NEBRASKA TEAM NOTES

- The Huskers took down Michigan for the second time this year and moved to on to the Big Ten Tournament semifinal for the fourth time since joining the conference. Nebraska clinched three straight semifinal appearances from 2012-2014 and most recently made the semis in 2018
- Nebraska has now beaten three top-ten teams in the same season for just the second time in program history. The Huskers have taken down No. 5 Indiana (Feb. 14), No. 8 Michigan (Jan. 4) and No. 10 Michigan (March 4) this year, joining the 2009-2010 Husker squad which also defeated three top-ten teams in the same season
- Tonight's game was tied seven times, with the lead changing on eight occasions. The Huskers led for 26:37 in the game compared to just 9:21 for the Wolverines
- Sophomore Jaz Shelley knocked down a pair of threes Friday against Michigan. Shelley has now hit 11 threes in the 2022 Big Ten Tournament following a record-breaking performance of nine three-pointers Thursday against Illinois. Shelley needs four more threes to match Kelly Mazzante's (Penn State) 2002 Big Ten single-tournament record of 15 three-point field goals. Shelley's 11 three-pointers in this year's tournament are currently tied for 6th in conference history for the most made three-point field goals in a single Big Ten Tournament
- The three-point win was tied for Nebraska's smallest margin of victory this year and was just the second time this season that the Huskers won by three points or fewer

MICHIGAN TEAM NOTES

- The Wolverines turned 17 Nebraska turnovers into 31 points
- Indiana-native Leigha Brown scored 16 points off the Wolverines' bench, marking her 17th double-figure performance of the year
- Freshman Laila Phelia scored 19 points to lead Michigan, which was five off the career high she set on Feb. 6 at Iowa
- Naz Hillmon scored 18 points and surpassed Hallie Thome for second all-time at Michigan in scoring. Hillmon now has 2,098 points in her Michigan career
- Hillmon also pulled down 12 rebounds for her 14th double-double of the season
