












Average Rectification Request Resolution Time



Unsubscribe Users Over the Last Year




Average Unsubscribe Resolution Time





Erasure Requests Over the Last Year




Average Erasure Resolution Time







Stop Processing Requests Over the Last Year




Average Stop Processing Request Response Time





Data Protection Impact Assessments Over the Last Year




Average Data Protection Impact Assessment Completion Time






Average Time Per Month in [Units]
