Sunday 5th February

US Super Bowl 51, NRG Stadium, Houston

The 51st annual football championship kicks off at the NRG Stadium in Houston. Lady Gaga headlines the half-time show.

Monday 6th February

Bowe Bergdahl court martial, Fort Bragg, North Carolina

Court martial to begin for desertion, misbehaviour before the enemy and endangering fellow soldiers. Bergdahl disappeared from his base in Afghanistan in June 2009 and was held in captivity by the Taliban until May 2014.

Thursday 9th – Saturday 18th February

67th Berlin International Film Festival, Berlin

The Berlinale is a great cultural event and one of the most important dates for the international film industry. More than 20,000 professional visitors from 122 countries will attend, including more than 3,800 journalists. Art, glamour, parties and business are all inseparably linked at the Berlinale.

Sunday 12th February

Election of German Federal President

While the role is mostly ceremonial, German presidents have some influence in setting the tone on foreign policy as well as retaining powers to veto laws they believe violate the constitution.

Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier is the Social Democrats' candidate and is backed by conservative Chancellor Angela Merkel.

Sunday 12th February

59th Grammy Awards, Staples Center, Los Angeles
