Michigan and Ohio State End Seasons in Regionals

Michigan and Ohio State concluded the 2005 campaign in regional action while both squads reached the 40-win plateau this season.

The Wolverines, seeded third in the Atlanta regional, opened postseason play with a narrow 6-5 defeat at the hands of second-seeded South Carolina before bouncing back to eliminate Furman, 6-3. In a rematch of the opener, the Gamecocks again pulled out a one-run triumph, 4-3, to knock Michigan out of the regional. The Wolverines ended the 2005 season with a League-best 42 victories, their most wins since posting 49 triumphs in 1989.

The Buckeyes, seeded fourth in the Corvallis regional, were edged by top-seed and No. 8 national seed Oregon State, as the Beavers pulled out a 4-3 win on their home field. Ohio State recovered to eliminate Virginia, 2-1, before ending their season with a 7-1 loss to St. John's. OSU wrapped up the 2005 campaign with its third Big Ten Tournament title in the last four seasons and 40 victories, as the program surpassed the 40-win mark for the third time in the last five years.

2005 NCAA Championship Notes

For the fourth time in the last six seasons, at least two Big Ten programs were selected to compete in the NCAA Baseball Championship as Michigan and Ohio State represented the League the 64-team field. The Wolverines were the No. 3 seed in the Atlanta, Georgia, regional while the Buckeyes earned the No. 4 seed in the Corvallis, Oregon, regional. The Big Ten last sent a pair of teams to the postseason in 2003 when Ohio State and Minnesota represented the League.

Michigan took part in the NCAA Championship for the first time since 1999 and the 18th time overall, which ranks second among all Big Ten programs to Minnesota (27 appearances). The Wolverines entered the NCAA Championship having won 13 of their last 16 games and produced 40 wins for the first time since 1989, when the program advanced to postseason for the seventh consecutive year.

Ohio State earned the League's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship after becoming the lowest-seeded team to win the Big Ten Tournament, as the fifth-seeded Buckeyes knocked off sixth-seeded Minnesota in the championship game on Sunday, May 29. OSU ended a one-year absence in the postseason as the program returned to the NCAA Championship for the third time in four seasons and 17th time overall, which ranks third among all Conference schools.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES
The Big Ten has produced six national championships in baseball by three teams: Michigan (1953, '62), Minnesota ('56, '60, '64) and Ohio State ('66).

The last Conference team to reach the College World Series was Michigan in 1984.

The last Big Ten squad to reach a super regional was Ohio State in 2003.

Ohio State has now made 11 trips to the NCAA Championship since 1990, as Minnesota ranks second over that time span with 10 appearances.

The eight other Big Ten teams have made eight combined appearances since 1990.

Minnesota tops all Conference teams with 27 NCAA Championship bids, followed by Michigan (18) and Ohio State (17).

Penn State has made 19 total NCAA appearances but only one (2000) since joining the Big Ten.

Michigan leads all Big Ten schools with 56 NCAA Championship wins and a .609 winning percentage (56-36).

Minnesota and Ohio State rate second and third among League schools in NCAA Championship wins with 49 and 39, respectively.

Noting Big Ten Baseball

Everybody's All-American: Big Ten Player of the Year and Illinois outfielder **Drew Davidson** was named a Third Team All-American by the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Davidson, who led the League with a .639 slugging percentage this season, was also second with 14 home runs and fifth with 53 RBI and 57 runs.

Freshman All-Americans: The Collegiate Baseball Newspaper also named the 2005 Louisville Slugger Freshmen All-American Team with two League players making the cut. Big Ten Freshman of the Year **Ryan Sontag**, an outfielder from Michigan State, was joined by Ohio State pitcher **Cory Luebke** among the top first-year players in the country. Sontag was a Second Team All-Big Ten honoree this season.

Four Big Ten Academic All-Americans: The Big Ten placed four student-athletes on the 2005 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America team announced on Tuesday, May 31, as Michigan was one of only five schools to place multiple players on the three teams. Indiana's **Ryan Parker** was a First Team All-America selection in the infield, Michigan's **Kyle Bohm** was a Second Team pick in the infield while Wolverines' outfielder **Matthew Butler** and Minnesota infielder **Andy Hunter** were Third Team selections. Michigan joined College of Charleston, Bowling Green, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Wichita State as the only schools with two honorees. Six Big Ten baseball student-athletes were named to the 2005 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams earlier in the year in two different districts. The honored players include Michigan's Bohm and Butler and Ohio State's **Cody Caughenbaugh** in District IV and Illinois' **Drew Davidson**, Indiana's Parker and Minnesota's Hunter from District V. All six student-athletes were First Team selections and were eligible for Academic All-America honors, as their names were added to the national bal-

lot. To be nominated for Academic All-District honors, a student-athlete must be a starter or key reserve and carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher. Team members are selected by a vote of members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) within the district.

Leaders at the Plate . . . : With the Big Ten season concluded, Illinois' **Dusty Bensko** became just the fifth player in school history to lead the Conference in home runs and runs batted in while Michigan State's **Troy Krider** became the first Spartan since 1988 to top all players in batting average. Bensko boosted the Illini to their first Big Ten Championship since 1998 by ranking first among all League standouts with nine home runs and 40 RBI, as the last Illinois player to lead the way in those categories was Josh Klimek with 12 long balls and 42 RBI in 1996. Bensko joins Klimek as only the second player in Conference annals to drive in 40 or more runs. Krider batted .405 in Big Ten play to lead all players, as the last MSU standout to top the League in batting average was Mike Davidson in 1988 (.440).

. . . and on the Mound: Iowa reliever **Tim Gudex** became the first Hawkeyes hurler since at least 1954 to lead the Conference in victories and ERA, while Penn State starter **Alan Stidfole** narrowly edged his twin brother Sean Stidfole to top the Big Ten in strikeouts. Gudex, who also tied for the League lead with six saves, produced a record of 7-1 and an ERA of 1.11 in 19 appearances to lead the way in both categories, as no other Iowa pitcher has accomplished that feat since ERA was first recorded in 1954. His 1.11 ERA is the lowest for any Big Ten hurler since Minnesota's Mike Pavelka produced a 1.08 ERA in 1987, as only two other Hawkeyes have boasted the League's lowest ERA -- Jim Koering in 1967 (0.69) and Bob Schauenberg in 1965 (0.28). The last Iowa hurler to top the Conference in victories was John DeJarlid with a 6-1 mark in 1990. Alan Stidfole recorded 54 strikeouts in 51 innings pitched, as teammate Sean ranked second with 49 K's in 53 innings of work. Alan Stidfole becomes just the second Nittany Lion hurler to top the League in strikeouts, as former PSU standout Nate Bump ranked first in K's in 1996 (with 48) and 1998 (74).

2005 Big Ten Tournament Review

Ohio State became the lowest-seeded team to win the Big Ten Tournament in an amazing week that featured upsets in eight of 11 games, two extra-inning contests (including the longest game in the event's history) and a walk-off home run to force a second championship tilt. The Buckeyes finally prevailed over sixth-seeded Minnesota on Sunday, May 29, to secure the League's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship, as Ohio State earned its seventh Big Ten Tournament title and third in the last four seasons.

The 2005 Big Ten Tournament was played from May 25-29 in Champaign, as top-seeded Illinois and second-seeded Purdue earned first-round byes. The first game on Wednesday set the tone for the Tournament, as Ohio State and No. 4 Michigan went 13 innings before deciding a winner, breaking the previous record of 12 innings played (most recently in 2000). The Buckeyes eventually pulled off the 7-3 victory, followed by Minnesota knocking off No. 3 Iowa,

14-7. The upsets continued on Thursday, as the Wolverines sent the Hawkeyes home with an 8-6 triumph. The top two seeds were also upset in their opening games, as OSU defeated the Boilermakers, 6-2, while the Gophers knocked off the host Illini, 11-8.

After five straight upsets, Purdue became the first higher seed to win a game as the No. 2

seed eliminated Michigan with a 9-7 victory on Friday. The Boilermakers followed up with another upset, knocking out top-seeded Illinois, 4-3, in 11 innings. In the winner's bracket, Ohio State picked up a 15-6 victory over Minnesota to remain unbeaten on the week.

The Gophers bounced back on Saturday with a 9-7 triumph over Purdue to set up a Minnesota-OHIO State championship game for the fourth straight season. The Buckeyes built a 3-2 lead in the game and looked to close out the Tournament, before Minnesota' Joe Maciej connected on a two-out, two-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth for a 4-3 triumph to force a second title game on Sunday. Ohio State jumped out to an early lead in that contest and eventually earned a 14-6 victory and the Big Ten Tournament crown. OSU outfielder Steve Caravati was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Tournament after setting a tourney record with 14 hits, including a three-for-three effort with four RBI in Sunday's final contest. He was joined on the All-Tournament team by three other Buckeyes, as the complete list appears below.

BIG TEN CHAMPION ILLINOIS CLAIMS PLAYER AND COACH OF THE YEAR HONORS

Michigan and Michigan State Garner Pitcher and Freshman of the Year Accolades

The Big Ten office announced the 2005 All-Big Ten Baseball Teams and individual honors on the eve of Conference Tournament play, as three schools split the individual postseason awards. Big Ten Champion Illinois picked up both Player and Coach of the Year honors, with outfielder **Drew Davidson** and **Richard "Itch" Jones** earning the awards, respectively. Michigan's **Jim Brauer** was selected the Pitcher of the Year by the League coaches, while Michigan State outfielder **Ryan Sontag** was named Freshman of the Year. Illinois' Davidson and Purdue pitcher **Scott Byrnes** were the Conference's only unanimous selections to the 2005 All-Big Ten First Team.

Davidson becomes the fifth Illinois player and first since D.J. Svhlik in 1998 to ever be voted best amongst his peers, while Jones captures his second Big Ten Coach of the award, after being tabbed by the League coaches in the same season. Not since 1998 have the Fighting Illini swept both Player and Coach of the Year honors. Davidson, who led the League with a .653 slugging percentage this season, was also second with 14 home runs, fourth with 55 runs, and ranked just outside the top five in runs batted in (51) and doubles (15). In his 15th year at the helm, Jones led Illinois to a 33-21-1 record, a 20-12 Conference mark, and its 28th overall and first Big Ten regular season championship since 1998.

Brauer is the first Wolverine to earn Pitcher of the Year since the award's inception in 1994. En route to a 7-2 record this season, Brauer was second in the Conference in earned run average (2.59), innings pitched (93.2) and strikeouts (76), while holding his opponents to a .241 batting average, which ranked third among League pitchers.

The 2005 campaign also marked the first time a Michigan State player has ever been named the Conference's Freshman of the Year. While starting in 41 of 48 games for the Spartans this year, Sontag hit .349 at the plate with 10 doubles, two triples, one home run and 17 RBIs, all while slugging at a .463 clip.

As for the All-Big Ten Teams, three League standouts were able to repeat their First Team selections from a year ago in Michigan's Brauer and second baseman **Chris Getz**, as well as Illinois catcher **Chris Robinson**. The First Team includes players from seven different schools, led by Illinois (5), Michigan (3) and Purdue (2) with multiple selections.

The Conference office also announced honorees from each of the League's 10 baseball squads for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award. The student-athletes chosen are individuals who have distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior. In addition, the student-athletes must be in good academic standing and have demonstrated good citizenship outside of the sports-competition setting. These 10 student-athletes are now candidates for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award, as the Conference office will honor one male and one female student-athlete from each institution at the end of the school year.
