



## Poker HHJ Jackpot Rules/FAQ

1. When running it twice, the second set of community cards will not qualify for any jackpots.
2. Any qualifying hand for the High Hand Jackpot must use both hole cards.
3. A minimum of \$10.00 (including pot money and rake) must be in the pot order for the hand to qualify for any jackpot.
4. Players must be present in the room to collect the award/payout, otherwise the award/payout may be rolled into the next specified qualifying hour. Management has the right, if specified, to hold the player's winnings in safekeeping if the time period is over two (2) hours.
5. In order for a player's hand to qualify, the first card of the hand must be dealt within the scheduled specified time period.
6. The winning high-ranking hand must beat all other high hands that were established during the specified time period. The only exception is; if you have a chop pot where both hands qualify for the HHJ. (i.e., player one –AJ, player two – AJ, Board AAJ23)
7. In Texas Hold'em, the minimum qualifying hand needed will be a full house (Aces full of 2's or better).
8. A minimum of four (4) players, including proposition players, must be dealt in a hand for the hand to qualify for the high hand jackpot
9. Reduced rake games will not qualify for the high hand jackpot. Bad beat money will not be taken from a reduced rake game.
10. If the players have a conversation amongst themselves indicating that one already has a jackpot hand or is drawing to a jackpot hand or remarks lead other players to believe this is the time to attempt to play for a jackpot hand, such conversation may render any such subsequent high hand jackpot occurrence null and void.
11. When a high hand jackpot hits, MGM Grand Detroit will follow IRS policies (e.g., 10-99 or W2-G when required)
12. Should there be a deviation (e.g., a missing card, two cards of the same rank and suit, extra cards, etc....) the high hand jackpot may be declared null and void by the poker supervisory staff (or above) on duty.
13. In Omaha, the winning high-ranking hand(s) may only consist of two of the player's hole cards and the flop. The turn and river cannot be included in a qualifying high hand jackpot.
14. The minimum qualifying hand for Omaha will be a four of a kind.
15. If there is no qualifying hand for the final hour of the day, the clock will continue to run until we have a qualifying hand shown. (e.g., first qualifying hand "tabled" wins the award/payout.)

16. The promotional meter is funded from every pot reaching a minimum of \$10, \$1 is placed into the promo drop box. When it reaches \$20, another \$1 is added, for a total of \$2 contributed to the promo drop box.
