WHAT ARE "CUP RACES"?

The Kimberly, Sheldon, and Elkhart Lake Cup races began in the early days when the racing was done on the public roads around Elkhart Lake. The Kimberly Cup is named after Jim Kimberly; an early pioneer in SCCA racing. This race was for cars under 1950 cc's.

The Sheldon Cup is named after C Bayard Sheldon who was an early promoter/founder of the races. It was for cars between 1950 cc's and 4000 cc's.

The Elkhart Lake Cup was an open race with no size limit.

What are the Cup Races today?

They're free races for all production based cars. You fit into a particular "Cup Race" based on your lap times, not your engine displacement. This ensures close racing.

Kimberly Cup

If your lap time is over 3:00 minutes you will run in the Kimberly Cup. All Group 1 some Group 2, 3, and 8 cars.

Sheldon Cup

If your lap time is 2:45 to 3:00 minutes you will run in the Sheldon Cup. Groups 2, 3, and 8.

Elkhart Lake Cup

If your lap time is under2:45 minutes you will run in the Elkhart Lake Cup. All Group 6 and 9 cars and some Groups 3 and 8.

Choose Carefully!

There will be a 1 second leeway given on what "Cup Race" you belong in. If you are too fast for your race your finish position will be disqualified.

Example: You sign up for the Sheldon Cup and you have a lap time of 2 minutes 43.9 seconds; that is 1.1 second faster than allowed and you will be disqualified. If you are not sure of your lap time, assume the next fastest Cup Race.
