



Michigan State Wins 2018 Big Ten Women's Golf Championship Spartans earn second straight Big Ten Championships title

Final Scores

MAINEVILLE, Ohio - Michigan State claimed the Big Ten Championship in women's golf on Sunday after shooting a three-round total of five-under par 859 (283-286-290) in the 2018 Big Ten Championships at TPC River's Bend. The Spartans, who won their eighth Big Ten title, earned the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Championship.

Maryland and Illinois tied for second place (-1; 863), while Northwestern and Ohio State tied for third place (+1; 865).

Ohio State's Jaclyn Lee won the individual Big Ten title, shooting a nine-under par 207 (66-68-73) and tying the championship record for lowest 54-hole score. With the win, Lee receives an exemption into the Symetra Tour's first-ever Prasco Charity Championship to be held at TPC River's Bend June 29-July 1.

Maryland's Xiaolin Tian and Michigan State's Sarah Burnham finished second (-5; 211), followed by the Spartans' Allyson Geer, Northwestern's Janet Mao and Penn State's Cara Basso in a fourth-place tie (-4; 212). All six players earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Championships team.

Michigan State's Burnham earned the Mary Fossum Award, honoring the conference's player with the lowest stroke average (-1.21) relative to par this season.

Maryland Captures Lead After 36 Holes at Big Ten Championships Ohio State's Jaclyn Lee holds onto individual lead with second round 68 (-4)

Maryland posted a team score of 280 (-8) to capture the lead after 36 holes of action at the 2018 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships on Saturday. The Terrapins enter Sunday's final round at eight-under for the tournament, one stroke ahead of second place Michigan State.

The Spartans carded a second-round team score of 286 (-2) to claim second place. Ohio State sits in third, followed by fourth-place Purdue and Illinois in fifth place.

The Buckeyes' Jaclyn Lee enters Sunday's final round as the individual leader (-10) after carding a four-under-par 68 on Saturday. Maryland's Xiaolin Tian, Michigan State's Allyson Geer and Ohio State's Rio Watanabe, all sit tied for second at four-under.

Sunday's final round from TPC River's Bend will get underway at 8 a.m. ET.

under-par 283, while the Terrapins fired an even-par 288. Ohio State's Jaclyn Lee shot an opening round 6-under par 66 and owns a one-shot lead over Michigan State's Allyson Geer (-5; 67). Michigan State's Katie Sharp and Minnesota's

Ohio State currently sits in third-place after compiling a team score of 289, followed by fourth-place Illinois (292), while Northwestern and Purdue sit tied for fifth-place (+5; 293).

Big Ten Women's Golf Championships Michigan State looks to defend title at TPC River's Bend this weekend

Big Ten Championships Notes

ROSEMONT, III. - All 14 Big Ten women's golf teams will travel to Cincinnati this weekend to compete for the conference title at the 2018 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships. The event will be held at the 6,357-yard, par-72 TPC River's Bend.

The championships begin Friday, with first-round action beginning at 8:30 a.m. ET. Saturday's second round will also tee off at 8:30 a.m., while Sunday's third round will begin at 8 a.m. The field for this year's championships features 14 of the top 20 finishers from last season's Big Ten Championships, including medalist Elodie Van Dievoet of Michigan. Michigan State's Sarah Burnham, who finished second individually last season while guiding the Spartans to the team title, also returns, along with teammates Allyson Geer (4th) and Katie Sharp (T5th).

Northwestern returns four players that finished among the top-20 at the 2017 championships, including Stephanie Lau (T5th), Sarah Cho (T12th), two-time Big Ten Player of the Year

Hannah Kim (T12th) and Janet Mao (16th). lowa's Jessica Ip finished in a 12th-place tie last season and returns to lead the Hawkeyes. Ohio State returns Jaclyn Lee (T5th) and Nikolette Schroeder (11th), while Purdue's Micaela Farah is back after finishing in a 17th place tie at the 2017 Big Ten Championships. Wisconsin is led by Becky Klongland and Jessica Reinecke who finished tied for eighth and 17th at last year's championships, respectively.

Six Big Ten teams are ranked among the top 50 according to the latest Golfweek/Sagarin national rankings. Northwestern leads the way at No. 10, followed by No. 11 Michigan State, No. 22 Illinois, No. 31 Purdue, No. 37 Wisconsin and No. 46 Ohio State.

Last season, Michigan State claimed the 2017 Big Ten Championship after shooting a three-round total of 2-over par 866 (298-283-285). The Spartans were followed by second-place Northwestern (868), Ohio State in third place (877), fourth-place Wisconsin (884) and Michigan in fifth place (892).

Team scores shall be determined by adding the low four scores of each team for each round. Live stats will be available at golfstat.com and bigten.org. Results of the Championships
