2006 BIG TEN BASEBALL SEASON IN REVIEW



The University of Michigan baseball team concluded its season on June 4 in the NCAA Atlanta Regional with a 5-4 loss to Vanderbilt. With the loss, Michigan (43-21) closed out the 2006 season having collected both the Big Ten regular season and tournament championships while winning 43 games, the most since the 1989 Wolverines won 49 games.

The Wolverines fell to Vanderbilt in the NCAA regional opener, 5-2, on June 2. Michigan bounced back to defeat Stetson, 11-1, as fifth-year senior Paul Hammond pitched his sixth complete game of the year to lead the Maize and Blue to victory. U-M made its 19th NCAA Championship appearance and its first back-to-back visit since Michigan reached seven straight years from 1983-89. The Wolverines' 19 NCAA post-season appearances rank second among all Big Ten programs to Minnesota (27 appearances). In addition to sweeping both conference titles, Michigan was the lone conference team represented in the NCAA Championship.

Overall, a total of 95 student-athletes from the 10 conference baseball squads were named Academic All-Big Ten, while eight were honored Academic All-District and two standouts, Indiana's Clint Crosier and Minnesota's Any Hunter, were selected to the 2006 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Baseball Second Team. In addition, 13 players from the Big Ten were acquired in the 2006 Major League Baseball Draft, June 6-7.

MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL SELECTS 13 BIG TEN PLAYERS IN ANNUAL DRAFT

Thirteen Big Ten student-athletes have been given the opportunity to play professional baseball after being selected in the annual Major League Baseball Draft from June 6-7.

Ohio State's Ronnie Bourquin, the 2006 Big Ten Player of the Year, was the first conference standout drafted as he went to the Detroit Tigers in the second round with the 50th overall pick. The next two Big Ten selections were Northwestern pitchers, as George Kontos was drafted in the fifth round by the New York Yankees, while the league's Pitcher of the Year Dan Brauer was selected in the sixth round by Philadelphia. Also taken in the sixth round was Purdue's Mitch Hilligoss, as he was acquired by the Yankees.

Purdue led the way with four overall selections over the two-day event, followed by Ohio State with three picks and both Michigan State and Northwestern with two draftees each.

Overall, nine members of the 2006 All-Big Ten Baseball team were drafted this week, including first-team honorees Bourquin, Brauer, Hilligoss, Michigan State's Ryan Basham (29th round) and Michigan's Paul Hammond (35th). The entire list of Major League Baseball draftees from the Big Ten follows:
