### GAME NOTES

#### INDIANA TEAM NOTES

- The Hoosiers moved on to the Big Ten Tournament championship game for just the second time in program history with a 70-62 win over No. 1 Ohio State. Indiana last made the Big Ten Tournament title game in 2002, when the Hoosiers defeated Penn State 75-72
- Graduate student Nicole Cardaño-Hillary finished with 16 points and 11 rebounds. It was her first double-double of the year and the sixth of her collegiate career. Her performance today marked the fifth time this season that Cardaño-Hillary has led Indiana in rebounding in a game
- Sophomore guard Chloe Moore-McNeil matched a career high of 11 points, all of which came in the first half of the win. McNeil has reached double-figure scoring in four of her last six outings
- Graduate student Ali Patberg scored 13 of her 15 points in the first half of Saturday's win, while shooting 5-for-6 (83.3 pct.) during that stretch
- The Hoosiers had a balanced attack throughout the game, finishing with five double-figure scorers. The last time Indiana had five players score double figures was earlier this year in their regular-season finale on Feb. 25 at Maryland.
- Mackenzie Holmes, 12 points, and Grace Berger, 10, also scored in double figures against the Buckeyes

#### OHIO STATE TEAM NOTES

- Jacy Sheldon and Taylor Mikesell both scored in double figures against Indiana, marking the 27th time this year each has scored in double figures in a single game
- Sheldon, who ranks third in the Big Ten in field goal percentage, shot 10-for-19 from the field (52.6 pct.) in Saturday's loss
