## Dear Congressional Leadership:

With this letter, I would like to present to you the United States Olympic Committee's official report with respect to the period from January 1, 2013, through December 31, 2016 (the 2013-16 quadrennium) as required by law. The Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act, 36 U.S.C. 220501 *et seq.*, specifically calls for the USOC to submit to the President and Congress, on a quadrennial basis, a detailed report of its operations for the preceding four years, including:

- 1) Statement of receipts and expenditures;
- Comprehensive description of activities and accomplishments;
- Data concerning the participation of women, disabled individuals, and racial and ethnic minorities in the amateur athletic activities and administration of the USOC and its National Governing Bodies; and
- 4) Description of the steps taken to encourage the participation of women, disabled individuals and racial minorities in amateur athletic activities.

The 2013-16 quadrennium was marked by strong competitive results and important operational improvements for the Olympic Movement in the United States. For America's athletes, this was the most successful quadrennium ever. Our athletes made us proud not only with their competitive success, but also for their determination and grace both in victory and defeat.

We hope this document will help you understand and appreciate the hard work and dedication that the USOC, the NGBs, our Olympic sponsors and donors, and America's athletes and coaches have contributed to our successful American Olympic and Paralympic tradition.
