



IN THE NEWS: MODEST SPRINGTIME INVENTORY TO SALES RATIO BUMP WAS SHORT-LIVED AND NOT LIKELY TO BRING INVENTORY RELIEF

U.S. Inventory to Sales Ratio



The U.S. Inventory to Sales Ratio is at the lowest levels ever recorded, and <u>the trans-Pacific</u> <u>shipping system has bounced against its max-</u><u>capacity ceiling.</u>

At the current rate of sales, Jason Miller, associate professor of supply chain management at Michigan State University's Eli Broad College of Business, <u>suggests \$65 billion in inventory will</u> <u>need to be added</u> ahead of the 2021 holiday season to reach the inventories-to-sales ratio held in 2019.

WHAT DOES THE NEED TO REFILL INVENTORIES MEAN WITH THE TRADITIONAL PEAK SEASON ON THE HORIZON?

It is quite interesting that we are nearing the traditional peak season timeframe, when essentially, we never closed out the previous peak season. With capacity continuing to tighten, we need to work together even more to increase network velocity.

Schneider is making significant investments in assets and drivers. As we enter what could be one of the most challenging peak seasons we've seen, we need your help to keep equipment and drivers moving --- as the total hours to unload has increased over 30% year over year. Shippers can help to increase fluidity in the supply chain by:

- Unloading dropped equipment as soon as possible upon arrival, ideally within 24 hours, before equipment detention accessorial charges kick in.
- Having equipment available for drivers to leave with, as a charge will apply for all bobtails priced as drop-and hook.
- Metering deliveries to better manage inbound volume at your sites (which also helps with rail yard volumes for intermodal shippers, as rail providers crack down on ramp storage).

IN THE NEWS: DRIVER SHORTAGE EXTENDS BEYOND THE BORDER

In 2018, a study by the American Trucking Associations (ATA) said the U.S. was short 60,000 drivers. Trucking companies in Mexico are also having a hard time recruiting drivers, according to the <u>National</u> <u>Chamber of Freight Transport</u> (CANACAR), <u>reporting a shortage of 50,000 drivers</u> throughout the country. In Nuevo Laredo, just across the border from Laredo, Texas, there are around 2,000 vacancies.

In Mexico, CANACAR said the driver shortage can be attributed to:

- A lack of good training for drivers.
- A bad image of the profession.
- Difficult working conditions.
- Difficulty attracting young people and women to the profession.

IN THE NEWS: MEXICO RECORDS 692 COMMERCIAL CARGO THEFTS IN APRIL

The most stolen items are food and beverage, clothing and footwear, auto parts, steel, tires, wine and liquor.

While most cargo thefts occur in the central and central western regions of the country, the state of Nuevo León in northern Mexico — which includes a key border crossing with Laredo, Texas — has also been plagued by crime. In 2020, the state of Nuevo León recorded more than 550 cargo thefts, according to SESNSP.




Capacity is expected to continue to remain tight due to the current environment with port congestion and the upcoming traditional peak season on the horizon.

There is a drop in outbound tender volumes and spike in rejections due to the U.S. Memorial Day holiday, but typically these numbers start to reverse again.

U.S. COVID-19 CASES CONTINUE TO DECLINE





MEXICO RESTRICTIONS CONTINUE TO EASE

The Monitoring Committee of Mexico City downgraded the traffic light status from orange to yellow as of May 10, 2021. Face-to-face work in private corporate offices can resume at a maximum capacity of 20 percent. They must also comply with sanitary measures and conduct, weekly testing of at least 20 percent of the personnel working on-site for the detection of the SARS-CoV-2 virus.

Mexico President Andrés Manuel López Obrador aims to ensure its population has had at least one Covid-19 vaccine shot by October before the onset of colder weather.

By July, health authorities will begin providing vaccinations to people as young as 40.

Mexico and the United States are <u>negotiating an end</u> to border crossing restrictions that have been in place for almost 15 months.
