THE FIRST SERVE

2022 IN REVIEW

- ▶ The Maryland Terrapins finished the 2022 season with a 16-16 record, along with a 7-13 mark against the Big Ten.
- ▶ For the first time in head coach Adam Hughes' tenure, the Terps won seven games in the Big Ten in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ One of the key turning points in the season came when Maryland secured sweeps in three consecutive Big Ten road matches for the first time since joining the conference
- ▶ Maryland's sweep streak was capped off with a dominant win at No. 9 Purdue on Oct. 16, marking the Terps first-ever top-10 road victory.
- ▶ The Terps scored their second upset win of 2022 at the Xfinity Center Pavilion on Nov. 18, with a 3-1 victory over No. 5 Ohio State, ending the Buckeyes' 14-match win streak.

MARKING THE CALENDARS

- ▶ For its 10th season of Big Ten action, Maryland will compete in 32 contests, with 12 coming against non-conference opponents and 20 coming against Big Ten foes.
- ▶ The Terps will open their season with four non-conference tournaments, beginning with a trip to Miami, FL, where they will compete in a tournament hosted by the University of Miami on Aug. 25-26.
- ▶ Maryland will return The Old Line State for a pair of tournaments, traveling to Annapolis, MD for a tournament hosted by Navy on Sept. 1-3 before its first two home matches of the season against Coastal Carolina (Sept. 8) and Princeton (Sept. 9).
- ▶ Big Ten Conference action will begin with a two-game home set against Purdue (Sept. 22) and Michigan (Sept. 24).
- ▶ In conference play, the Terps will face all 14 Big Ten member schools at least once, holding home-and-away series against Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers and Wisconsin. Maryland will welcome Illinois, Minnesota and Penn State to College Park, while hitting the road to take on Michigan State, Nebraska and Northwestern.

BLOCKING BONANZA

- ▶ The Terps possessed one of the stingiest defenses in the country thanks to a stifling presence at the net for a second straight season.
- ▶ As a team, Maryland paced the country in blocks per set (3.33) and total team blocks (396.5), signifying the second-consecutive season in which the Terps finished among the top five in the NCAA in those categories. In 2021, the Terps led the NCAA in blocks per set while finishing fourth in total team blocks.
- ▶ Rainelle Jones and Anastasia Russ led the way on the block in 2022, finishing with the second and fourth in blocks per set rate in the country, respectively. The duo both finished among the top 10 in total blocks as well, with Russ ranking third with 182 blocks and Jones tying for 10th with 173 blocks.
- ▶ Thanks to their individual blocking prowess, Russ and Jones were the only teammates in the NCAA to rank among the top 10 in the same statistical category.
- ▶ In the Big Ten rankings, Russ and Jones finished first and third in blocks, respectively, while Laila Ricks finished ninth with 122 rejections.

HOP ON THE RUSS BUS

- ▶ Anastasia Russ is back for her redshirt senior year after a tremendous first season with Maryland.
- ▶ The redshirt junior transfer from Pittsburgh slid into a starting role as a middle blocker, ranking third in the country in total blocks (182) and fourth in blocks per set (1.54) to earn Second Team All-Big Ten and AVCA Northeast Region All-American honors.
- ▶ Additionally, the Pittsburgh, PA native won a pair of Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week awards, winning the award on Oct. 17 after combining for 15 total blocks to power sweeps over Northwestern and No. 9 Purdue, then winning her second accolade on Nov. 21 after recording a career-high 12 total blocks in an upset over No. 5 Ohio State.

GOOD CSIRE

- ▶ Heading into her senior year, Sam Csire looks to join elite company and move her way up the Maryland volleyball record books.
- ▶ In 2022, Csire led the team in kills (401), attempts (1295) and points (460.5). Additionally, Csire recorded double-digit kills in 23 of the Terps' 32 matches while notching six double-doubles.
- ▶ The Strongsville, OH product put in a career performance in the Terps' upset of No. 5 Ohio State, earning a double-double by registering a season-best 22 kills along with 10 digs.
- ▶ Entering the 2023 season, Csire is primed to join Maryland's 1,000 Kill Club, as she sits at 891 career kills, becoming the 15th member of the prestigious group.

DOWLER SETTING THE TONE

- ▶ As the Terps' starting setter, Sydney Dowler hopes to facilitate a strong offensive year in her senior season.
- ▶ In 2022, the Green Hope, NC native dished out 1,012 assists, marking her second-consecutive season with at least 1,000 assists, while averaging 8.72 assists per set.
- ▶ On serve, she led the Terps with 40 aces, a mark that tied for fifth in the Big Ten.
- ▶ Defensively, Dowler made her mark in the backcourt and at the net, as she ranked second on the team with 282 digs and fourth on the team with 111 blocks.
- ▶ Her offensive and defensive proficiency led to 12 double-doubles on the season, the most on the Maryland roster in 2022.

BUDDING IVEY

- ▶ In her debut season, Laila Ivey made waves as one of Maryland's most consistent offensive forces.
- ▶ The freshman outside hitter finished second on the team with 285 kills, finishing with double-digit kills in 16 matches.
- ▶ Ivey broke out in a big way during Maryland's Nov. 6 win over Iowa, tallying a career-high 18 kills to lead the Terps.

MOVES IN THE MAGNOLIA STATE

- ▶ Maryland head coach Adam Hughes dipped into the state of Mississippi for a pair of instant impact transfers, plucking Lilly Gunter from Mississippi State while nabbing Samantha Schnitta from Ole Miss.
- ▶ Gunter joins the Terps after serving as the regular defensive specialist/libero with the Bulldogs for three seasons. She has totaled 1,190 career digs, ranking third in the SEC with 4.29 digs per set in conference play.
- ▶ After playing pin hitter for the Rebels for three seasons, Schnitta joins the Terps to bolster the offense. Schnitta enters 2023 with 432 kills, averaging 2.26 kills per set with a .212 career hitting percentage.

FRESH FACES

- ▶ Maryland welcomes four freshman into the fold for the 2023 season, as Sydney Bryant, Alex McGillivray, Eva Rohrbach and Jonna Spohn compete in their first collegiate season.
- ▶ From nearby Upper Marlboro, MD, Bryant was a nominee for 2022-23 Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year and VISAA Player of the Year as an outside hitter for Flint Hill High School, leading the Huskies to a pair of state volleyball championships.

- ▶ McGillivray, a Solana Beach, CA native, had a successful prep career as the libero for the Torrey Pines High School, one of the top high school volleyball teams in the country.
- ▶ A middle blocker from San Diego, CA, Rohrbach joins the Terps as a VolleyballMag.com Fab 50 nominee who earned 2021 Prep Volleyball Second Team High School All-American and 2021 First Team All-CIF honors.
- ▶ Spohn rounds out the roster as a highly-decorated libero from Lewis Center, OH, who was named a 2022 AVCA All-American and AVCA All-Region selection while being named to the OHSAA First Team All-State.

LIVE AMMO

- ▶ Former NCAA Men's Volleyball National Champion and NCAA Most Outstanding Player Ryan Ammerman joined the Maryland volleyball coaching staff in May 2023.
- ▶ Ammerman joins the Terps' coaching staff after spending the 2022-23 season as an assistant coach for his alma mater, UC Irvine, coaching the men's team to the Big West Tournament title game.
- ▶ As a setter for the Anteaters from 2004-09, Ammerman led UCI to its first two NCAA National Championships in 2007 and 2009. In his final season, Ammerman was named AVCA First Team All-American honors while winning the NCAA Most Outstanding Player award.
- ▶ Ammerman and Maryland head coach Adam Hughes had overlap during their times at UC Irvine, as Ammerman won his second national title for the Anteaters while Hughes served as a volunteer assistant with the women's team between 2008-09.

UPSET WATCH

- ▶ Over the past two seasons, Maryland has developed a knack for earning major upset wins against highly-ranked Big Ten opponents.
- ▶ The Terps boast three wins over top-10 programs from the Big Ten across the 2021-22 campaigns, with two such wins last season.
- ▶ Maryland earned its first-ever win against an AVCA Top 10 team on Sept. 24, 2021, when the Terps defeated No. 2 Wisconsin, 3-2, on the Badgers' route to the 2021 NCAA National Championship.
- ▶ Another milestone came on Oct. 16, 2022 with Maryland's 3-0 sweep victory at No. 9 Purdue, marking the Terps' first-ever top-10 road victory.
- ▶ Late in 2022, the Terps knocked off No. 5 Ohio State with a 3-1 triumph at the XFINITY Center Pavilion.

PACKING THE PAV

- ▶ The XFINITY Center Pavilion has turned into one of the most intimidating places to play in the country, as the packed-in environment rivals any in the country.
- ▶ Despite having the smallest home venue in the Big Ten, the Terps finished the season ranked 34th in the NCAA in average home attendance, with 1,360 fans coming out to support the Maryland volleyball on average.
- ▶ The Terps exceeded the XFINITY Center Pavilion's capacity of 1,500 on four occasions in 2022, with Maryland's Oct. 2 contest against No. 3 Nebraska and Oct. 21 matchup against No. 13 Penn State drawing over 2,000 spectators.

ROAD WARRIORS

- ▶ Despite playing in some of the toughest environments in the country, Maryland held its own away from College Park, finishing 2022 with an 8-5 record in road contests.
- ▶ The Terps had an outstanding October on the road, finishing 4-1 away from home in the thick of the Big Ten schedule while winning four consecutive matches.
- ▶ With the four-match win streak, Maryland won four consecutive Big Ten matches for the first time in program history, sweeping Rutgers, Northwestern and No. 9 Purdue before taking down Iowa in four sets.

HEAD COACH ADAM HUGHES

71-77 (.479) - Sixth Season



Adam Hughes was elevated to head coach of the Maryland volleyball program on Jan. 23, 2018 and will enter his sixth season at the helm in 2023. Previously the associate head coach for the Terrapins, Hughes is the fifth head coach in program history. He owns 71 career victories after completion of the 2022 season.

Hughes led Maryland to another strong season in 2022, notching victories in nine of their opening 12 matches. The Terps continued their success in Big Ten play, picking up ranked wins over No. 9 Purdue and No. 5 Ohio State. The sweep over the Boilermakers marked the program's first-ever road victory over a top-10 team.

In 2021, Hughes led the Terps to one of their best seasons in recent memory. The Terps' 19 victories is the most since 2010 for the Terps. Maryland's undefeated 13-0 start was the team's best beginning since 2005. Their seven Big Ten victories, are the most for the program since 2018. The highlight of the season came with a thrilling five-set victory over the eventual NCAA National Champion Wisconsin Badgers. He recorded his 50th career victory with a 3-0 sweep over Indiana on October 9, 2021.

Hughes elevated Maryland to new heights within the Big Ten in his first year as head coach, leading the Terps to a number of program bests and firsts. In 2018, Maryland won a program-best nine Big Ten matches and the most road matches (nine) in 13 years. In addition, Hughes led Maryland to their first road win over a ranked team, defeating No. 15 Michigan on November 7, first ever win at Ohio State, and season sweeps over Ohio State, Rutgers and Iowa. Hughes coached Maryland's first-ever First Team All-Big Ten performer, Erika Pritchard, who led the conference in kills per set and Maryland's first ever three-time Big Ten Player of the Week, Allegra Rivas, who took home the defensive award three times.

Prior to becoming head coach, Hughes served as an assistant coach with the Terps for four seasons from 2014-18, worked with Penn State as both a volunteer assistant from 2003-08 and Director of Volleyball Operations from 2010-14, where he witnessed the Nittany Lions capture three NCAA National Championships and eight Big Ten Conference titles. He also served as a volunteer assistant with UC Irvine from 2008-09.

Hughes earned a bachelor's degree in Economics from the Penn State Smeal School of Business in 2006. Adam and his wife, Alice, have three daughters, Harper, Hayden, and Henley.

- ▶ Acted as volunteer assistant, manager, and eventually Director of Volleyball Operations while at Penn State
- ▶ Spent time at UC Irvine (2008-09) as volunteer assistant coach
- ▶ 2006 Penn State Smeal School of Business Graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in Economics
- ▶ 2002 State College High School Graduate
- ▶ Coffee connoisseur, avid runner, and passionate Yankees fan
- ▶ Appeared on "Campus Eats" on Big Ten Network, visiting Vigilante Coffee
