Illinois Men's Golf Wins Fourth Straight Big Ten Championship

Fighting Illini's Nick Hardy claims individual title with six-under par 204

BALTIMORE - Illinois won its fourth straight Big Ten Championship in men's golf after shooting a three-round score of 836 in the 2018 Big Ten Men's Golf Championships at Baltimore Country Club. The Fighting Illini, which won their 16th Big Ten title and ninth in the last 10 years, also earned the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Championship.

The Fighting Illini were followed by second-place Ohio State (851), Iowa in third place (857), Penn State (860) in fourth and Northwestern (863) in fifth.

Illinois' Nick Hardy won the individual Big Ten title, shooting a six-under par 204 (69-68-67). Penn State's Cole Miller finished in second place (206), followed by Northwestern's Dylan Wu in third (210) and Ohio State's Will Grimmer in fourth (211). Illinois' Bryan Baumgarten and Michael Feagles, along with Maryland's David Kocher tied for fifth place with a score of 212. All seven players earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Championships team.

Michigan's Kyle Mueller was honored with the Big Ten's Les Bolstad Award, given to the conference player with the lowest stroke average (70.3214) during the 2017-18 season.

SECOND ROUND RECAP

Illinois Takes Lead After Two Rounds at Big Ten Championships

Penn State's Cole Miller heads into final round atop individual leaderboard

BALTIMORE - Illinois claimed the lead the 2018 Big Ten Men's Golf Championships after two rounds at Baltimore Country Club. The Fighting Illini fired a 12-under par 268 on Saturday, and at 11-under par for the tournament, takes a one-stroke lead into Sunday's final round. Ohio State (-10) finished the day in second place, while Iowa and Penn State are tied for third at three over. Northwestern (+8) sits in fifth place.

The Penn State's Cole Miller took over the individual lead at seven-under par after shooting a five-under 65 on Saturday. Ohio State's Will Voetsch (-4) jumped 17 spots up the leaderboard and sits in second following a second-round score of 64. Five students are currently tied for third at three-under par.

Tee times for Sunday's final round begin at 8 a.m. ET.

Ohio State Leads After Day One of Big Ten Men's Golf Championships

Buckeyes own two stroke lead following 18 holes of action at Baltimore Country Club

BALTIMORE - Ohio State owns a two-stroke lead over the field after carding an opening-round total of one-under par 279 on Friday in the Big Ten Men's Golf Championships at Baltimore Country Club. Illinois sits in second place after firing a team total of 281, followed by third-place Penn State (284), Northwestern in fourth place (285) and fifth-place Maryland (287).

Michigan's Charlie Pilon, Ohio State's Jeg Coughlin III and Wisconsin's Sam Anderson are all tied for first place after firing an opening round 67 (-3). Penn State's Cole Miller and Rutgers' Christopher Gotterup share fourth are tied for fourth at two-under par.

Second-round action from Baltimore Country Club will get underway on Saturday morning at 9 a.m. ET.

Fighting Illini look to defend title at Baltimore Country Club this weekend

ROSEMONT, ILL. - The 2018 Big Ten Men's Golf Championships are set to take place this weekend in Baltimore, Md. The 54-hole competition will get underway on Friday, with first-round action beginning at 9 a.m. ET. The second round will begin at 9 a.m. on Saturday, with the final round slated for 8 a.m. on Sunday. The championships will be held at the 7,181-yard, par-70 trek at Baltimore Country Club's Five Farms East Course.

Twelve top-15 finishers from last season's Big Ten Championships return to this year's event, including Illinois' Dylan Meyer (1), Nick Hardy (T6) and Giovanni Tadiotto (T10), Indiana's Jake Brown (T10), Maryland's David Kocher (T4), Northwestern's Ryan Lumsden (T2) and Dylan Wu (9), Ohio State's Will Grimmer (T2), Penn State's Charles Huntzinger (T4) and Cole Miller (T6), Purdue's Timmy Hildebrand (T10) and Wisconsin's Jordan Hahn (T14).

Four Big Ten teams are ranked among the top 50 according to the latest Golfweek/Sagarin national rankings. Illinois leads the way at No. 14, followed by No. 36 Penn State, No. 38 Northwestern and No. 39 Purdue.

Illinois claimed its 15th Big Ten Championship last season after shooting a Big Ten Championships record three-round score of 829. The Fighting Illini were followed by second-place Northwestern (845), Ohio State in third place (855) and Iowa, Penn State and Purdue, which all tied for fourth-place with a tally of 858.
