SETTING THE STAGE

- The 2025 Badgers are picked to finish third in the 2025 Big Ten Preseason Poll, behind Penn State and Nebraska. The Badgers finished third in 2024 with a Regional Final appearance.
- Seniors **Carter Booth**, **Mimi Colyer**, and sophomore **Charlie Fuerbringer** were named the All-Big Ten Preseason Team.
- Outside hitter **Mimi Colyer** and setter **Charlie Fuerbringer** were named to the AVCA National Player of the Year Watch List.
- The Badgers welcome a total of 10 new faces to this year's team, including five freshmen.
- **Mimi Colyer** (Oregon), **Alicia Andrew** (Baylor), **Grace Lopez** (Miami (FL)), **Grace Egan** (Ohio St.), and **Jada Cerniglia** (NIU) transferred to Wisconsin this last winter and spring.
- This year's coaching staff will look a little different. Lauren Carlini has been promoted as a full-time Assistant Coach, while Gary White takes on the title of Director of Player Personnel and Analytics. Wisconsin also adds John Shondell as an Assistant Coach, and Associate Head Coach Brittany Dildine remains on staff as an Associate Head Coach.

NOTES

ALL FOR THE "W"

- ♦ Wisconsin volleyball has finished ranked in the Top 10, 11 out of the last 12 seasons in the AVCA poll.
- ♦ The Badgers have also finished ranked in the Top 10 for seven-straight seasons in the AVCA poll.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- ♦ Over the winter of 2024-25, the Badgers signed three transfers that joined the Badgers in the spring. Senior outside hitter **Mimi Colyer** from Oregon, junior right side **Grace Lopez** from Miami (FL) and outside hitter redshirt-freshman **Grace Egan** from Ohio State.
- ♦ **Mimi Colyer** arrives to Madison with all the accolades under her belt. The outside was named the 2022 AVCA National Freshman of the Year, two All-Pac-12 accolades, two AVCA All-Region honors and three AVCA All American awards. A six-rotation player, in 2024, Colyer averaged 3.97 kills/set and put away double-digit kills in 28 of 32 matches and five 20-kill performances. After joining the Big Ten this year, she also added All-Big Ten First Team honors to her list.
- ♦ **Grace Egan** joins the Badgers after putting up a career night in the Ohio State vs Wisconsin match, where she

put away 22 kills. She averages 2.53 kills per set and 2.03 digs per set.

- ♦ **Grace Lopez** is a two-time AVCA All-American, opposite. Lopez
- ♦ **Jada Cerniglia** is a grad student, arriving to Madison after four seasons at Northern Illinois University. The libero/defensive specialist saw action in 34 matches and 14 sets, posting 1.35 digs per set in 2024.

FRESH(MAN) FACES

- ♦ Two freshman joined the Badgers this past spring, as they graduated high school early to get to campus, this includes **Madison Quest** and **Addy Horner**.
- ♦ **Addy Horner**, a 6-3 setter/right side from Wheaton, Illinois was ranked the No. 1 setter and the No. 2 player in Illinois by PrepDig.com. She was also ranked the No. 16 player in the nation and the No. 18 player in the class of 2025 by PrepDig.com.
- ♦ **Madison Quest**, a 6-3 outside hitter from Pewaukee, Wisconsin was ranked the No. 1 player in Wisconsin and the No. 17 player in the nation by PrepDig.com. she was also a finalist for the Class of 2025 National Player of the Year.
- ♦ **Kristen Simon**, **Natalie Wardlow**, and **Aniya Warren** arrived this summer.

- ♦ Longtime Badger assistant, Annemarie Hickey departed Wisconsin volleyball in June to take on a full-time assistant coaching position with LOVB Madison.
- ♦ Hickey spent 15 season with UW both as a student-athlete and assistant coach.
- ♦ Hickey was an assistant coach with LOVB Madison's inaugural season.

BADGERS ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

- ♦ Four Badgers represented thier countries this summer in the VNL's and the upcoming World Championships.
- ♦ Dana Rettke and Sarah Franklin played in this summer's VNL's for the United States. Both have been named to the wide roster of the World Championships in Thailand this fall.

- ♦ Anna Smrek repented Canada at the VNL's. Smrek competed in all three legs of the VNLs. Smrek has also been named to Canada's wide roster for the World Championships.
- ♦ Julia Orzol was named to Poland's wide roster for the VNL's and the upcoming World Championships. Orzol didnt' see time as she has been nursing a lower leg injury.

IT RUNS IN THE (UW) FAMILY

- ♦ **Jada Cerniglia's** parents, Aleah (Coughlin) and Mike Cerniglia both played for Wisconsin during their respective time at UW.
 - ♦ Aleah (Coughlin) played volleyball under John Cook in 1993.
 - ♦ Mike played for the men's hockey team from 1996-2001. Mike later served on the administrative staff as the Executive Director of the National W Club.
 - ♦ Jada's brother played football at NIU for three seasons, before finishing his collegiate career as a Bdger in 2023.
- ♦ **Madison Quest's** parents are also UW alumni who played for the Badgers.
 - ♦ Pauline (Bresky) played volleyball under John Cook from 1995-1998. She started as an outside hitter and finished as a defensive specialist. Bresky helped the Badgers to it's second Big Ten title in 1997.
 - ♦ Dad, Matt Quest was a walk-on for the men's basketball team in 1996-1997 and saw action in 10 games.

- ♦ In addition to Cerniglia and Quest's parents playing collegiately, senior **Mimi Colyer's** and sophomore **Charlie Fuerbringer's** parents also have a respective collegiate and professional careers.
- ♦ Nique (Crump) Colyer, mother of Mimi, played at Long Beach State from 1994-1997.
 - ♦ Jersey No. 15 - Mimi is also No. 15
 - ♦ Helped LBS to a Final Four appearance in 1997.
 - ♦ In 1997, she led the nation in hitting percentage at .428
 - ♦ 1996 AVCA All-America Honorable Mention
 - ♦ 3x All-Big West
 - ♦ Currently ranks in LBS Top-10 categories; Kills (10th/1,235), Block solos (5th/95), Block assists (3rd), and Attack percentage (4th)
- ♦ Matt and Joy (McKienzie) Fuerbringer are no strangers to the game of volleyball.

- ♦ Joy also played at Long Beach State (her and Nique just missed each other) from 1990-1993.
- ♦ In 1993, she helped her team to a National Championship, was named AVCA All-America Second team and an All-Northwest Region First Team honoree.
- ♦ Also in 1993, LBS played at the UW Field House to beat Penn State for the National Championship.
- ♦ She also was the head coach at LBS from 2017-2021.
- ♦ Matt Fuerbringer is a four-time All-American at Stanford from 1994-1997, and helped the Cardinals to a National Championships in 1997.
- ♦ Won MPSF and AVCA Freshman of the Year honors and left as the all-time kills leader at Stanford.
- ♦ Played indoor professionally from 1998-2003 in Austria, Spain, and Greece.
- ♦ After his indoor career, Fuerbringer spent a decade as a professional on the sand from 2003-2012. He was the AVP Rooke of the Year in 2003, and won eight tournaments in his career, and reached a career-best ranking of No. 5 in the world.
- ♦ Currently serves as the head coach of LOVB Madison.

ALOHA HAWAI'I

- ♦ Over spring break, the Badgers headed to Hawaii to play the University of Hawaii in the first two spring matches of the 2025 season.
- ♦ In the first match, Wisconsin dropped the first set after a slow start, but then

- gained control in the next three to take the match 3-1.
- ◆ In the second matchup in two days, the Badgers came out on top once again, 3-1, after dropping the first set.
 - ◆ **Mimi Colyer** led the Badgers with 32 kills between the two matches, as **Carter Booth** added 19, **Madison Quest** chipped in 12 and **Grace Egan** finished with 10.

RED & WHITE REWIND: A LOOK BACK AT 2024

- ◆ The Badgers finished 26-7 overall and 17-3 in conference play, finishing third in the Big Ten. That marks the tenth time in the last 12 years that UW has finished third or better in the conference. Wisconsin finished 7th in the final RPI.
- ◆ Wisconsin advanced to the Regional final vs Nebraska, but ultimately fell 0-3, bringing the 2024 campaign to a close.
- ◆ Finished second in the nation for the sixth-straight year with 122,207 accumulative fans in 2024, selling out 13-of-16 home matches. Wisconsin has ranked in the top-10 nationally for attendance for 34-straight years (not including 2020) and in the top-five for 24-straight years.

QUICK FACTS

- Built: 1929-30
- Broke ground: Sept. 26, 1929
- Opened: Dec. 13, 1930
- Construction cost: \$434,000 (\$12.9 million in 2023)
- Listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- Original capacity was 8,000 as the "Barn" was built without the upper balcony. The balcony was added in 1939, raising the seating capacity to 12,000.
- The facility had a dirt floor for many years and an eighth-of-a-mile track encircled the perimeter of the building.
- Home of the UW boxing team from 1933-60, when boxing was an NCAA sport. An all-sport record crowd of 15,200 watched the Wisconsin vs. Washington State boxing match in 1949.
- Used a training facility for the track, football and baseball teams until the Shell was built in 1956.
- Muhammad Ali suffered one of his few losses as an amateur boxer during the 1959 Pan American Games trials.
- Notable speakers include then-presidential candidate John F. Kennedy in 1960, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Reverend Jesse Jackson, Bob Hope and the Dalai Lama.
- Other events held in the building include basketball, wrestling, concerts, carnivals and Native American pow wows.

UW FIELD HOUSE

It's a landmark building in a number of ways. From being listed on the National Register of Historic Places to the record-setting attendances and the momentous wins, the Wisconsin Field House is a memorable place steeped in a rich history.

Since it was built, the Field House has been the site of numerous sporting events including basketball, boxing, track and field, and wrestling. It also hosted UW commencement exercises, carnivals and speakers, including John F. Kennedy.

The Badger volleyball team first competed in the Field House in 1977 when it hosted the Big Ten Tournament. UW didn't return to the building until 1980, hosting two tournaments. Wisconsin's play in the Field House was sporadic until 1986 when it became the permanent home of volleyball. With the construction of the Kohl Center in 1998, volleyball took over possession of the Field House for practice and competition. The building is also used as the competition site for the wrestling team.

As the sole occupant of the UW Field House, UW has made the building one of the finest volleyball facilities in the country. A new wood floor was installed in 2013, making the volleyball court the center of attention. In 2020, the building was renovated with new windows installed, marking the first time since the late 1960s that the windows have been uncovered during a match.

Volleyball facilities include a team room for relaxing, studying, as well as a video room separate from the locker room. The team room features a large-screen television, leather sofas, pub tables and chairs, and a kitchenette.

The renovation of Camp Randall Stadium in 2005 included improvements to the north end of the Field House including updated restrooms as well as a new media room and opponent locker rooms on the lower level. In 2021, the entire upper deck was opened for the first time since the 2007 season while in 2022, chair-back seats on the east side and Bucky's Balcony on the north end were added as well as increased ADA seating.
