GAME NOTES

ILLINOIS TEAM NOTES

- The Fighting Illini moved past Wisconsin for the second time this year (68-47 win in Champaign, Jan. 9) and the 40th time in the history of the program. Illinois trails the all-time series with Wisconsin by a 40-41 margin
- It was Illinois' first win of the season away from home (0-10 heading into the postseason)
- The Fighting Illini snapped an 11-game skid with the win, with the most-recent Illinois win heading into the Big Ten Tournament coming on Jan. 9 over Wisconsin
- Head Coach Nancy Fahey has two career wins at the Big Ten Tournament, both of which are against her alma mater Wisconsin. Fahey has now led Illinois to wins over the Badgers in consecutive years at the Big Ten Tournament (67-42 win in 2021)
- The Fighting Illini recorded their first win of the season when trailing at the half (0-17 prior) after erasing a 33-30 halftime deficit
- Illinois shot a scorching 15-26 (57.7%) in the second half of the win
- The Fighting Illini set a new single-game Big Ten Tournament record (minimum of nine attempts) by shooting 75 percent (9-for-12) from behind the three-point arc. That record has stood since Northwestern shot 73.3 percent from three-point range on March 1, 1996
- Sophomore Kendall Bostic notched her sixth double-double of the season with 12 points and 16 rebounds
- Sophomore Erika Porter scored a career-high 15 points on 7-for-11 (63.6%) shooting
- Illinois' sophomore trio of Bostic, Porter and Aaliyah Nye combined for 44 points, which accounted for 58 percent of the team's scoring in the win

WISCONSIN TEAM NOTES

- Graduate student Katie Nelson broke her season-high with 27 points in the loss. Her previous season high was 24 points vs. Penn State on Jan. 23. The performance was just two points off her career-high, which she set while playing for Boston University under current Wisconsin Head Coach Marisa Mosely
- Freshman Halle Douglass scored in double figures for the 27th time in her rookie campaign, as she finished with 15 points and eight rebounds
- The Badgers dropped the contest despite scoring 22 points off Illini turnovers
