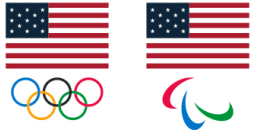


2024 Impact Report Summary

Status of matters filed as of December 31, 2024

Va. <u>Case No.:</u> 3:24-cv-00030-JHY-JCH <u>Filed:</u> 4/28/2024 <u>Dismissed:</u> 1/15/2025 <u>Appealed:</u> 2/12/2025 (Fourth Circuit)	Three plaintiffs filed suit against a group of defendants including the United States Center for SafeSport, the USOPC, and the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Plaintiffs alleged various constitutional due process claims stemming from the notion that the SafeSport Code did not and still does not afford a pre-determination hearing before SafeSport issues its final decisions. Plaintiffs sought declaratory and injunctive relief. On January 15, 2025, the district court dismissed plaintiffs’ suit without prejudice as to the USOPC. Plaintiffs appealed this dismissal as to all defendants to the Fourth Circuit. Plaintiffs’ appeal is still pending.
<u>Caption:</u> <i>HDI Global Specialty SE v. United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee, et al.</i> <u>Jurisdiction:</u> D. Colo. <u>Case No.:</u> 1:24-cv-01745-SKC-MDB <u>Filed:</u> 6/21/2024	Plaintiff is an insurance company that issued a commercial general liability policy to the USOPC and began defending the USOPC in 2022 under that policy related to the underlying <i>Egbert v. Griswold, et al.</i> lawsuit when it was filed that is also pending in the District of Colorado. Plaintiff filed suit against the USOPC, Griswold, and Egbert, seeking a declaration that it has no duty to defend or indemnify the USOPC under the policy for the underlying lawsuit. Plaintiff also seeks a declaration that the USOPC is required to reimburse it for defense costs it has paid to defend the USOPC in the underlying lawsuit.

¹ *Rosie Fletcher, et al. v. Peter Foley, et al.* (Case No. 2:23-cv-00803-SPG-JPR) listed in the 2023 Impact Report Summary was dismissed by the district court without prejudice and without leave to amend on June 25, 2024. Plaintiffs appealed this dismissal as to all defendants to the Ninth Circuit. Plaintiffs’ appeal is still pending.

Plaintiffs seek a declaration that their current use and registration of certain domain names for a website and mobile application do not violate a prior settlement agreement between the parties and are in compliance with federal and state law.</p>
