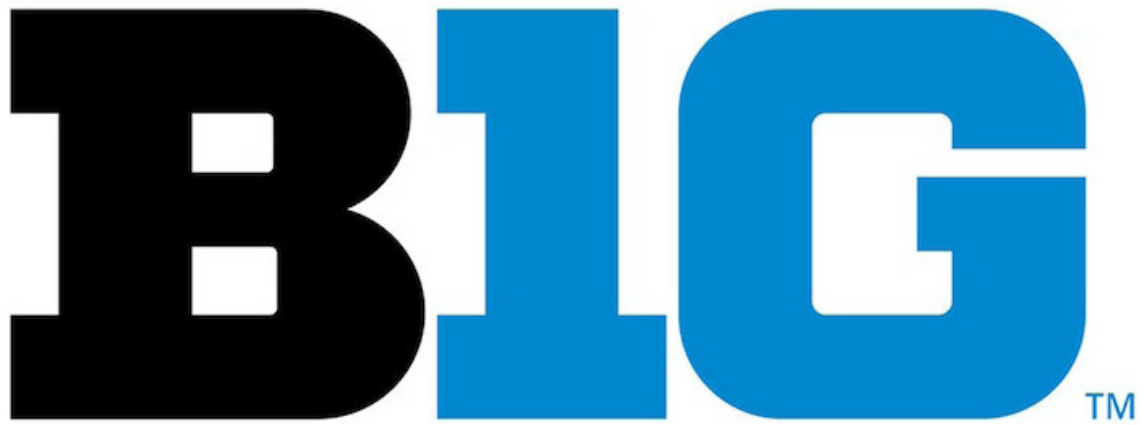

Weekly Awards

Big Ten Hockey Three Stars of the Week are chosen by a vote of the Big Ten Communications staff from nominations supplied by the schools' communications offices. The Big Ten office will announce weekly hockey award winners on Tuesdays.

Postseason Awards

In hockey, coaches and a media panel choose All-Conference teams (first, second, honorable mention and All-Freshman) and five individual awards (Coach of the Year, Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Goaltender of the Year) as well as a Big Ten Scoring Champion (awarded to the player with the most total points in conference games only). The Big Ten also names one Sportsmanship Award honoree from each institution. These students become candidates for the Big Ten Outstanding Sportsmanship Award, as the conference honors one male and one female from each institution at the end of the school year. Academic All-Big Ten teams are named for every sport. The teams are composed of all students who have been enrolled fulltime at the institution for a minimum of 12 months and carry a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher. The conference office also presents the Distinguished Scholar Award at the end of each academic year. To be eligible for selection, students must be a recipient of Academic All-Big Ten Recognition in the previous academic year, must be enrolled for the entire previous academic year and earned a minimum GPA of 3.7 or higher for the current academic year, excluding summer school.

BIG TEN CONFERENCE HISTORY

Known as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten is home to a lineage of legendary names and an ongoing tradition of developing strong leaders. Even in its infancy, the conference established itself as the preeminent collection of institutions in the nation, where the pursuit of academic excellence prevailed as the definitive goal.

The history of the Big Ten traces back more than 125 years to the Palmer House hotel in Chicago, where on January 11, 1895, then-Purdue president James H. Smart and leaders from the University of Chicago, University of Illinois, University of Michigan, University of Minnesota, Northwestern University and University of Wisconsin set out to organize and develop principles for the regulation of intercollegiate athletics.

At that meeting, a blueprint for the administration of college athletics under the direction of appointed faculty representatives was outlined. The presidents' first known action "restricted eligibility for athletics to bonafide, full-time students who were not delinquent in their studies." That important legislation, along with other legislation that would follow in the coming years, served as the primary building block for intercollegiate athletics.

On February 8, 1896, one faculty member from each of those seven universities met at the same Palmer House and officially established the mechanics of the conference, which was officially incorporated as the "Intercollegiate Conference Athletic Association" in 1905.

Indiana University and the State University of Iowa became the eighth and ninth members in 1899. In 1908, Michigan briefly withdrew its membership, and in 1912 Ohio State University joined the conference, bringing its membership total back to nine. Upon Michigan's return in 1917, the conference was first referred to as the "Big Ten" by media members, and that name was eventually incorporated in 1987.

As the 1900s opened, faculty representatives established rules for intercollegiate athletics that were novel for the time. As early as 1904, the faculty approved legislation that required eligible athletes to meet entrance requirements and to have completed a full year's work, along with having one year of residence.

In 1901, the first Big Ten Championship event was staged when the outdoor track and field championships were held at the University of Chicago. The debut event marked what is now a staple of conference competition. Today, the Big Ten sponsors 28 official sports, 14 for men and 14 for women, including the addition of men's ice hockey and men's and women's lacrosse over the last four years. Big Ten schools compete in a total of 42 different sports, furthering the conference's commitment to broad-based programming and providing more participation opportunities than any conference in the country.

One of the conference's proudest traditions began in 1902 when Michigan took on Stanford in the Rose Bowl, the nation's first bowl game. Big Ten teams only appeared in Pasadena twice before the conference signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl game with permanent conference affiliations. But Michigan's appearance in 1902 cultivated a relationship that has endured for more than a century. In January 2014, Michigan State defeated Stanford in the 100th Rose Bowl Game.

Coupling the academic goals set forth by the leaders of the charter members of the conference and their steadfast commitment to athletics, the conference instituted the Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915. It is awarded annually by each conference institution to a student of the graduating class who has attained the greatest proficiency in scholarship and athletics. For more than 100 years, it has been the most prestigious honor a student competing in Big Ten athletics can receive.

In 1922, Major John L. Griffith became the conference's first "Commissioner of Athletics." Griffith was the first of six men to assume the role of commissioner in the conference's history, followed by Kenneth L. "Tug" Wilson in 1945, Bill Reed in 1961, Wayne Duke in 1971, Jim Delany in 1989, and current commissioner Kevin Warren in 2020.

After nearly 30 years with 10 members, the conference consolidated to nine schools when the University of Chicago formally withdrew its membership in 1946. Michigan State College (now Michigan State University) was added to the Big Ten three years later, bringing the number of affiliated conference schools to 10 once again.

In 1955, the Big Ten formulated a revenue-sharing model designed to pool all football television rights of its members and share those proceeds equally. The conference and its members continue to utilize a revenue-sharing model, dividing media rights, bowl payouts and other profits among all conference institutions.

While academics have always played an integral role in the conference, presidents of the Big Ten member institutions formalized the primacy of academics with the establishment of the Big Ten Academic Alliance (formerly the Committee on Institutional Cooperation) in 1958. The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all Big Ten universities. Annually, the schools currently constituting the Big Ten Academic Alliance produced over \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

In one of Duke's first actions as commissioner, he oversaw the adoption of the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, designed to study conference programs and make suggestions which would further Big Ten objectives. The Advisory Commission enlists former students that competed in Big Ten athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

In 1981, the conference presidents and chancellors endorsed a proposal that enabled universities to affiliate their women's intercollegiate programs with the conference, and the first conference championships for women were staged that fall. The Big Ten was the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

In December of 1989, the conference agreed in principle to invite Pennsylvania State University for membership. On June 4, 1990, the Council of Presidents officially voted to integrate Penn



State into the conference, giving the Big Ten 11 members. In 2004, the Big Ten implemented a pilot program of instant replay for college football. Following the season, the conference forwarded replay proposals to the NCAA regarding the future use of instant replay, where it approved country-wide testing in 2005. In 2006, the NCAA approved the use of instant replay for all conferences.

In 2006, Delany announced the creation of the first conference-owned television network, a 20-year agreement with FOX Networks to create what would become the Big Ten Network (BTN). Launched on Aug. 30, 2007, BTN now produces more than 1,800 events across all platforms each year. BTN is in almost 60 million homes in the U.S. and Canada via the nation's major video providers and more than 300 additional video providers across the country. BTN is also available through the majority of OTT providers, and via the Fox Sports App, which delivers live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. In addition, the BTN+ platform streams hundreds of events each season.

On June 11, 2010, the Big Ten Council of Presidents/Chancellors (COP/C) approved a formal membership application by the University of Nebraska, expanding the conference to 12 institutions. Nebraska officially joined the Big Ten on July 1, 2011.

The conference expanded its footprint further in 2012 when the COP/C approved formal membership applications from the University of Maryland and Rutgers University on November 19 and 20, respectively. Maryland and Rutgers became official Big Ten members on July 1, 2014, giving the conference almost 9,500 students participating in intercollegiate athletics and more than 11,000 participation opportunities on 350 teams.

On June 3, 2013, the Big Ten announced that Johns Hopkins University had been accepted as the conference's first sport affiliate member. Johns Hopkins' addition in men's lacrosse gave the Big Ten six institutions sponsoring the sport, allowing the debut of men's lacrosse as an official conference sport and building on the Big Ten's tradition of broad-based sports competition. On June 17, 2015, the conference announced that Johns Hopkins was accepted as a sport affiliate member for women's lacrosse beginning with the 2016-17 academic year. On March 23, 2016, the conference announced that Notre Dame would be joining the Big Ten for men's ice hockey beginning with the 2017-18 academic year.

Since opening in the fall of 2013, the Big Ten conference center hosts more than 300 meetings annually for member institutions, Big Ten Academic Alliance (formerly CIC) related committees and coaches' groups. The headquarters also features an interactive digital museum — the Big Ten Experience — which brings the conference's storied academic and athletic history to life. In June 2014, the Big Ten opened a second office in New York City, featuring both office and meeting space in Midtown Manhattan. Big Ten staff members are based in the New York City office to provide expanded coverage and service, while other conference and institutional administrators utilize the space as necessary when conducting business on the East Coast. The Big Ten and its member institutions also have access to satellite office space in Washington, D.C.

Warren and his staff work to meet the educational needs of student-athletes to allow them to excel in all areas of their lives. The conference office manages 27 different championships and tournaments, offers legislative and compliance services, oversees the production and distribution of more than 2,000 events annually, provides staff services to coaching and administrative personnel, and remains a vital resource for media and fans seeking information on the Big Ten.

During his first year, Warren has helped spark a number of groundbreaking conference initiatives. On March 7, 2020, in advance of the rising tide of the COVID-19 pandemic, the conference partnered with all 14 of its member institutions to create the Big Ten Task Force for Emerging Infectious Diseases. This group was formed to provide counsel and sound medical advice to ensure the health, safety and wellness of the Big Ten's students, coaches, administrators and fans. It includes representatives from a diverse set of disciplines across campus healthcare systems and schools of public health and their input serves as a resource for the conference in making important decisions based on information received from local, state and federal health departments, along with the NCAA.

Less than two months later on May 4, 2020, the conference announced the formation of the Big Ten Mental Health and Wellness Cabinet, featuring representation from all 14 member institutions, as well as sport affiliate members Johns Hopkins (men's and women's lacrosse) and Notre Dame (men's ice hockey). The goal of the cabinet is to promote optimal mental health for Big Ten student-athletes through a comprehensive, systemic and interdisciplinary approach to establishing mental health programs, while also providing counsel, advice and expertise to the conference office.

Following the death of Minneapolis resident George Floyd, Warren penned an open letter on June 1, 2020, announcing the formation of what became known as the Big Ten Equality Coalition. This group, which features student-athletes, coaches, athletic directors, chancellors, presidents and other members of the Big Ten family from all 14 member institutions, has a stated goal of seeking tangible ways to actively and constructively combat racism and hate around the world, while also empowering student-athletes to express their rights to free speech and peaceful protest.

A product of the conversations emerging from the coalition was the creation of the Big Ten Voter Registration Initiative. This non-partisan, conference-wide collaboration encourages student-athletes to take part in the electoral process and is led by a Voter Registration Committee that includes representatives from all 14 Big Ten institutions. The Voter Registration Committee has partnered with the National Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights Under Law to develop educational programming and outreach tools, and to collaborate with other established civic platforms.

More than 125 years after its inception, the Big Ten remains a national leader in intercollegiate athletics on and off the field. Big Ten programs have combined to win more than 450 team and 1,800 individual national championships, consistently taking home individual honors for athletic and academic accomplishments and fulfilling the Big Ten's mission of academic achievement and athletic success.

Since its inception in 1896, the pursuit and attainment of academic excellence has been a priority for every Big Ten member institution. But maintaining the conference's standard of competing at the highest level in athletics also endures as an important component of the Big Ten experience. Striking that balance between academics and athletics is integral to the Big Ten's identity. Recognized as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten strives for success from its students not only on the field and in the classroom, but around the world as well.

PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 70 universities in the nation according to the 2022 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including six in the top 30.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,900 Academic All-Americans, including 48 honorees during the 2021-22 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least five national championships in 24 of the last 28 years, averaging nearly seven per year during that span.

Since the 2005-06 academic year, current Big Ten institutions have claimed 109 team national championships in 26 different sports.

BROAD-BASED PROGRAMMING

The Big Ten will administer more than \$240 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on 350 teams in 42 different sports.

The Big Ten sponsors 28 official conference sports, 14 for men and 14 for women, including the addition of men's ice hockey and men's and women's lacrosse in this decade.

The Big Ten leads the nation in total students competing in intercollegiate athletics and participation opportunities, and sponsors more official sports than all conferences except the Ivy League.

More than 1,500 Big Ten competitors have participated in the Olympics, winning more than 500 medals, including more than 200 gold. The Big Ten Conference enjoyed its finest performance at a single Olympic Games during the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, Japan, as athletes with Big Ten ties set conference records by earning 51 total medals and 22 gold medals during the 17-day competition. All 14 Big Ten member schools had an athlete win at least one medal in Tokyo, also a first in conference history. Big Ten Olympians collected nearly 80 medals in the most recent games in PyeongChang and Beijing.

PASSIONATE FOLLOWING

The Big Ten leads all conferences with 6.4 million alumni and nearly 580,000 students.

Each year more than 11 million patrons attend Big Ten home contests, as the conference has led the nation in attendance for men's basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and wrestling.

LEADERS IN INNOVATION

Took part in the nation's first bowl game, winning the 1902 Rose Bowl Game, and signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl with permanent conference affiliations.

Awarded the first Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915, honoring outstanding seniors who demonstrated excellence in academics and athletics.

Formed the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, enlisting former students that competed in conference athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

Became the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

Implemented the first collegiate football system of instant replay in 2004, which the NCAA approved for use among all conferences in 2006.

Launched the Big Ten Network (BTN) in 2007, the first national conference-owned television network.

Began partnering with the Ivy League to study the effects of head injuries in sports in 2012.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 2,000 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada, and is also available via the Fox Sports App, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. B1G+ streams hundreds of additional events each season.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 30 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.

COMMISSIONER KEVIN WARREN



The Big Ten Conference Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) voted unanimously on June 4, 2019, to select Mr. Kevin Warren as the sixth Commissioner in conference history. Commissioner Warren joins an esteemed lineage of Big Ten Conference Commissioners, beginning with John Griffith (1922-45), Tug Wilson (1945-61), Bill Reed (1961-71), Wayne Duke (1971-89) and Jim Delany (1989-2020).

On January 2, 2020, Commissioner Warren officially began his tenure with the Big Ten Conference. The overarching mission of the Commissioner is to respect the tradition of the conference, protect the conference, and positively transform the conference.

Commissioner Warren secured groundbreaking media rights agreements with the linear networks CBS, NBC, FOX and the direct-to-consumer streaming platform, Peacock on August 18, 2022. The seven-year media rights agreements will begin July 1, 2023, and provide fans with unprecedented access and Big Ten football, women's and men's basketball, and Olympic sports student-athletes with greater exposure than any other collegiate sports conference in history. Beginning in the fall of 2023, Big Ten football will dominate Saturdays, on the largest broadcast platforms from morning to night, with FOX at Noon ET, CBS at 3:30 p.m. ET and NBC in primetime. With the addition of the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) and the University of Southern California (USC) in August 2024, the conference, its student-athletes and member institutions will reach the broadest audience in the country, coast-to-coast, including the top three media markets in the country in New York, Los Angeles and Chicago. These landmark media rights agreements are the most comprehensive and lucrative in all of college sports and further strengthen the tradition and power of the Big Ten Conference.

On August 9, 2022, Commissioner Warren formed the Big Ten Foundation to further the commitment of the conference to serve its member institutions' communities through charitable giving and volunteerism. The Big Ten Foundation is committed to empowering young people with the educational resources and tools they need to build responsible and balanced lifestyles. The Big Ten Conference Foundation will initially provide grants to nonprofits in the Big Ten Conference footprint that aligns with its initial goals to encourage, educate and empower students in the areas of academics, life-skills, and physical and mental wellbeing. The conference is currently working internally and externally to build the Foundation's organizational structure and best-practices, establish its full board, appoint an executive director and complete its strategic plan for grant making by the end of 2022. The proposed timeline to begin carrying out grant making programs is in 2023.

To position the conference and its member institutions for added growth and sustainability, in July of 2022, Commissioner Warren and Big Ten Network (BTN) President François McGillicuddy announced the creation of Big Ten Corporate Partnerships (BTCP), a dedicated team to lead the conference's league-level corporate sponsorships and partner activations. The in-house BTCP team will offer holistic corporate sponsorships, innovative partnership activations, television and digital media inventory, and creative advertising opportunities associated with the league-level events and VIP fan experiences during conference championships and tournaments.

The direct sponsorship offerings will provide premier brands a 360-degree approach with assets that include impactful linear and digital media inventory, on-site promotional activation, in-venue signage, official designations, and corporate hospitality.

Commissioner Warren disrupted the status quo on June 30, 2022, when he announced the Big Ten Conference COP/C had voted unanimously to admit the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and the University of Southern California (USC) into the Big Ten Conference effective August 2, 2024. The expansion increases the footprint of the conference across the three largest media markets, [New York, Los Angeles, Chicago], in the United States. The 2022 expansion continues the conference's legacy of transformation and innovation. UCLA and USC competition will begin for all conference sports in the 2024-25 academic year.

To solidify the leadership position of the Big Ten Conference in the changing landscape of collegiate athletics, in June of 2022, Commissioner Warren formed the Big Ten Palmer House Task Force. The Task Force is named after the iconic Palmer House Hotel where seven university presidents met in 1895 to form the Big Ten Conference. The Big Ten Palmer House Task Force is presently assessing collegiate athletic models to actualize the best courses of action to further innovate the collective mission of intercollegiate athletics under the umbrella of higher education.

The Big Ten Palmer House Task Force, in consultation with the COP/C, consists of Commissioner Warren, conference and campus leadership and experts in the fields of finance, governance, legal, legislation, policy, and communications. The Task Force is evaluating, organizing, and synthesizing information to create new collegiate athletics models that position the conference and its student-athletes for continued growth and success. Model evaluations include student-athlete welfare and support; sustainable governance and decision-making; scheduling, divisions, expansion, and realignment; student-athlete benefits and fiscal resources; equality and equity in sports.

In June of 2022, Commissioner Warren alongside conference leadership committed to the formation of the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory and Advocacy Committee (BTAAC). The BTAAC is a conference-wide working group dedicated to fortifying student-athlete voices in collegiate athletic matters that interest and impact them.

Initial student-athlete related dialogue will include health, welfare and safety; benefits and fiscal resources; governance and decision-making; proposed legislation; equality and equity in sports. Constructive communication between student-athletes and conference administration and will nurture open exchanges of ideas, advanced information sharing and meaningful recommendations on issues important to student-athletes.

Commissioner Warren instituted the Big Life Series in 2022, a collection of events to provide conference student-athletes with transformational and educational experiences. In July of 2022, the Commissioner led a delegation of student-athletes and administrators from its member institutions to Selma and Montgomery, Alabama, for an immersive experience entitled: Big Life Series: Selma to Montgomery. The pilgrimage to one of the key centers of the civil rights movement was highlighted by a march across the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, which is the site of the 1965 Bloody Sunday attack. The delegation also visited the Montgomery Interpretive Center on the campus of Alabama State University to learn more about the profound impact that students had on the civil rights movement, and the significance of the Knight vs. Alabama landmark trial which ended the segregation of funding in higher education across the State of Alabama.

To honor George Taliaferro, a pioneer in the 1940s for diversity and inclusion as a player at Indiana University and the first Black player to be drafted to the National Football League (NFL), Commissioner Warren created the George and Viola Taliaferro Fellowship. The fellowship provides individuals, who have not historically had access to collegiate conference office leadership positions, the opportunity to work in the office of the commissioner and gain valuable experience in both the sports and business sectors. In 2022, Commissioner Warren hired Adam Shibley, former football student-athlete and graduate from the University of Michigan and University of Notre Dame; Eriana Henderson, former track student-athlete and graduate from the University of Colorado; Eric Curry, former basketball student-athlete and graduate of the University of Minnesota; and Jaielyn Mason, former basketball student-athlete and graduate from Rutgers University and the University of Arkansas as the conference's first group of George and Viola Taliaferro fellows.

To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the passage of Title IX, Commissioner Warren held the first Big Ten Women's Leadership Summit in June of 2022. The Summit was held at conference headquarters and welcomed more than 75 student-athletes, coaches, and administrators from its 14 member institutions. Guest speakers included four-time Olympian Jackie Joyner-Kersey, 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup Champion Tierna Davidson (now a member of the Chicago Red Stars of the National Women's Soccer League), ESPN broadcasters Sage Steele and Sarah Spain, plus Big Ten Network broadcasters Lisa Byington, Emily Ehman and Meghan McKeown. Other guest speakers included Katrina Adams (former professional tennis player and CEO of the United States Tennis Association, and current chair of both the International Tennis Federation's Billie Jean King Cup and Gender Equality in Tennis committees), Dr. Wendy Borlabi (director of high performance and mental health for the NBA's Chicago Bulls), Lori Locust (assistant defensive line coach for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and Jennifer King (assistant running backs coach for the NFL's Washington Commanders) and Big Ten Conference trailblazers such as former Big Ten Conference Deputy Commissioner Diane Dietz, University of Iowa Deputy Director of Athletics/Senior Woman Administrator Barbara Burke, University of Maryland Head Field Hockey Coach Missy Meharg, University of Illinois Head Softball Coach Tyra Perry and former University of Minnesota Women's Swimming & Diving Coach Terry Ganley.

Commissioner Warren and the Big Ten Conference broke new ground when it held the inaugural and highly successful Big Ten Volleyball Media Days August 1-2, 2022, at Big Ten Network studios in Chicago. The Big Ten Conference became the first collegiate conference to host an in-person preseason volleyball media event, which serves as another example of the conference commitment to Title IX and elevating women's sports. In October 2021, Commissioner Warren took critical steps to build gender equity at Big Ten Conference Basketball Media Days in Indianapolis, where all 28 women's and men's basketball programs were represented on equal footing over a two-day period.

In December 2021, Commissioner Warren launched the Big Ten Conference sports data and analytics department to use data-driven insights for fan engagement, business growth and efficiencies, and to create new revenue streams. Commissioner Warren enlisted the Chief Executive Officer of Kraft Analytics Group (KAGR), Jessica C. Gelman, to provide consultation to the conference's c-suite as it builds its analytics strategies and evaluates growth opportunities for the conference and its 14 member institutions.

A founder of the MIT Sloan Sports Analytics Conference and KAGR, Ms. Gelman has a proven track record of delivering results by building high performance teams, identifying business challenges through analytics, and defining the path forward through data and technology.

In his first two years, Commissioner Warren watched the University of Michigan (2021-22) and The Ohio State University (2020-21) compete in the College Football Playoff (CFP). In 2021-22 Ohio State claimed victory over the University of Utah in the Rose Bowl Game to be one of four Big Ten Conference football teams that finished the season ranked in the final AP Top 25 poll. Three conference standouts took home national honors last season, while a total of 29 Big Ten Conference standouts from nine different schools earned All-America status, including 10 that earned first-team distinction from at least one organization. In the 2022 NFL Draft, 48 student-athletes from 13 Big Ten Conference universities were selected, tying for the most in Big Ten Conference history.

The 2021-22 Big Ten Women's Basketball season was one of the most successful in the history of the conference. For the second consecutive year, the Big Ten Conference tied a league record as four teams advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, with Michigan making program history by advancing to the Elite Eight. The 2021-22 Big Ten Conference Men's Basketball season was historic and could arguably be considered the best since conference play began in 1905.

For the first time since seeding the NCAA Tournament in 1979, the Big Ten Conference placed nine teams (the previous high mark was eight teams in 2019), including two No. 1 and two No. 2 seeds, tied for the most allotted to a single conference in Autonomy 5 history. The conference also placed three men's hockey teams into the 2022 NCAA Division I Championship. Additionally, three Big Ten Conference member institutions captured NCAA national championships in the 2021-22 academic year: University of Wisconsin (volleyball), Penn State University (wrestling), and University of Maryland (men's lacrosse).

The 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing provided Big Ten Conference student-athletes the opportunity to compete on the world's largest stage. Seven of the conference schools were represented, including 45 Olympians, six Olympic coaches or team staff members, and two alternate athletes. The competitors captured 28 medals, including seven gold, 19 silver and

two bronze. The 2021-22 campaign also marked the 41st year of women's athletics in the Big Ten Conference. The Big Ten Conference enjoyed its finest performance at a single Olympic Games at the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo (which took place in 2021), as athletes with Big Ten Conference ties set conference records by earning 51 total medals and 22 gold medals. All 14 Big Ten Conference member institutions had an athlete win at least one medal in Tokyo, also a first in conference history. Additionally, 30 Paralympians with Big Ten Conference ties collectively brought home 22 medals from Tokyo.

Prior to the 2021 sports season, Commissioner Warren created the Big Ten Mental Health and Wellness Cabinet. The Cabinet features representation from all 14 member institutions, as well as sport affiliate members Johns Hopkins University (men's and women's lacrosse) and the University of Notre Dame (men's ice hockey). The goal of the Mental Health and Wellness Cabinet is to improve student-athlete mental health through education, prevention, advocacy, mental health care, research, and policy development. The Cabinet launched a series of groundbreaking initiatives to address issues associated with mental health and wellness, social justice, voter registration and the COVID-19 pandemic.

Following the death of Minneapolis resident George Floyd in 2020, Commissioner Warren wrote an open letter announcing the formation of the Big Ten Equality Coalition to help eliminate racism and hate in society through inclusion, empowerment, and accountability. The United States Library of Congress selected Commissioner Warren's open letter for inclusion in its historic collection. The Equality Coalition features student-athletes, coaches, athletic directors, chancellors, presidents, and other members of the Big Ten Conference family from all 14 member institutions.

A product of the Equality Coalition was the creation of the Big Ten Voter Registration Initiative. The nonpartisan conference-wide collaboration encourages student-athletes to take part in the electoral process and is led by a Voter Registration Committee that includes representatives from all 14 Big Ten institutions.

During the progression of the COVID-19 pandemic, Commissioner Warren partnered with all 14 of its member institutions to create the Big Ten Task Force for Emerging Infectious Diseases in 2020. The Emerging Infectious Diseases Task Force members represent numerous disciplines across campus healthcare systems and schools of public health to provide counsel and sound medical advice to ensure the health, safety, and wellness of the conference's student-athletes, coaches, administrators, and fans.

The Big Ten Task Force for Emerging Infectious Diseases is a valuable resource when conference officials need to interpret local, state, and federal health department guidelines, as well as NCAA recommendations, to institute safety and wellness protocols.

After the Council of Presidents and Chancellors (COP/C) voted on August 11, 2020, to pause the Big Ten fall sports season due to growing medical concerns caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, Commissioner Warren and the COP/C established the Return to Competition (Task Force). The Task Force researched and prepared for the safe resumption of sports. On September 16, 2020, the COP/C and the conference announced they had adopted stringent medical protocols to resume football October 23-24, 2020. The decision was based on the new medical information presented by the Task Force and positioned the conference as one of the most medically advanced in the country.

Commissioner Warren remains focused on the long-term vision of the Big Ten Conference without losing sight of immediate needs. The Commissioner is thoughtfully modernizing the conference while providing strong and compassionate leadership to conference staff, member institutions, partners, and other constituents. Commissioner Warren continues to restructure the conference office to enhance its efficiency and commitment to gender and racial equity and diversity.

Commissioner Warren streamlined the conference's infrastructure, modernized organizational structures and policies and procedures with strategic wisdom and financial acumen. The conference filled critical senior roles that had previously been outsourced or not developed. Commissioner Warren hired the conference's first Chief Sports Officer (CSO), Diana Sabau, who also serves as the deputy commissioner. He engaged the conference's first Chief Information Officer (CIO), Nate Schnader and hired the conference's first Vice President of Women's Basketball, Megan Kahn. Commissioner Warren developed the conference's first in-house human resources and legal departments and hired Anil Gollahalli as general counsel to represent the conference legal matters.

Commissioner Warren remains dedicated to building an authentic culture and taking proactive steps to strengthen accountability and inclusion across the entire Big Ten Conference footprint. The conference implemented a new performance management plan to increase communication and transparency, streamline efficiency and accountability and provide fairness for all staff. The conference also launched a multitude of leadership training initiatives, equipping the internal team with the tools necessary to create a more positive, productive, and sustainable workplace.

Prior to serving as Big Ten Conference Commissioner, Kevin Warren served as the chief operating officer (COO) for the National Football League's Minnesota Vikings, where he had worked since 2005. He was the highest ranking African American executive working on the business side for a team in the NFL, and the first African American COO in NFL history.

Mr. Warren's extensive experience in all facets of the Minnesota Vikings' organization created the perfect foundation for him to lead business operations. After being promoted to COO, Mr. Warren played a critical role in all business, financial, legal, and operational aspects related to U.S. Bank Stadium and was involved in the design, construction, business, legal, and operational components of the new stadium and which ultimately hosted Super Bowl XLII. Mr. Warren also played a key role in the design, development, and planning of Twin Cities Orthopedics Performance Center, the Vikings headquarters in Eagan, Minnesota, in addition to the ancillary real estate development of Viking Lakes. Under Mr. Warren's visionary leadership, the Vikings restructured the organization, with an emphasis on broadening the executive team and promoting women to key executive positions.

During his 21 seasons in the NFL, and 15 with the Vikings, Mr. Warren directed the team's focus on creating departmental synergy and collaboration, increasing financial profitability for the franchise, improving communication, developing leadership initiatives, implement-

ing a platform focusing on a positive community impact through the new Minnesota Vikings Foundation, launching a women's initiative program, creating an elevated fan experience, and building a world-class franchise focused on the tenets of hard work, ethics, financial profitability, community service, and a "best-in-class" mentality.

In September 2013, Mr. Warren's reputation and NFL experience were recognized when he was named a member of the NFL Committee on Workplace Diversity, which is committed to enhancing and promoting diversity at every level of the NFL. In February of 2017, during Super Bowl LI festivities in Houston, Mr. Warren was honored with the Texas Southern University Pioneer Award, recognizing his groundbreaking role as an NFL executive and his commitment to championing diversity. Mr. Warren was also honored as a member of the Sports Business Journal 2019 Champions class.

Prior to joining the Vikings, Mr. Warren worked for the international law firm of Greenberg Traurig from 2003 to 2005, playing a critical leadership role with the Wilf Ownership Group deal team during the acquisition of the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, he spent two seasons (2001-03) with the Detroit Lions as Senior Vice President of Business Operations & General Counsel and four seasons (1997-2001) with the St. Louis Rams as Vice President of Football Administration, and Vice President of Player Programs and Legal Counsel. Mr. Warren was an integral part of the Rams' organization when they won Super Bowl XXXIV over the Tennessee Titans in January of 2000.

Prior to joining the St. Louis Rams, Mr. Warren worked with Mike Slive and Mike Glazier at a law firm specializing in representation of universities charged with NCAA violations. He also worked as a sports and entertainment attorney/agent representing various professional athletes, entertainers, and broadcasters as the founder of Kevin Warren and Associates.

An avid student-athlete, Mr. Warren enrolled at the University of Pennsylvania, where he was a member of the Quakers' Ivy League championship basketball team in 1982. He then completed his undergraduate education at Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona, where he excelled both in the classroom and on the basketball court. Mr. Warren scored 1,118 points during his career at Grand Canyon and earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors as a senior along with NAIA Academic All-America honors and NAIA District 7 Basketball Team honors as both a junior and senior. Mr. Warren was inducted into the GCU Athletics Hall of Fame in March of 2012, the 16th individual inducted and only the fifth basketball player to earn the prestigious honor in the university's history.

Mr. Warren earned his Bachelor's in Business Administration from Grand Canyon University in 1986, his MBA from Arizona State University in 1988, and his Juris Doctorate degree from the University of Notre Dame School of Law in 1990. Mr. Warren is a licensed attorney with the State Bar of Kansas, Michigan, and the District of Columbia.

Several members of Mr. Warren's family have helped fuel his life-long passion for academics and sports, including his father, the late Dr. Morrison Warren, Sr., who had a successful career at Arizona State University as a Professor of Education and played professional football in 1948 for the Brooklyn Dodgers of the All-America Football Conference. The senior Mr. Warren would go on to be the first African American president of a major college bowl game when he was named president of the 1982 Fiesta Bowl Board of Directors and named one of Arizona State University's 50 Greatest Football Players. Mr. Warren's mother, Margaret Warren, served the community working with the youth of their town, as an elementary school librarian.

Philanthropy is an integral part of Mr. Warren's life, and he and his wife, Greta, remain active members of the Minneapolis-St. Paul community. In 2012, the Warren family "adopted" Lucy Craft Laney Community School in Minneapolis, which is predominantly African American and has 98% of its student population coming from underserved communities. The Warrens have donated over 5,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to Lucy Laney and other Twin Cities elementary schools. The Warren family has also purchased athletic and school uniforms for the boys' and girls' basketball teams and donated their time mentoring students.

In 2014, the Warrens created Carolyn's Comforts in conjunction with the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and have donated \$1 million to a pediatric emergency care fund to honor the legacy of his sister Carolyn Elaine Warren-Knox who passed away of brain cancer. Since its inception, nearly 800 financial grants have been made to families in need.

In 2017, the Warrens launched "No Doors Closed," a scholarship program selecting high school students from District 191, who will be first generation college students. Each student was awarded a four-year, \$5,000 per year academic scholarship to attend the institution of their choice. As of 2022, 12 students are attending college with the assistance of the Warren Foundation.

Mr. and Mrs. Warren also started The Warren Family Foundation in 2019. The nonprofit foundation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes. In 2020, the Warren Family Foundation partnered with The Dewey School of Excellence, an Academy of Urban School Leadership (AUSL) in Chicago, to provide resources ranging from after school programs, academic workshops, technology and school uniforms to emergency assistance funds.

ESPN presented Commissioner Warren the Legacy Award during the Igniting the Future Awards Gala on Saturday, June 18, 2022, during the Black Sports Business Symposium in Atlanta, Georgia, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The award commemorated one of the most impactful business builders and industry leaders. In November of 2021, the March of Dimes honored Commissioner Warren with its prestigious Sports Leadership Award.

The Warrens currently reside in Chicago and have two adult children— a daughter, Peri, and a son, Powers. Peri graduated Cum Laude from Occidental College in 2019, and in 2022, earned her Master of Science Degree in Leadership for Creative Enterprises from Northwestern University. Peri is currently working in public relations. Powers completed his undergraduate degree in 2021 in Kinesiology while playing football at Mississippi State University and is currently a football student-athlete completing his master's degree in Kinesiology at Michigan State University. Mr. Warren is a native of Tempe, Arizona.
