## **GAME NOTES**

## **IOWA TEAM NOTES**

- With an 83-66 win over Nebraska, Iowa advanced to its seventh Big Ten Tournament championship game
  in program history, and its third in the last four years. Iowa has also appeared in the Big Ten Tournament
  championship in 1997, 2001, 2010, 2014, 2019, and 2021. The Hawkeyes were Big Ten Tournament
  champions in 1997, 2001 and 2019.
- Iowa has now won six straight games, which is a season-high for the program.
- With the win, Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder tied former Indiana and Purdue Head Coach Sharon Versyp for the most career wins by a head coach at the Big Ten Tournament (25). Bluder is now 25-19 in her career at the Big Ten Tournament.
- Sophomore Caitlin Clark finished the evening with 41 points, marking her fourth 40-plus point game of the year. Clark's showing against the Huskers stands as the fourth-highest single-game scoring performance in Big Ten Tournament history. Clark is the fourth player in Big Ten Tournament history to score 40-plus points in a single game.
- Iowa now has three of the top-four single-game scoring performances in Big Ten Tournament history (Megan Gustafson, 48 vs Minnesota in 2018; Gustafson 45 vs Maryland 2019).
- Senior Monika Czinano scored 22 points in the win. It was the second time this year that Clark has scored 40+ points while Czinano has subsequently scored 20+ points in the same game. (1/31 vs Ohio State; Clark 43 points, Czinano 23 points).

## **NEBRASKA TEAM NOTES**

- Junior Jaz Shelley finished her 2022 Big Ten Tournament run with 14 made three-pointers, which sits
  alone for second in Big Ten Tournament history. Shelley was one three-pointer shy of matching the
  conference's single Big Ten Tournament record of 15 threes by Kelly Mazzante (Penn State) in 2002.
- Three Huskers scored double figures in the loss. Isabelle Bourne led Nebraska with 16 points while Sam Haiby and Shelley both finished with 15 points.
