The Big Ten enjoyed a successful 2015 men's golf season, highlighted by six Big Ten teams advancing to the NCAA Men's Golf Championships along with Michigan's Kyle Mueller.

Six in the NCAA Championships Regional: Six Big Ten teams and two individuals were selected to compete in the 2015 NCAA Men's Golf Championships Regional in State, Michigan, Penn State and Purdue. For more information on the NCAA Regional, click [HERE](#).

Illini Advances to the Championships: Illinois competed as a team, while Michigan's Kyle Mueller represented the conference at the 2015 NCAA Men's Golf Championships at The Concession Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla. For more information on the NCAA Championships, click [HERE](#).

Championships Title: Illinois claimed the Big Ten Championship in men's golf after shooting a four-round team score of 1,170 at the Victoria National Golf Course. The Fighting Illini were followed by second-place Iowa (1,170), Minnesota and Penn State, which finished in a tie for third-place (1,183), Wisconsin (1,183), which finished in a tie for fifth-place. Illinois earned the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Championships, winning five straight championships from 2009-13.
