

2018 Men's Soccer Season in Review

The 2018 Big Ten men's soccer season capped off with Maryland winning its first NCAA Championship since joining the Big Ten and fourth in program history.

- Four Big Ten schools finished the season ranked in the United Soccer Coaches' Top 25 poll. Maryland led all teams at No. 1, Indiana followed closely at No. 3, Michigan State at No. 4, and Michigan at No. 24.
- Two Big Ten teams ranked in the top 10 for shutout percentage, Indiana ranked third (.625) and Maryland sixth (.565).
- Indiana and Maryland also ranked in the top 15 for goals against average. The Hoosiers ranked fourth (0.529) and the Terps 11th (0.656).
- Indiana ranked second (59) and Michigan State ninth (45) in total assists, while Indiana ranked second in assists per game (2.46).

NCAA Tournament: Four Big Ten teams earned berths to the 2018 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament: Indiana, Maryland, Michigan and Michigan State. For more, click here and <u>here</u>.

Maryland came out on top of the 48-team NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Tournament bracket. The Terps claimed their fourth national title with a 1-0 win against Akron. For more information, click here.

MAC Hermann Trophy: Indiana's Andrew Gutman earned the most prestigious award in NCAA men's soccer, the MAC Hermann Trophy. Big Ten Champions: Indiana won the program's 11th Big Ten Championship with the conference's first unblemished record (8-0-0) since Penn State (6-0-0) in 2005. For more information, click here.

Postseason Awards: The Big Ten Conference announced the 2018 men's soccer All-Big Ten teams and individual honors on Nov. 2. Indiana's Andrew Gutman was selected Defender of the Year, Trey Muse was named Goalkeeper of the Year, Jack Maher collected Freshman of the Year honors and Todd Yeagley was voted Coach of the Year. Michigan's Jack Hallahan was chosen as Offensive Player of the Year and Michigan State's Giuseppe Barone earned Midfielder of the Year accolades through a vote by the 14 head coaches.
