Education/Professional Background/Experience:

Artistic Swimming Background/Experience:

I have coached internationally, which has allowed me to observe membership programs and how they function. I enjoy building rapport across the many levels of our sport and consider myself a constant student of the sport. Under my stewardship at Seattle Synchro, it went from not making finals for several years to consistently earning a spot in finals at national competitions, earning championships at JOs and placing several athletes on national team. I coached those teams and athletes and can say that the membership grew, the retention of the club was at a high, and I created strategies for sustainability in those areas. I have also mentored other coaches here and abroad, even assisting with founding a club overseas.

Please state why you would be a good candidate to serve in a leadership role on the USAAS Board of Directors:

I want to finish what I have already led the groundwork on. I feel my job is incomplete and I see the gaps where I want to address concerns and better assist membership. Please state why you would be a good candidate to serve in a leadership role on the USAAS Board of Directors:

I have been involved in artistic swimming for more than 30 years, first as an athlete, then as a beginner coach who had to learn about the coaching and technical side of the sport. Now as a head coach I work to be a strong leader while also listening to what others think and using their talents to grow the club. I try to be a respectful, thoughtful and involved collaborator, as well as a clear communicator. My experience in this sport as both a coach, judge, and as a member of the East Zone executive board has given me the opportunity to learn about how the Board of Directors decisions shape the way members and clubs participate in artistic swimming. I'd like to bring this perspective to my service on the Board of Directors.

What contributions in terms of time, talent, abilities would you bring to either of the boards?

I am passionate about organization, especially in logistics and budgeting. The East Zone organizes all the awards to be given out at four zone competitions per season, and as the Vice Chair in charge of awards I have to predict, budget and purchase for multiple seasons of use. I've instituted new tracking and predictive systems for this position, and strategized on how to create a system that will be easy for the next person in the position when my term is over. I've also volunteered to help all the East Zone competition hosts create their meet schedules using information from past competitions to better predict possible entries and event timing.

Other information we should know about you:

I try to be the best communicator possible by understanding who I am speaking to and what their views are. I am a very detailoriented person, but I also like to step back often to look at the whole picture. Looking at different viewpoints and talking through various options is something I try to do in all of my projects and collaborations.
