## PLAYING SYSTEM ITTF-AMERICAS CUP SAN FRANCISCO 2026

### 1. Structure

The ITTF-Americas Cup San Francisco 2026 will consist in 2 stages, the Preliminary stage will be play on 28<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> January 2026 and the Main Draw from 30<sup>th</sup> January to 1<sup>st</sup> February 2026.

The event will be played in two individual events:

- ⇒ Men's Singles and
- ⇒ Women's Singles.

- **Preliminary stage**

- I. The preliminary stage will play in Knock out system
- II. Any player from Pan America can register for the event through their national association using the ITTF EMS.
- III. All matches shall be played best of five games.
- IV. The players that reach semifinal "four (4) players", will qualify for the Main draw of the ITTF-Americas San Francisco 2026.
- V. Players in this stage can play more than 3 matches per day in case be necessary.

- **Main Draw**

- I. A total of 12 players were invited through the [qualification pathway](#).
- II. The main draw will be played in straight Knock out.
- III. The first round will consist of 12 players invited plus the 4 players coming from the qualification stage.
- IV. The players' that qualified to the Main Draw through the qualification stage will be seeded 13 to 16 following their WR week 5.
- V. All matches shall be played best of 7 games.

### 2. Draw Procedures

- The seeding and draws will be conducted based on the latest Table Tennis Ranking: World Ranking Week 5 (27 January 2026).



- **Preliminary Stage:** There will be no separation by member association during the qualification rounds.
- **Main Draw:** Players will be drawn according to the seeding list, and separation by member association will be applied.
- If players do not have ranking points, those players will be drawn randomly.

### 3. Eligibility

- Player's eligibility is regulated by 3.8 and 4.3.6 (ITTF Handbook).
