¹ Additionally, the following matters were fully resolved in calendar year 2023:

Dr. William Moreau v. United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (Case No. 1:20-cv-00350-CNS-MEH) listed in the 2020 Impact Report Summary was fully resolved pursuant to an executed settlement agreement between the parties. Upon the parties' filing of a stipulation, the case was dismissed with prejudice and terminated by the court on April 25, 2023.

Emily Loewenthal v. United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (EEOC Charge No. 541-2022-01588) listed in the 2022 Impact Report Summary was also fully resolved pursuant to an executed settlement between the parties. No material litigation took place.

Jerome Grimes v. (USOC) United States Olympic Committee, et al. (Case No. 1:22-cv-02222-LTB-GPG) listed in the 2022 Impact Report Summary as appealed to the Tenth Circuit was dismissed by the Tenth Circuit for failure to prosecute on May 30, 2023. No material litigation took place.

With respect to the lawsuits related to Dr. Larry Nassar and USA Gymnastics described and/or referenced in the 2020, 2021, and 2022 Impact Report Summaries, all of the lawsuits have been dismissed, and all matters related to the USA Gymnastics litigation are considered fully resolved.

The district court described plaintiff's complaint as lacking both factual and legal allegations leaving the court unable to evaluate even construed claims by plaintiff. On March 8, 2024, the district court dismissed plaintiff's suit without prejudice for failure to prosecute.
