## GAME NOTES

### INDIANA TEAM NOTES

- The Hoosiers advanced to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals for just the second time under Head Coach Teri Moren. Indiana also played in the 2020 Big Ten Tournament semifinals, dropping a 66-51 contest to top-seeded Maryland
- Indiana earned its first-ever Big Ten Tournament win over Maryland and just its second overall win against the Terrapins. The Hoosiers first-ever win over Maryland came just earlier this season when they beat Indiana 70-63 in overtime in Bloomington on Jan. 2
- The previous three meetings between Indiana and Maryland had been decided by seven points or fewer, but Indiana snapped that streak with an 11-point win in today's tournament game
- Junior Mackenzie Holmes showed signs that she is returning to form after turning in a 17-point performance in today's game. The 17 points marked her most since Dec. 23, before she missed eight games with a knee injury between Jan. 13 and Feb. 14
- Senior Grace Berger posted her third double-double of the year, finishing with 16 points and 11 rebounds. The performance marked Berger's second double-double in her last three outings
- Indiana nearly made program history Friday as three Hoosiers dominated the boards. Berger and Aleksa senior Gulbe both grabbed 11 boards while graduate student Nicole Cardaño-Hillary pitched in a season-high eight rebounds to tie her career high. Indiana has never had three double-figure rebounders in a single game
- With the addition of Holmes' five boards in the win, four Hoosiers finished the game with 5-plus rebounds
- Cardaño-Hillary finished with an impressive nine points, eight rebounds, three assists and four steals

### MARYLAND TEAM NOTES

- All-Big Ten selection Ashley Oswusu dropped a game-high 21 points in the win, marking her highest-scoring performance since Dec. 2. The junior poured in 14 points in the second half on 6-for-12 shooting from the field
- Sophomore Angel Reese scored 14 points and led Maryland with 13 rebounds, marking her 17th double-double of the year. Reese grabbed 10-plus rebounds in 18 games this season for Maryland
