

USA BOBSLED AND SKELETON NOMINATION CRITERIA

Nominations shall be accepted from anyone in the bobsled and skeleton community. They will be solicited from USABS membership, committees, social media followers, and athletes through regular communications from USABS.

All nominations will be submitted to Tuffield Latour, Chairman of USABS Hall of Fame, and include the following information:

1. Name of nominee
2. Category of nomination (athlete, coach or contributor)
3. Criteria information, as listed below, for the nominee

Please do two things before submitting a nomination:

1. Make sure you are aware of the criteria for consideration and that your nominee meets that criteria. Nominations which do not meet the criteria will be ruled out of consideration by the USABS Hall of Fame Committee.
2. Make sure you fill out the nomination form as completely as possible. This may take some effort and research on your part.

Once all nominees are submitted the Hall of Fame Committee will meet, discuss and vote on all nominations.

Hall of Fame Nomination Criteria

Before nominating an athlete, coach, or contributor, check the list of current members to see if the person has already been initiated. You may submit as many nominations as you like. It is not necessary to resubmit a nomination that was already counted in a previous year.

ATHLETE

Criteria for athletes being placed in nomination shall be one or more of the following:

1. Olympic/ World Championship results;
2. World champion;
3. Olympic champion;
4. World Cup/ National Championship/ North American Championship results;
5. Other outstanding accomplishments at the international or national levels.

To be nominated, an athlete must have completed competition at least 8 years prior to consideration. Exceptions can be made in certain extraordinary cases.

COACH

Criteria for coaches being placed in nomination shall be:

1. Having compiled an outstanding record of coaching champions at the level coached; and
2. Having compiled an extraordinary winning record or have achieved other outstanding accomplishments; and

3. Having coached for at least ten (10) years.

To be nominated, a coach must have been retired for at least one year from active full-time coaching, except where s/he has coached for twenty (20) years or more.

CONTRIBUTOR

Criteria for contributors being placed in nomination shall be:

1. Having served the Bobsled and Skeleton community with special distinction; and
2. Having worked within the Bobsled and Skeleton community in its best interests in an outstanding manner for at least ten (10) years; or
3. Having achieved other outstanding accomplishments.
