**Website/Football Media Center:** The Big Ten football media center on [www.bigten.org](http://www.bigten.org) provides a single site for media to access information on every Big Ten football program, including downloadable PDFs of media guides, weekly releases and statistics for the conference and every school along with information and audio for the weekly coaches teleconference. The Big Ten football media center can be accessed by going to the primary football page on [www.bigten.org](http://www.bigten.org) and clicking on the "Football Media Center" link. This website is meant for media use only and is password-protected—please contact the Big Ten Communications office for the username and password.

**Weekly Coaches Teleconference:** The Big Ten Conference football coaches participate in a weekly media teleconference on Tuesdays from 11 a.m.–1 p.m. CT. Contact the Big Ten Communications office for the teleconference phone number and schedule.

**Weekly Awards:** Big Ten Football Players of the Week are selected in three categories: offensive, defensive and special teams. The Big Ten office will announce weekly football award winners on Mondays. Award winners are chosen by a vote of the Big Ten Communications staff from nominations supplied by the sports information offices.

**End-of-Year Awards:** In football, coaches and a media panel each choose All-Conference teams (First, Second and Honorable Mention). Coaches and media pick Big Ten Offensive and Defensive Players and a Freshman of the Year. The coaches select the Conference Offensive and Defensive Linemen of the Year and Sportsmanship Award honorees, while the media vote on the Dave McClain Coach of the Year award. The Big Ten *Chicago Tribune* Most Valuable Player is chosen from each of the 11 institutions' MVPs. Academic All-Big Ten teams are named for every sport. The teams are composed of all letterwinners who have a cumulative grade point average of "B" or better. Freshmen and first-year junior college transfers are not eligible for Academic All-Big Ten selection.

## COMMISSIONER JAMES E. DELANY

Only the Big Ten's fifth commissioner since its founding in 1896, James E. Delany enters his 19th year in that role. He has led the Big Ten through significant periods of change and growth that have helped the conference maintain its preeminent position as one of the nation's leaders in providing quality athletic and academic experiences for young people.

Some of the accomplishments and changes that the conference has experienced under Delany's leadership since he arrived in 1989 include:

### INNOVATION

- Expansion of the conference to 11 institutions with the addition of Penn State in June 1991;
- Established Big Ten bowl tie-ins beginning in 1991, which now includes annual participation in the Rose, Capital One, Outback, Alamo, Champs Sports, Insight and Motor City Bowls;
- Creation of the first national conference-owned television network devoted to the athletic and academic programs of a single conference. The Big Ten Network, a joint venture with Fox, is set to launch in August 2007 and will telecast some 350 events and over 660 hours of institutional non-athletic programming annually;
- Developed the first collegiate version of football instant replay implemented during the 2004 season;
- Negotiated extensions of ABC, CBS and ESPN agreements, beginning with the 2007–08 season and covering over 130 events annually;
- Participated in NCAA, BCS and Big Ten media negotiations, resulting in rights fees in excess of \$10 billion, since 1990;
- Adoption of the Gender Equity Action Plan (GEAP) that spans a 16-year period. This program includes three phases. The first, Phase I, began in 1992 when the Big Ten became the first conference to voluntarily adopt participation goals for female student-athletes. Phase II, commonly known as "Dream Big," was initiated in the summer of 1998 as a public outreach campaign that encourages young girls in grades K-8th to participate in sports. Phase III, a marketing campaign launched to support and better promote conference women's Olympic sports, began in 2002. Over 2,000 women's participation opportunities have been created during this time frame, resulting in a 53/47 male/female participation ratio;
- Implementation of conference-wide sportsmanship initiatives focusing on creating safer venues for visiting teams, officials and fans. A Big Ten Sportsmanship Award was established and the conference has recognized more than 1,300 student-athletes in the past five years for demonstrating outstanding sportsmanship;
- Established a Big Ten library of more than 4,000 classic football and basketball games.

### NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS AND BROAD-BASED ATHLETIC PROGRAMS

- Provides approximately \$90 million in athletic scholarship aid to more than 8,400 men and women student-athletes on 275 teams;
- Since 1989, teams from Big Ten institutions have won NCAA, BCS or national championships in the following 20 sports:

### FOOTBALL

- Overseeing increased depth and competitiveness in football, with nine different conference teams earning at least a share of the Big Ten title since 1990. In addition, seven different programs have played in the Rose Bowl in that time, as the conference has won seven of its last 12 games in Pasadena. In the last decade, Big Ten football teams have won two national championships and posted two undefeated seasons;
- Active in developing the Bowl Championship Series. Since 1998, Big Ten teams have competed in more BCS games than any other conference;
- Unprecedented attendance growth in football, as each of the top 10 single-season total attendance records have been established during his tenure, including a single-season total of 5,499,439 in 2002 and an average record of 72,566 patrons per game set in 2005.

### BASKETBALL

- Continued success in men's basketball, with nine Final Four teams since his arrival, including seven over the last eight seasons and a pair of national semifinalists in 2000 and 2005. In women's basketball, the Big Ten has collected eight national semifinal and three championship game appearances, including the first national title in conference history in 1999;
- Has led the country in average attendance for men's basketball in each of the last 31 years including a conference record of 2.2 million fans in 2000–01. In women's basketball, the league has surpassed the 600,000 mark in total attendance in each of the last 10 seasons, including a record 751,000 in 2003–04;
- Formation of men's and women's basketball postseason tournaments, as well as Challenge series with various conferences including the ACC, Big 12 and SEC;
- Implemented the Big Ten Men's and Women's Basketball Foreign Tours, which concluded in the summer of 2006. The Tours gave hundreds of student-athletes the opportunity to travel abroad, visiting such places as Austria, Australia, Belgium, Denmark, England, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Scotland, Spain, Sweden and Slovakia. Over a 13-year span, the men's teams posted a 51-34 record while the women's teams went 51-18.

### COMMUNITY

- Creation and expansion of a community outreach program, SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday), through which the conference office has partnered with two Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance. In 17 years, over 6,000 children have participated in this program;
- Establishment of the Big Ten 9-11 Scholarship Fund. Following the national tragedy on September 11, 2001, the Big Ten Conference, through its intercollegiate athletic department revenues, pledged a \$1 million scholarship contribution to assist the families of those affected by the terrorist attacks;
- Developed a conference relief campaign to support victims affected by the 2005 hurricanes. During the 2005–06 season, donations to the American Red Cross Relief Fund were collected at each Big Ten Championship/Tournament;
- Established through the Big Ten Network, 110 on-campus internships for academic credit beginning in 2007–08.

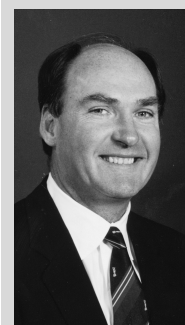
The 59-year-old Delany is a native of South Orange, N.J. He received his undergraduate degree in political science from the University of North Carolina in 1970 and juris doctorate degree from the University of North Carolina School of Law in 1973. At UNC, Delany was a three-year member of the varsity basketball team, serving as tri-captain in 1970. As a Tar Heel, Delany twice participated in NCAA Final Four competition.

After earning his law degree, Delany served as counsel for the North Carolina Senate Judiciary Committee from 1973 to 1974, and was staff attorney for the North Carolina Justice Department from 1974 to 1975.

Delany's distinguished career in administering intercollegiate athletics began at the NCAA where he was employed as an enforcement representative from 1975 to 1979. For the next decade, he served as commissioner of the Ohio Valley Conference, where he oversaw the growth and enhancement of OVC athletic programs for men and women.

Active in the community, Delany has coached several youth teams and has been associated with Special Olympics and YMCA endeavors at various times.

Delany and his wife, Catherine "Kitty" Fisher Delany, also an attorney, have two sons, Newman, 18 years old, and James Chancellor, 15 years old. The Delanys reside in Hinsdale, Ill.

# BIG TEN CONFERENCE HISTORY

A meeting of seven Midwest university presidents on January 11, 1895, at the Palmer House in Chicago to discuss the regulation and control of intercollegiate athletics was the first development of what would become one of organized sports' most successful undertakings.

Those seven men, behind the leadership of James H. Smart, president of Purdue University, established the principles for which the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives, more popularly known as the Big Ten Conference, would be founded.

At that meeting, a blueprint for the control and administration of college athletics under the direction of appointed faculty representatives was outlined. The presidents' first-known action "restricted eligibility for athletics to bonafide, full-time students who were not delinquent in their studies."

This helped limit some problems of the times, especially the participation of professional athletes and "non-students" in the university's regular sporting events. That important legislation, along with others that would follow in the coming years, served as the primary building block for amateur intercollegiate athletics.

Eleven months after the presidents met, one faculty member from each of those seven universities met at the same Palmer House and officially established the mechanics of the "Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives" or "Western Conference."

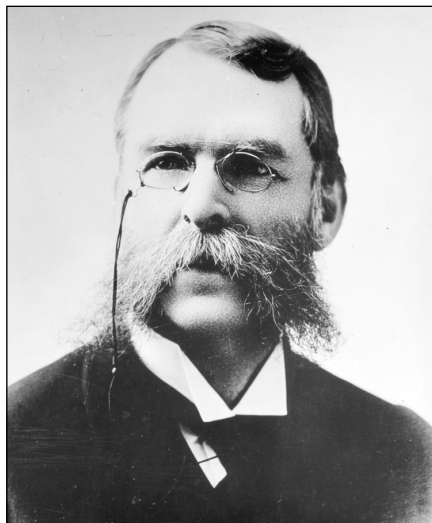
Those seven universities were University of Chicago, University of Illinois, University of Michigan, University of Minnesota, Northwestern University, Purdue University and the University of Wisconsin. Indiana University and the State University of Iowa were admitted in 1899. Michigan temporarily withdrew from the conference in 1908 and Ohio State University joined in 1912. When Michigan resumed membership in 1917, the league was first referred to as the "Big Ten Conference," which became the organization's official name when the conference was incorporated in 1987. Chicago withdrew in 1946 and Michigan State College (now Michigan State University) was added three years later in 1949.



After a 40-year period of constancy in membership, the conference expanded to 11 members for the first time. On June 4, 1990, the Council of Presidents voted to confirm its earlier decision to integrate Pennsylvania State University into the conference.

As the 1900s opened, faculty representatives established rules for intercollegiate athletics that were novel for the time. As early as 1906, the faculty approved legislation that required eligible athletes to meet entrance requirements and to have completed a full year's work, along with having one year of residence. Both freshmen and graduate students were not permitted to compete, training tables (or quarters) were forbidden and coaches were to be appointed by university bodies "at modest salaries."

Football and baseball were the popular sports prior to 1900. Wisconsin won the first two football

championships and Chicago claimed the first three baseball titles. The first "official" sponsored championship was in outdoor track. It was held at the University of Chicago in 1906 with Michigan earning the title.

Since 1906, there have been many different athletic events popularized on Big Ten campuses. Some became extremely popular—football and basketball, for example. Others, like boxing, fell by the wayside. Today, the Big Ten

sponsors 25 championships, 12 for men and 13 for women.

The office of the commissioner of athletics was created in 1922 "to study athletic problems of the various Western Conference universities and assist in enforcing the eligibility rules which govern Big Ten athletics." Major John L. Griffith was appointed as the first commissioner and served in that position until his death in 1944. Kenneth L. "Tug" Wilson, former director of athletics at Northwestern, served from 1944 until he retired in 1961. Bill Reed, an assistant commissioner since 1951, succeeded Wilson until his death in 1971. Wayne Duke became the fourth Big Ten commissioner in 1971 and retired June 30, 1989. Duke was succeeded by James E. Delany on July 1, 1989. Delany came to the Big Ten following 10 years as Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner.

Delany is only the fifth commissioner in the history of the Big Ten. He oversees the operation of the Big Ten Conference office and its staff, housed at the Big Ten Conference office headquarters and meetings center in Park Ridge, Illinois.

The conference's first fully owned and operated building is located 10 minutes from O'Hare Airport and has been designed to fully service the needs of over 60 different committees, coaches and governance groups from the conference that hold more than 125 meeting days per year.

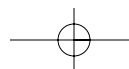
From the conference office headquarters, Delany and his staff manage over 500 television events, provide legislative and compliance services, manage 25 different sport championships and tournaments, provide staff services to over 400 coaching and administrative personnel on Big Ten campuses, and service the media's and fans' needs and interests for information about the Big Ten Conference.

# THE BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Prior to the 1998 football regular season, the Rose, Fiesta, Orange and Sugar Bowls joined with the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences and the University of Notre Dame to form the Bowl Championship Series (BCS).

The BCS was established to determine the national champion for college football while maintaining and enhancing the bowl system which has provided significant support to college football for nearly a century. The BCS has quickly become a showcase for the sport, matching the premier teams of any particular year in the culminating games of the season.

In the first eight years of the system, the Rose, Fiesta, Orange and Sugar Bowls rotated as the host of the championship game. The BCS debuted a new format at the conclusion of the 2006 regular season which included the above four bowls and a stand-alone BCS National Championship Game, held approximately one week after the other BCS games. The first BCS National Championship Game was hosted by the Fiesta Bowl in Glendale, Ariz., on Jan. 8, 2007. Each of the remaining bowls listed above will serve as the site of the title game once over the next three years, as the current BCS extension concludes with the 2009-10 bowl season. The 2008 BCS National Championship Game will be held in New Orleans, La., on Jan. 7, 2008, roughly one week after the Sugar Bowl is held in the same location on Jan. 1.

The BCS format provides for the determination of a national champion using a traditional bowl lineup featuring more flexibility and regional consideration regarding team selection. Conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pacific-10 and Southeastern Conferences. Also, the champion of any other Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conference will earn automatic qualification if (a) it is ranked in the top 12 of the BCS standings or (b) it is ranked in the top 16 of the BCS Standings and its ranking in the final BCS Standings is higher than that of a champion of a conference that has an annual automatic berth in one of the BCS bowls.

Regional tie-ins include the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in the Rose Bowl, the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl. Should one of the above bowl's regional tie-ins be ranked number one or two in the final BCS standings, that team shall move to the BCS National Championship Game and the bowl shall select a replacement team from the BCS pool of eligible teams. The pool will consist of any FBS team that is ranked among the Top 14 in the final BCS standings and has achieved nine wins during the regular season excluding NCAA-exempted contests.

Through a conference revenue sharing plan, the BCS has distributed over \$42 million to institutions in the Football Championship Subdivision during its nine-year history.

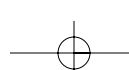

# THE ROSE BOWL



The Big Ten's return to a more traditional bowl lineup continues this season with conference teams and fans once again setting their sights on Pasadena, the Tournament of Roses and the 94th Rose Bowl Game. The 2008 Rose Bowl game will be held on Jan. 1 with ABC Sports televising the game at its traditional 5 p.m. EST time slot.

With the expansion of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) last season to include a fifth game, the BCS National Championship Game, the Rose Bowl will host the champions of the Big Ten and Pacific-10 Conferences in each of the next three years unless one of those teams is ranked No. 1 or 2 in the final BCS standings. In that case, that team shall move to the BCS National Championship Game and the Rose Bowl would select a replacement from the BCS pool of eligible teams, which could include another team from the Big Ten or Pacific-10 Conferences.

The BCS National Championship Game will be held in New Orleans, La., on Jan. 7, 2008, nearly one week after the Sugar Bowl is held in the same location on Jan. 1. The Rose Bowl will serve as the host of the BCS National Championship Game following the 2009 regular season, one week after the 96th Rose Bowl Game.

Like most long-standing traditions, the Rose Bowl has come full circle. Since the pact was initiated in 1946, the Big Ten and Pac-10 have nearly established parity in the Rose Bowl win-loss column, with the Pac-10 holding a narrow 31-29 advantage. In the Big Ten's last 10 appearances (from 1994 through 2006), six different teams participated in the Rose Bowl. Big Ten programs have also won seven of their last 12 Rose Bowl match-ups overall.

## History of the Rose Bowl

The Pacific Coast (now the Pacific-10) and Western (Big Ten) Conferences, along with the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Association, agreed on November 19, 1946, to an exclusive Rose Bowl Game contract. The two conferences had met twice before in the Rose Bowl,

including a Michigan victory in the inaugural event in 1902 and an Ohio State loss in 1921. More than two decades later, both conference commissioners commented that they "expect this five-year contract to be a forerunner of a long-time agreement. This present agreement is just a starter." The passing of time has shown us they were right on both accounts. It remains the oldest college football agreement between two of the nation's top conferences.

Though the contract was often referred to as a "shotgun marriage," officials had been in negotiation with the Tournament for eight years. The contract was effective immediately, voted on by faculty representatives from the two conferences.

Both sides agreed that each conference could designate its own representative, regardless of season records. Illinois (7-2) and UCLA (10-0) were selected to play in the inaugural game under the pact. The Illini earned a 45-14 triumph, sparking a six-game winning streak in the annual matchup, as the Big Ten was triumphant in 12 of the first 13 games under the new agreement.

The 1963 game was the first No. 1 against No. 2 showdown, matching undefeated USC (10-0) with Wisconsin (8-1). The Badgers fell just short in a high-scoring affair, 42-37, and the two conferences split their 10 games during the 1960s.

The Pac-10 won nine of 10 games during the 1970s, with Ohio State knocking off USC, 42-21, in 1974, the second of three straight matchups between the two programs. Michigan snapped the Pac-10's six-game victory streak in 1981, one of three Big Ten victories during the decade. The '90s featured a reversal of fortunes with the Big Ten winning six of the 10 Rose Bowl contests.

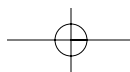
In its 93 years, the Rose Bowl has maintained its tradition-rich standard of excellence, living up to the nickname "Granddaddy of all bowl games." The union of the Big Ten and Pac-10 also led to soaring attendance. Prior to 1947, the Rose Bowl game drew five sellout crowds. Every game since then has been a sellout. The record for most appearances goes to USC (22) in the Pac-10 and Michigan (20) in the Big Ten.

## METHOD TO DETERMINE BIG TEN CONFERENCE AUTOMATIC REPRESENTATIVE TO THE BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Effective for bowl games following the 2006-09 regular football seasons, the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) will consist of five (5) bowl games: BCS National Championship Game, Rose Bowl, Fiesta Bowl, Orange Bowl and Sugar Bowl. Participation by a Big Ten Conference member institution will be determined as follows:

- a. **BCS National Championship Game.** In the event the conference has one or two football teams ranked No. 1 and/or No. 2 in the final BCS poll, these conference team(s) shall participate in the BCS National Championship Game.
- b. **Rose Bowl.** Unless ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS poll, the conference champion shall participate in the Rose Bowl. The championship shall be determined on the percentage basis of conference games (tie game counts 1/2 win and 1/2 loss). If there is a tie for the championship, the Rose Bowl representative will be determined as follows:
  - 1) An ineligible team shall not be considered in the standings for determination of the conference representative.
  - 2) If there is a tie for the championship, the winner of the game between these two teams shall represent the conference.
  - 3) If there is still a tie for the championship, or if the tied teams did not play each other, the team that played more games against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams shall be eliminated.
  - 4) If there is still a tie, or if the tied teams did not play each other, or if both teams played the same number of games against an FCS team(s), the representative shall be determined on the percentage basis of all games played.
  - 5) If there is still a tie, the most recent team earning BCS automatic selection shall be eliminated.
  - 6) If more than two teams tie for the championship, the same selection procedures shall be followed with the following exceptions:
    - a) If three teams are tied, and if one team defeated both of the other teams, then that team shall be the representative.
    - b) If three teams are still tied, and if two of the three teams defeated the third team, the third team is eliminated, and the remaining two teams shall revert to the two-team tie procedure.

- c) If three teams are still tied, and there is a tie game between two of the three teams, or if two or all three of the teams did not play each other, the representative shall be determined on a percentage basis of all games played except, if one or two of the tied teams played more games against an FCS opponent than the other tied teams, then said team or teams shall be eliminated, and the remaining two teams, if applicable, shall revert to the two-team tie procedure.
- d) If three teams are still tied, and one of the three teams is eliminated through the percentage basis of all games played, the remaining two teams shall revert to the two-team tie procedure.
- e) If three teams are still tied, and all three teams have the same winning percentage of all games played, the most recent team representing the conference shall be eliminated, and the two remaining teams shall revert to the two-team tie procedure.
- 7) If four or more teams tie for the championship, the following selection procedure shall be followed:
  - a) If one team defeated each of the other three teams, then that team shall be the representative.
  - b) If two of the four teams defeated each of the other two teams, the latter two teams shall be eliminated, and the two remaining teams shall revert to the two-team tie procedure.
  - c) If three of the four teams defeated the fourth team, the fourth team is eliminated, and the remaining three teams shall revert to the three-team tie procedure.
  - d) If there is a tie game between two of the four teams, or if two of the four teams did not play each other, the representative shall be determined on a percentage of all games played, except, if one or more of the tied teams played more games against an FCS opponent than the other tied teams, then said teams shall be eliminated, and the remaining teams, if applicable, shall revert to the two- or three-team tie procedure.
  - e) If one of the four teams is eliminated through the percentage of all games played, the remaining three teams shall revert to the three-team tie procedure.
  - f) If all four teams are still tied and have the same winning percentage of all games played, the most recent team representing the conference shall be eliminated and the three remaining teams shall revert to the three-team tie procedure.

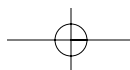

## BIG TEN MEDIA AGREEMENTS

Over the last few years, the Big Ten has reached a series of milestone media agreements to provide the conference with its greatest television exposure ever, including extensions with CBS (for basketball) and ABC/ESPN (for football, basketball and volleyball) and the creation of the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs. The conference's new media agreements will result in the broadcast of more than 500 events nationally and regionally beginning with the 2007–08 academic year, compared to 300 events in the final year of the previous agreements.

### CBS



In December of 2004, the Big Ten announced a multi-year agreement with CBS Sports to extend the network's broadcast rights for conference basketball games through the 2009–10 campaign. The agreement guarantees Big Ten teams 26 appearances per season with the possibility of up to 30 appearances beginning with the 2008–09 campaign. That total includes the semifinals and championship game of the annual Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament, which have been broadcast by CBS every year since the inaugural event in 1998 and have ranked among the network's highest-rated regular-season games each season. In addition, CBS will have the opportunity to select a wildcard game on each of the final three weekends of Big Ten play starting with the 2007–08 campaign. Additional appearances by Big Ten women's basketball teams will also be featured on CBS. CBS has been the national network home for Big Ten men's basketball since the 1991–92 campaign.

### ABC/ESPN



In June of 2006, the Big Ten signed a new 10-year national rights contract with ABC/ESPN. Big Ten action has been featured on ABC since 1966 and on ESPN since 1979, the network's first year. The new agreement, which begins during the 2007–08 season, includes up to 41 televised Big Ten football games—up to 17 on ABC and up to 25 on ESPN or ESPN2. In addition, all regional afternoon football games aired on ABC will be aired by ESPN/ESPN2 in outer-markets, making these games nationally available. For men's basketball, approximately 60 games will air on an ESPN network (ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN360), including contests on Tuesday and Thursday of the conference season, plus up to eight Saturday games during conference play. For women's basketball and volleyball, a total of 100 events will appear on an ESPN network over the course of the agreement, including the championship games of the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament. Additionally, through ESPN's collection of new media outlets such as ESPN.com, Mobile ESPN, ESPN360 and ESPN VOD, fans will receive live events (including simulcasts), extended video highlights including in-progress games, features and more. Big Ten coverage will also be available on ESPN Classic and throughout the world through ESPN International.

### BIG TEN NETWORK

In June of 2006, the Big Ten announced the creation of the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs. Available to all cable



and satellite providers nationwide, with most programs offered in stunning high-definition television (HDTV), the network will allow fans to see their home teams, regardless of where they live.



Mark Silverman

The network is led by President Mark Silverman, a former Disney executive who came to the network after serving as the general manager and senior vice president of ABC Cable Networks Group since April of 2004, managing the company's equity in such channels as Lifetime Television, A&E Network and the History Channel, each of which recorded their best financial performance in 2005. Silverman was also responsible for developing and launching new cable channels, shows and other key initiatives.

The Big Ten Network launches its inaugural season in August 2007 with football, men's and women's basketball, a nightly studio show, classics and coaches shows, along with more Olympic sporting events and exposure for women's sports than has ever been aired on any other network. In June 2007, the Big Ten announced that the Big Ten Network will become the first national network to commit to "event equality" for men's and women's sports on all network-controlled media within the first three years of launch. This dedication to "event equality" highlights the Big Ten's ongoing dedication to gender equity, which is aligned with the commitment of conference institutions to provide fairness for all female student-athletes.

The programming on the Big Ten Network and alternative network-controlled platforms will include, but is not limited to:

- More than 35 football games each season
- More than 105 regular season men's basketball games
- A nightly studio show including segments from each campus
- Women's sports, including basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball

- More than 170 Olympic sporting events including baseball, soccer, tennis, volleyball, swimming, diving and more
- Classic games and historical footage from ESPN and ABC libraries
- Original campus programming produced by Big Ten member universities showcasing their academic excellence, talented students and award-winning programs
- Weekly coaches shows

Located in the historic Montgomery Ward building in Chicago, the Big Ten Network is the first national television network to call the largest city in the Midwest its home. The original section of the building was designated as a historic landmark in 2000 for its significant role in American retail history. The space includes two studios and three control rooms as well as a 20,000-square-foot office space.



Dave Revsine

In May, the Big Ten Network announced its first on-air hire, signing ESPN college sports expert Dave Revsine to be its lead studio host. Revsine joined ESPN in October of 1996 as an anchor for ESPNNews and filled a variety of roles for the network over the past 10 years. The Northwestern graduate has anchored SportsCenter, hosted ESPN Radio's College GameDay for the last six years and hosted ESPN Radio's coverage of several BCS Championship games. He also hosted studio halftimes for basketball and co-hosted ESPN's coverage of the last two men's Final Fours.

In addition to airing more coverage of Big Ten sports than ever before, the Big Ten Network will also provide numerous benefits to communities around the Big Ten. Those include increased exposure for women's sports, providing positive role models for girls; a greater economic impact to the communities from added sporting event production, with the potential to generate higher attendance; and greater national exposure for the excellence that surrounds the academic endeavors of Big Ten universities, some of the most highly regarded in the nation. Also, an internship program at each of the 11 universities will offer students training for careers in sports, television and entertainment.

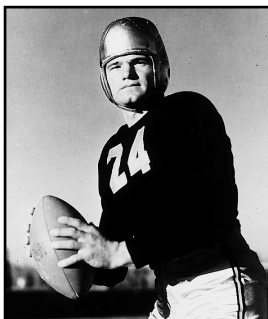


## BIG TEN AND THE HEISMAN TROPHY

The Heisman Trophy is annually awarded to the nation's outstanding college football player, and Big Ten student-athletes have a long and storied history with this honor. The conference boasts the first Heisman Trophy honoree in Chicago's Jay Berwanger (1935) along with the only two-time winner in Ohio State's Archie Griffin (1974 and 1975). The Big Ten has claimed the Heisman Trophy on 15 occasions overall, a total that leads all conferences.



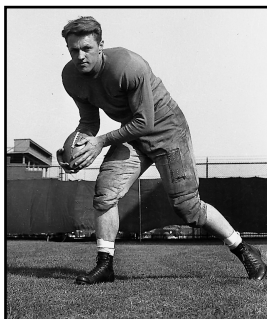
Awarded the first Heisman Trophy after the 1935 season, Chicago halfback Jay Berwanger was the last in a long line of University of Chicago football All-Americans.



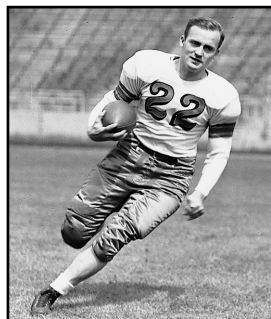
Iowa halfback Nile Kinnick won the 1939 Heisman after playing 402 out of a possible 420 minutes in the last seven games of the season. Iowa's football stadium is dedicated in his honor.



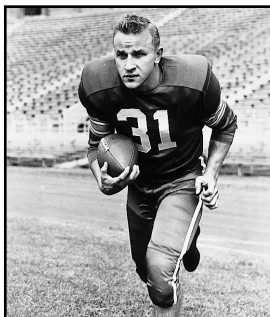
Michigan halfback Tom Harmon won the Big Ten's third Heisman Trophy in 1940. A two-time national scoring champion, Harmon finished with 33 touchdowns, breaking Red Grange's Big Ten career record.



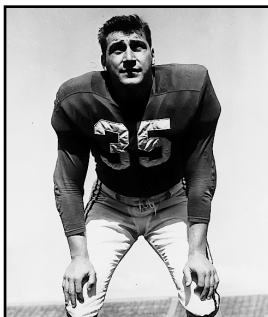
After leading Minnesota to two consecutive AP national titles, halfback Bruce Smith won the Heisman Trophy following the 1941 season. Smith led the 1941 Golden Gophers in rushing, passing and punting.



After being granted a fourth year of eligibility during World War II, Ohio State dental student Les Horvath ran and passed the undefeated Buckeyes to a Big Ten title and a No. 2 national ranking, and won the 1944 Heisman Trophy.



At 5-9, 185 pounds, halfback Vic Janowicz of Ohio State led the conference in rushing and scoring. He won the 1950 Heisman Trophy and was also named conference MVP and UPI Player of the Year.



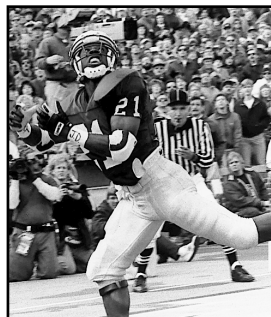
Wisconsin fullback Alan "The Horse" Ameche, a two-time All-American, won the 1954 Heisman Trophy. In 1951, Ameche became the first freshman in conference history to lead the league in rushing.



Ohio State halfback Howard "Hopalong" Cassady led the Buckeyes to the 1954 national championship and consecutive Big Ten crowns. He won the 1955 Heisman while being named Player of the Year by Walter Camp, Maxwell and UPI.



Ohio State halfback Archie Griffin won the Heisman Trophy in 1974 and '75, the award's only two-time winner. Griffin was the all-time Big Ten rushing leader with 5,589 yards—a mark that stood until 1999. His 31 consecutive 100-yard games set an NCAA record.



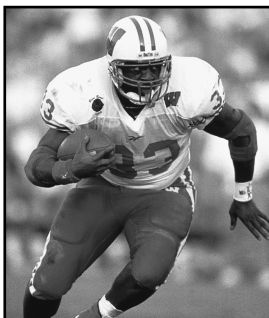
Receiver Desmond Howard won the 1991 Heisman Trophy for conference champion Michigan. In 1991, Howard set an NCAA record by catching a TD pass in 10 consecutive games.



Tailback Eddie George became the fifth Buckeye to win the Heisman Trophy in 1995. George led the country with 12.1 points per game and reeled off 12 consecutive 100-yard games en route to setting school records in rushing and receptions by a running back.



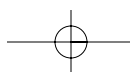
In 1997, Michigan cornerback Charles Woodson picked up the Big Ten's 13th Heisman Trophy and became the first predominantly defensive player to ever claim the award. Woodson recorded eight interceptions in 1997 and 18 in his career.



Wisconsin's Ron Dayne earned the Big Ten's 14th Heisman Trophy in 1999. The national consensus Player of the Year and two-time Rose Bowl MVP set the NCAA career yardage mark with 6,397 yards.



Quarterback Troy Smith collected Ohio State's seventh Heisman Trophy in 2006 after leading the Buckeyes to a perfect regular season. He set a school record with 30 touchdown passes while ending his career as the most efficient passer in Big Ten history.
