The Big Ten enjoyed a successful 2015 women's golf season, highlighted by four Big Ten teams advancing to the NCAA Women's Golf Championships. Northwestern and Purdue shared the Big Ten title, and Northwestern and Purdue advanced to the NCAA Championships.

Four in the NCAA Championships Regional: Four Big Ten teams were selected to compete in the 2015 NCAA Women's Golf Regional Championships. Northwestern, Purdue and Wisconsin. For more information on the NCAA Regional, click [HERE](#).

Northwestern and Purdue Advance: Northwestern and Purdue advanced to the NCAA Women's Golf Championships at Concordia University. Northwestern's Wildcats and Boilermakers finished second and fifth, respectively, in their regionals. For more information on the NCAA Championships, click [HERE](#).

Championships Title: Northwestern and Ohio State shared the Big Ten Championship in women's golf after shooting a three-round record of 872 in the Big Ten Golf Championships. The Wildcats and Buckeyes were followed by third-place Purdue (872), fourth-place Michigan State (878) and fifth-place Wisconsin (880) at the 18-hole, 3,600-yard Fort Golf Resort. Due to the Big Ten's tiebreaking procedures, the Buckeyes earned the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Championships, while Northwestern secured its second Big Ten title, while Ohio State secured its 13th Big Ten Championship.
