Registration deadline for athletes, coaches, chaperones & team staff. This is also the deadline for all required certifications. This includes Background, SafeSport, CCP and/or First Aid/CPR. **NEW 2026:** The new registration system will not let you enter any event without the required certifications listed. Please complete all requirements before the deadline.

**MAR. 13 - APR. 2**

Late registration window for athletes. A \$25.00 late fee will be assessed per athlete entry and \$10.00 per athlete per routine entry. No entries will be accepted on or after April 3.

**MAR. 13 - 26**

Late registration window for coaches, chaperones & team staff and a \$25.00 late fee will be charged per individual. This is also the late registration window for the certifications listed above. A \$25.00 fine will be assessed for each certifications completed during this time. No certifications will be accepted on or after March 27 and the individual will be removed from the team roster. No refunds will be processed.

**MAR. 26**

Deadline to submit music & coach cards.

**MAR. 27 - APR. 8**

Late music submission or change window. Any music submitted or changed between these dates will be assessed a \$25.00 fine per routine.

**MAR. 27 - APR. 2**

Late coach card submission or change window. Any coach card submitted or changed between these dates will be assessed a \$25.00 fine per routine. Coach Cards will not be accepted or changed on or after April 3.

# CREDENTIALS AND CERTIFICATIONS

## CREDENTIALS

Each club will receive coach credentials per the chart. In addition, each club will receive two team personnel credentials. Additional credentials are \$30 each. Only individuals with required certification are allowed to receive credentials. Credentials are required to be on the pool deck. Coaches, chaperones or other staff registrations received after the entry deadline will be charged a Late Fee of \$ 25.00 per person. See Appendix C.

## REQUIRED CERTIFICATIONS

CREDENTIAL	ELIGIBILITY
CCP LEVEL 1	Required for all coaches to be on deck at any land or water training or sanctioned competition.
CCP LEVELS 1 & 2	Required for all coaches to be on deck at any Regional or Zone Championship. Exception: A one-time emergency waiver may be allowed at the discretion of the Education Director.
CCP LEVEL 3	Required for all coaches to be on deck at any National Championship. Exception: A one-time emergency waiver may be allowed at the discretion of the Education Director.
BACKGROUND SCREEN	Required for all coaches and chaperones on deck.
SAFESPORT	Required for all USAAS Members 18 years of age and older. This includes coaches, chaperones, athletes, trainers, and any other team personnel.
CPR/FIRST AID	Required for all coaches on deck.
MEMBERSHIPS	Professional Membership or Life Membership required for coaches. Athlete Safety Membership required for team staff & chaperones. Competitive Athlete Membership required for all athletes.

## MUSIC

We will be using digital music for this competition. It is essential all music be sent by email in advance. Email music files to Chris Leahy at [leahycm@gmail.com](mailto:leahycm@gmail.com) by March 26, 2026. Please review the late fee section for music submitted or changed after the deadline. Music Late Fees are per routine/ per change. Routines will be electronically timed in advance. Upon receipt of the music, a report will be sent containing the measured times for each routine.

## SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

Digital music files (M4A, MP3) are to be submitted for routines for this competition. - Music files may be sent as email attachments or shared using a file sharing/ transfer service such as Dropbox, Google Drive, OneDrive, WeTransfer, etc.

We recommend submitting 160+ kbit/sec M4A/AAC or higher quality audio for best sound results.

If sending MP3 files, 192+ kbit/sec is recommended.

A device with a 1/8" TRS (headphone) jack is acceptable as a backup.

A CD player will NOT be available as back up.

Use the following naming conventions when saving files (routine names should be "space" separated):

12U Duet Free CDY Smith

- Duet Free = Routine event
- CDY = Club Abbreviation / Three Letter Code
- Smith = Last name of the first alphabetical member of the routine

Competitors who are 13-14 years of age may participate in the Acrobatic Event, Team Free & Team Tech events. At least one competitor on the team or acro must be in the Senior or Junior age division.

## NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competition in Solo, Boy/Male Solo, Gender Inclusive Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Boys/Males Duet, Gender Inclusive Duet and Team, consisting of Technical and Free routines. Technical routines and Free routines are separate events. Neither is mandatory. Each event will be awarded separately.

Qualification for the National Championship, Junior Championship, and Youth Championship is the top 6 routines from each zone for all three championships as well as the bonus entries which can be found on the USAAS website.

Grade Level 6 is required for entry into the National Championship.

## JUNIOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competition in Solo, Boy/Male Solo, Gender Inclusive Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet, Boys/Males Duet, Gender Inclusive Duet and Team, consisting of Technical and Free routines.

Qualification for the National Championship, Junior Championship, and Youth Championship is the top 6 routines from each zone for all three championships as well as the bonus entries which can be found on the USAAS website.

Grade Level 5 is required for entry into the Junior Championship.

## OVER QUALIFICATION

Athletes at the National and Junior Championships are only ineligible for the Junior Olympic Championship if they place in the top 6 routines in the following events:

- Top 6 Solos (Free or Tech)
- Top 6 Male Solos (Free or Tech)
- Top 6 Duets (Free or Tech)
- Top 6 Mixed Duets (Free or Tech)

For this ineligibility to apply, a minimum number of entries are required in the events.



# EVENTS CONT. AND AWARDS

## **NATIONAL & JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP COMBINED EVENT**

When the National and Junior Championships are held together, there shall be one Acrobatic event. Competitors from the National and Junior Championships will be combined in the same Acrobatic routine for this event.

## **DRAW ENTRIES FOR NATIONAL & JUNIOR EVENTS**

If the event has fewer entries than the maximum allowed, we may select, at random, routines registered from the draw. All athletes, coaches and chaperones are required to register before the deadline. All fees will be charged at the time of registration. If the athlete is not drawn, a full refund will be processed. Please select placement as DRAW during event registration as the result place.

## **AWARDS**

Medals for places 1-3 and ribbons 4-8 will be given in the categories listed: Technical Routines, Free Routines, and Acrobatic routines. Foreign Competitors shall receive honorary placements, and if finishing in the top 12, shall swim in Finals and receive honorary awards. Foreign competitors shall not be eligible to be pre-swimmer(s).

# RULES & POLICIES

## VENUE RULES

Gelling is allowed in a specified area only. Please keep areas clean- and pick-up bobby pins. There will be absolutely NO DE GELLING allowed at the facility. A \$100.00 team fine will be placed on the club account if found de gelling. \$100.00 team fine for anyone performing acrobatic movement in practice space.

- No Glass Containers in pool area, lobby, bathrooms or parking lot
- No Shaving/Gelling in the Bathrooms
- No Alcoholic Beverages or Containers in pool area, lobby, bathrooms or parking lot
- No Smoking/Vaping/E-Cigarette in pool area, lobby, bathrooms or parking lot
- No Refunds offered for Vending Machines
- No propping open of any external gates/exits

Teams are permitted to bring in their own coolers, beverage and food. No food is allowed on the pool deck!

## PHOTO REGULATIONS

Any photographs, videotape or other audio and/or visual recordings of the event created by a spectator may be used solely for such spectator's personal non-commercial use, and may not be broadcast, published or disseminated or used for any commercial purposes, without the prior written consent of USA Artistic Swimming. Personal use photography by the audience will be allowed, from the stands, as long as not obstructing the view of others, with any camera using no flash. Photographs must be for personal, non-commercial use. USA Artistic Swimming may use photos likeness in a photograph, video, or other digital media, in any/all of its publications, including web-based publications, without payment or other consideration.

## EVENT CANCELLATION POLICY

When a USA Artistic Swimming (USAAS) event is cancelled or interrupted due to acts or threats of war, acts or threats of terrorism, acts of God, or a health risk alert, event entry refunds will be made to individuals or teams on a prorated basis once all of USAAS's out-of-pocket expenditures for the cancelled or interrupted event have been settled from such fees.

## ADVERTISING POLICY

No club or individual is permitted to display signage, flyers or any other advertising materials at the event. Teams are permitted to hang banners with the logo and/or name of the competing club only. At certain events, scoreboard advertisements will be available for purchase upon inquiry. 
## REFUND POLICY
