowing  
4 requirement.

5 Furthermore, plaintiffs James Akiyama, Leilani Akiyama, and Jay Drangeid shall not be  
6 required to participate in opening and closing competitions or ceremonies during a tournament.  
7 Participation in opening and closing ceremonies is not a necessary prerequisite to plaintiffs'  
8 stated goal to compete in the Olympics, and it is at the discretion of defendants whether they  
9 allow plaintiffs to participate in these ceremonies.

10 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, except as relates to issues concerning the  
11 interpretation or enforcement of the terms of this Order, this action is stayed in all other respects  
12 to allow exhaustion of arbitration procedures and other remedies, pursuant to the Amateur Sport  
13 Act of 1978 (U.S.C. §§ 371 *et seq.*), and the administrative procedures of United States Judo,  
14 Incorporated, the national governing body for amateur judo.
