**USA Boxing is excited to share a comprehensive proposal for competition in 2025, 2026 and 2027.**

USA Boxing's events take place year-round, beginning with the first event in the spring and ending with the National Championships in December. Competitive bids will include facilities, services, value-in-kind donations and financial support to make the event successful for the city, Local Boxing Committee (LBC), and participants, while representing the USA Boxing brand.



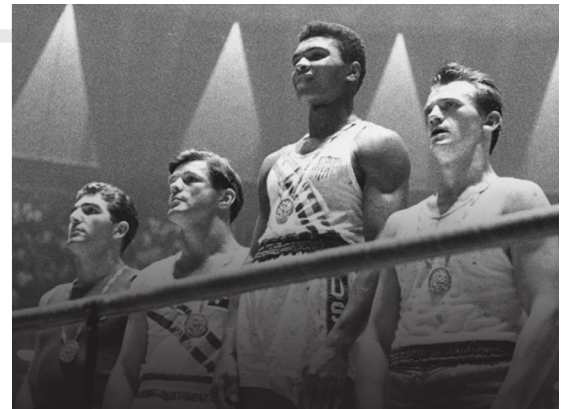
**USA BOXING (USAB)** is the National Governing Body (NGB) for the sport of Olympic-style boxing in the United States. USAB is a non-profit corporation and member of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC). USAB is responsible for training, competition and development for the sport of amateur boxing, as well as qualifying athletes to the U.S. Olympic, Youth Olympic, and Pan American Teams. USAB is also recognized by the International Boxing Federation (AIBA) as the national federation responsible for the governance of the sport of amateur boxing in the United States.

**THE MISSION OF USA BOXING** shall be to enable United States' athletes and coaches to achieve sustained competitive excellence, develop character, support the sport of boxing, and promote and grow Olympic style boxing in the United States. The responsibility of USA Boxing is not only to produce Olympic gold, but also oversee and govern every aspect of amateur boxing in the United States.

## NATIONAL EVENTS

Each USA Boxing event welcomes on average 1200 boxers, 800 coaches, and 100- 150 officials & staff from across the United States for a 7-day tournament. Ages range from the PeeWee division (9-10 years) to the Elite division (19-40 years). The purpose of each event is to provide competition opportunity to USA Boxing members, from grassroots to High Performance.

The National Championships held each December, for the Elite, Youth (17-18 years), & Junior (15-16 years) divisions determine who earn a spot on Team USA. Team USA athletes attend camps at the Olympic & Paralympic Training Center, and compete at the international stage representing the U.S.A. During an "Olympic Year" (2023, 2027, etc.), the National Championships coincides with the Olympic Trials for the Elite, Men's and Women's Divisions.



**1904** Boxing becomes an Olympic sport.

**1978** Ted Steven Olympic & Amateur Sports Act passes congress, which promotes and coordinates amateur athletic activities.

**1984** Boxing becomes regulated by a National Governing Body.

**2012** Women are allowed to box in the Olympics.

**Today** Boxing is 1 of 47 sports regulated by the United States Olympic Committee.

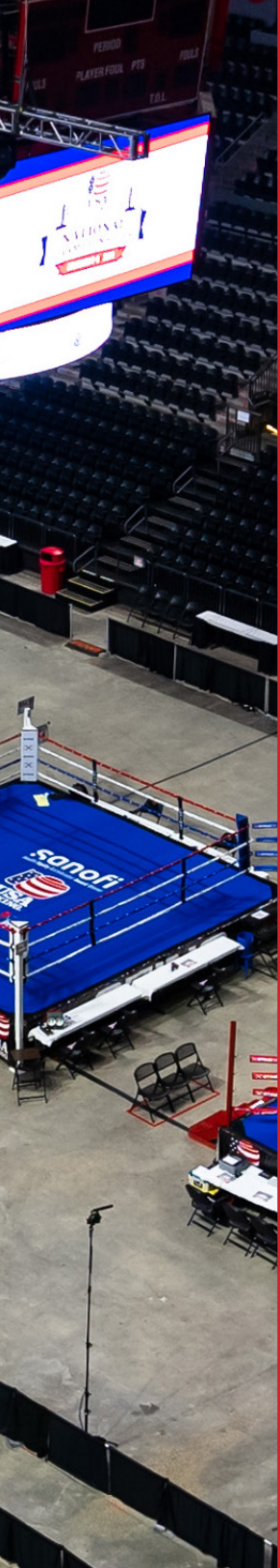

# VENUE REQUIREMENTS

- **Competition facility/venue** must be contained in one location, in one room.
- **Adequate floor space** to meet the minimum requirements for Field of Play (FOP) per USA Boxing National Rule Book including four to five (24' x '24) boxing rings with minimum 16' between each ring:
  - Convention Centers, exhibit halls, banquet halls and other venues without built in seating requires a minimum of 45,000 sq ft.
  - Arenas and Sporting venues with bleachers and permanent seating require minimum 200 linear feet and approximately 20,000 sq ft.
  - Venue must be available for set-up minimum 2 days prior to start of event at no charge to USAB.
- **Ability to secure the following**, at no cost to USA Boxing:
  - Tables & Chairs for all competition venue, meeting space, and pre-function area.
  - P&D 3' black pipe and drape or bike rack to outline field of play, as well as one red and one blue 40x40' pipe and drape (8' high).
  - Adequate Space for Merchandise, Equipment, Video Live Stream & Sponsor Booths.





- **Meeting Rooms** – complimentary to include the following:
  - Officials room (all week) – can accommodate approximately 100 people.
    - Will need access to hospitality and F&B.
  - Check-in room (first 3 days).
    - Minimum 3,500 sq. ft. total.
  - Draw (1 Day) – can accommodate up to 300 people (theatre style).
    - 4’ raised platform.
    - Internet & Microphone.
  - Workout Space (all week) – able to accommodate 1 floor ring, heavy bags, and other workout equipment as needed (provided by USAB).
    - Minimum 7,500 sq. ft.
    - Carpeted space is preferred but not required.
    - Water Station.
  - Staff war-room (all week, up to 5 days prior to competition) minimum 300 sq. ft.
  - Minimum of one (1) 50 mbps wired upload for livestream (hard line).
  - Meeting rooms must be available for set-up minimum 2 days prior to start of event at no charge to USAB.
- **Adequate spectator seating** for fans and parents with clean restroom facilities for a minimum of 2,500 people at no charge to USA Boxing.
  - Bleachers are preferred.
- **Free Parking**
- **Ability to receive and store USA Boxing equipment** and/or packages that arrives a maximum 7 days prior to event start date **AT NO CHARGE TO USA BOXING.**
  - Loading dock or forklift able to lift min 6,000lbs.
- **The ability of USA Boxing to sell event tickets** for their events prior to the competition and at the door without incurring additional costs from the venue.

# HOUSING REQUIREMENTS

**HOST HOTEL:** CVB should secure a headquarter, or Host Hotel for event staff and officials. 125 beds (approx.: 50 double occupancy & 25 single occupancy). Duration of stay will be seven (7) to eleven (11) nights. (See below for sample room block). All rooms under one (1) master account.

- Host hotel offer should fall in the range of \$99-\$129/night.
- Host hotel should include transportation to/from airport for USAB staff & officials.
- Free hotel parking is requested for a minimum of four (4) USAB staff vehicles.
- Host hotel should include breakfast. Ability to cater other meals as needed.
- Hotel must be in walking distance to venue.
- Optional & Discounted room upgrades for VIP.
- Preference given to hotel that can provide 10 staff room at 50% of the proposed group rate.

**PARTICIPANT HOTEL:** CVB must work with our housing partner, HotelPlanner to meet the needs of our participants; coaches & boxers.

## F&B REQUIREMENTS

Host Hotel & Venue must be meet the following requirements:

- Ability to cater meals for staff and officials (up to 150 ppl).
- Small early morning breakfast at 4:30 am for 30 people during competition days for weigh-ins.
- Coffee services for 150 daily, at reasonable cost to USA Boxing.
- Budget: Breakfast @ \$10/person/day; Lunch @ \$15/person/day; Dinner @ \$20/person/day inclusive of service charges.

## EVENT STRUCTURE

- Wednesday/Thursday: **Venue move In**
- Friday/Saturday: **Athletes & Coaches Check-in**
- Sunday: **Meetings & Tournament Draw**
- Monday: **Competition Day 1** – AM/PM sessions
- Tuesday: **Competition Day 2** – AM/PM sessions
- Wednesday: **Competition Day 3** – AM/PM sessions
- Thursday: **Competition Day 4** – AM/PM sessions
- Friday: **Competition Day 5** – AM session
- Saturday: **Competition Day 6** – FINALS – PM session
- Saturday: **Venue pack-out immediately following comp**

# IDEAL CITY CHARACTERISTICS

- City located within close proximity to a hub airport.
- Family activities/entertainment nearby.
- Minimizing cost of hotel room block not to exceed \$99- \$129 per night.
- Host hotels within walking distance of venue to alleviate cost of transportation and parking.
- Support from the CVB/LBC/Sports Commission with marketing prior to the event (banners, welcome signage at venue/hotel/airport, local media activation, etc.).

## ECONOMIC IMPACT

The sport of boxing continues to grow in popularity, especially in the women's divisions and the prep divisions (8-14 years), and the number of participants from one year to the next continues to increase. Over a 7-day tournament, previous destinations have estimated the following economic impact: \$2.5-3.5M.

## BID REQUIREMENTS

CVB, Sports Commission, LOC, or organization submitting bid should secure or provide the following:

### BID FEE: \$40,000

- Free Venue Rental.
- Ambulance & Security services throughout competition.
- Ability to meet F&B budget and requirements ( >\$45/person/day).
- Ability to help source and manage local volunteers.
- 2 Free Rental Vehicles.
- Marketing & Sponsorship support.
- Officials & Volunteer Appreciation Night (food & activity for 100-125 ppl).
- Welcome/Event Signage provided by CVB (specifically in host hotels, airport, and in and around the venue).
- Site-visit expenses (for two USA Boxing representatives to visit the site before the bid is awarded) to include flight, hotel, transportation, meals.
