

California Privacy and AI Legislation Tracker

By IAPP Research and Insights

The California State Legislature is the most active in the United States in terms of regulating privacy and artificial intelligence. This tracker includes bills it has passed since 2019, summarizing the aims, substance, author(s) and status of each bill. These bills have a significant impact on organizations' data practices and have served as models for legislatures in other states engaged in lawmaking around the collection or sharing of personal information and the use and governance of artificial intelligence. Notably, this tracker does not include every privacy or AI-related law; rather, it highlights California laws with significant privacy or AI governance implications across sectors.

The information in the tracker is from the [California Legislative Information](#) website. Each bill is hyperlinked to the specific bill information. This tracker also includes a brief summary of the legislation as well as its status and last legislative action.

- 21 Feb. 2025 was the last day for bills to be introduced.
- 6 June 2025 was the last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house.
- 12 Sept. 2025 was the last day for bills to be passed in each house.
- 12 Oct. 2025 was the last day for the governor to sign or veto bills passed by the legislature
