No. 2 IOWA WINS THE 2022 BIG TEN TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONSHIP



GAME NOTES

IOWA TEAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes won their fourth Big Ten Tournament title and second in the last four seasons. Head Coach Lisa Bluder has led the Hawkeyes to three of Iowa's four titles (2001, 2019, 2022), with the other coming in 1997
- Bluder set a new Big Ten Tournament record with her 26th career tournament victory, passing former Indiana and Purdue Head Coach Sharon Versyp (25)
- With today's win, the Hawkeyes secured the Big Ten Conference's automatic qualifying berth into the 2022 NCAA Tournament and will make their 28th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and their fourth in a row
- Sophomore Caitlin Clark and senior Monika Czinano were selected to the 2022 Big Ten Women's Basketball All-Tournament Team, with Clark earning the Jim and Kitty Delany Most Outstanding Player award. Clark is the fourth Hawkeye to receive Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors joining Angela Hamblin (1997), Cara Consuegra (2001) and Megan Gustafson (2019)
- Czinano finished the afternoon with 30 points and 10 rebounds, her second 30-10 double-double this year. Coincidentally both came against Indiana (Last - 31 points and 10 rebounds on Feb. 21)
- Czinano averaged 24.3 points per game over her three outings in the 2022 Big Ten Tournament
- Clark posted 26.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game at the Big Ten Tournament en route to her Jim and Kitty Delany Most Outstanding Player selection at Gainbridge Fieldhouse Sunday

INDIANA TEAM NOTES

- Grace Berger and Nicole Cardaño-Hillary were named to the 2022 Big Ten Women's Basketball All-Tournament Team. Berger and Cardaño-Hillary are the sixth and seventh Hoosiers to ever earn Big Ten All-Tournament recognition, joining Heather Cassady (2002), Jill Chapman (2002), Cyndi Valentin (2006) and Ali Patberg (2019 and 2020)
- Berger finished with 20 points, seven rebounds and four assists in the championship game, marking her highest-scoring outing over the last five games and her eighth 20-plus point game of the year
- Cardaño-Hillary scored 19 points on Sunday, which was tied for her second-highest scoring performance this season

GENERAL NOTES

- Sunday's attendance of 8,709 was the fifth-largest single-session crowd in Big Ten Tournament history and the third-largest audience ever for a Big Ten Tournament championship game. The last tournament crowd that was larger than Sunday's for any session came in 2006 (8,780 for the semifinal session), while the last title game attendance greater than Sunday's crowd was 2004 (tournament single-session record 9,417 fans).
