USS FUNDRAISING PROGRAMS

Fundraising raises money for USS and promotes its athletes vision and mission. Thanks to the generous support of many people and organizations, USS programs continue to expand to help more athletes, from beginning skaters to Olympians. During the 2023-24 season, the USS fundraising activities below generated \$332,000 for our athletes and programs.

ANNUAL FUND

The Annual Fund provides individuals a way to support USS and its World Class athletes. Tax-deductible donations in any amount to USS goes to the funding of the National Training Program, Development Programs, World Cup Teams and Olympic Teams.

DONOR FUNDED ATHLETE SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Donor Funded Athlete Support (DFAS) program enables donors to give direct support to USS athletes. On an annual basis, money from the Program will be allocated directly and evenly to qualified athletes determined by criteria set by the USOPC and USS.



US SPEEDSKATING FOUNDATION

The US Speedskating Foundation (USSF), a 501c3 organization, supports year-round athlete training, development, competition and education for speed skaters in the United States. Through annual grants, the USSF provides funds to support programs that grow the sport of speed skating from the grassroots level all the way to podiums at the Olympic Games. USS SAFE SPORT

The US Speedskating Safe Sport Policy establishes a healthy, positive and safe environment for all parties participating in the sport of speed skating. The USS Safe Sport Policy raises awareness about misconduct in sport, promotes open dialogue, provides training and resources and assists members with potential allegations.

USS works in partnership with the U.S. Center for SafeSport to prevent abuse and foster a national sport culture of respect and safety on and off the ice. The U.S. Center for SafeSport has exclusive authority within speed skating to investigate and resolve allegations of sexual misconduct and any related misconduct.

The following groups are required to complete the U.S. Center for SafeSport training; all members of the USS board of directors, staff, interns, contractors, certified coaches, level 2, 3, 4 & 5 officials, all USS members that have a 1st year, club competitor/recreational, or national-level competitor membership and that are 18 years of age or older, and all club/association staff, officers and board members. It is recommended that all USS athletes listed in the USADA pool take this training, but it is not required.

LONG TRACK

2024 WORLD LONG TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

Jordan Stolz made history again at the ISU Speed Skating World Championships in Calgary, Canada February 15-18, 2024. He repeated his incredible feat from the previous year to win three Golds in the 500m, 1000m, and the 1500m. His teammates had a successful weekend as well, with **Kimi Goetz** taking home a Bronze medal in the 500m and with **Brittany Bowe**, **Erin Jackson**, and **Sarah Warren** teaming up to finish second in the Women's Team Sprint.



SALT LAKE CITY WORLD CUP 5

World Cup 5 was held at the Utah Olympic Oval in SLC, in January 2024. With a record number of spectators, US athletes set two World Records. Jordan Stolz, who won Gold in four races, set a World Record in 1000m with a time of 1:05.37. Teammates Ethan Cepuran, Casey Dawson & Emery Lehman took back their Team Pursuit World Record with a time of 1:33.36. Erin Jackson and Kimi Goetz dominated the 500m by winning Gold and Silver respectively. Goetz also won Gold and Silver in the two 1000m races. The Women's Team Sprint took home Bronze, bringing the U.S. medal count to 10 for the weekend.



JUNIOR WORLD LONG TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Junior World Long Track Championships were held in Hachinohe City, Japan. **Marley Soldan** finished fifth in the Women's Mass Start and was one of three U.S. skaters to rank among the top 16 in their respective Allround competitions. **Libby Williams** and Soldan led a strong effort by the U.S. women, finishing 15th and 16th, respectively, in the Women's Allround standings with 171.983 and 172.680 points. Meanwhile, **William Silk** scored 156.771 to take 16th in the Men's Allround while also posting the top individual result for a U.S. man by finishing 18th in the 5000m.

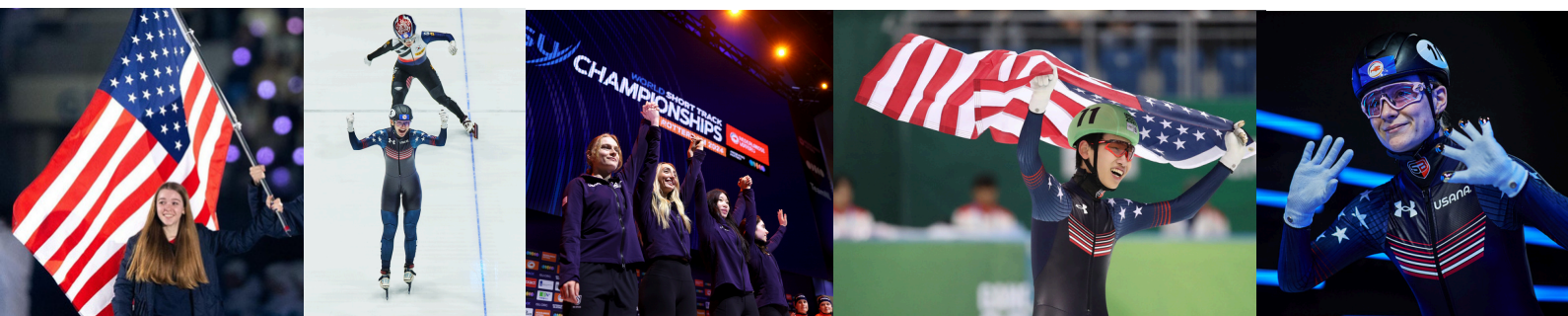
SHORT TRACK

2024 WORLD SHORT TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

The World Championships were held in Rotterdam, Netherlands from March 15-17, 2024. After a 10-year medal drought, the U.S. won the overall medal count, winning 6 medals over the weekend. Kristen Santos-Griswold became World Champion in the 1000m, and won Silver in the 1500m and Bronze in the 500m. Corinne Stoddard finished close behind Santos-Griswold to take Bronze in the 1500m and the two teamed up with Julie Letai and Eunice Lee to win Silver in the Women's Relay. Santos-Griswold, Stoddard, Marcus Howard and Andrew Heo won Bronze in the Men's Relay.

FOUR CONTINENTS CHAMPIONSHIPS

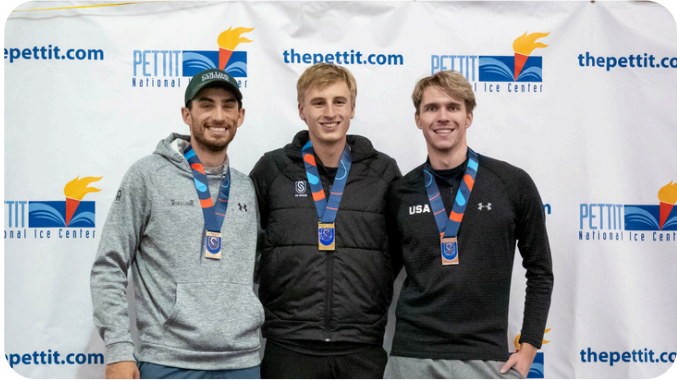
Held in Laval, Canada on Nov. 4-5, 2023 the fastest Short Track skaters from North America, South America, Asia and Oceania faced off for titles at the ISU Four Continents Championships. Kristen Santos-Griswold swept the podium, winning Gold in all three individual races. **Andrew Heo** pushed through the last lap of the Mixed Team Relay to secure Silver along with **Kristen Santos-Griswold**, **Marcus Howard** and **Julie Letai**. Heo won his first international individual medal of the season, capturing a Bronze medal in the Men's 500m.



2024 YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES

Short Track Youth Olympians took Gangwon, South Korea by storm at the 2023 Youth Olympic Games. **Sean Shuai** became the first Team USA athlete to win Gold during the games with a thrilling win in the 500m. Then, two days later, Shuai joined **Kyungeun Jang**, **Elizabeth Rhodehamel** and **Julius Kazanecki** to win a Silver medal in the Mixed Relay. Rhodehamel was chosen to be a flagbearer at the opening ceremonies, representing Team USA to all the nations competing.

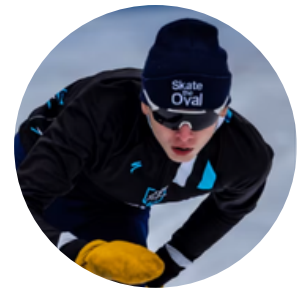

US Speedskating's funding of athletic programs makes a difference in the dreams of Olympic skaters, from pond to podium. Unlike many rival nations, there is no government funding to support U.S. athletes. USS' primary sources of funding are USOPC high performance grants, ISU Event & Development grants, sponsorships and fundraising – with the spirit of Olympism motivating the American public to give privately and help athletes accomplish their goals.

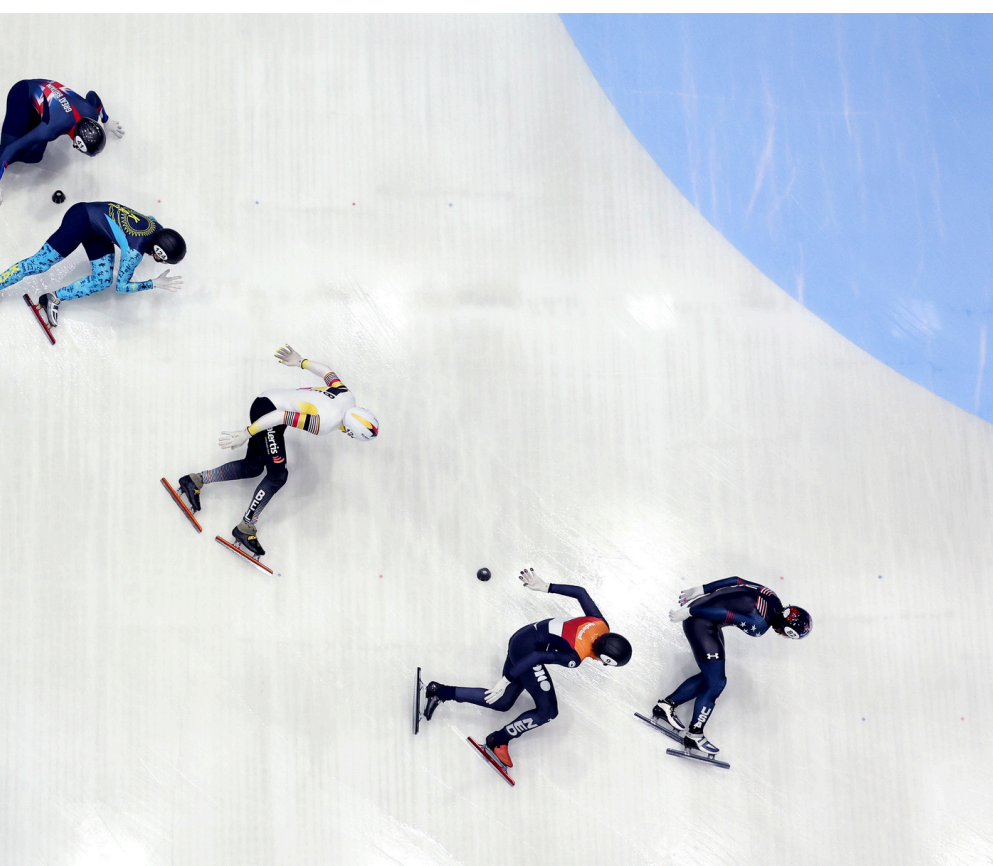

- Empowerment and effective oversight of professional staff with a value-driven philosophy (integrity, accountability, team)

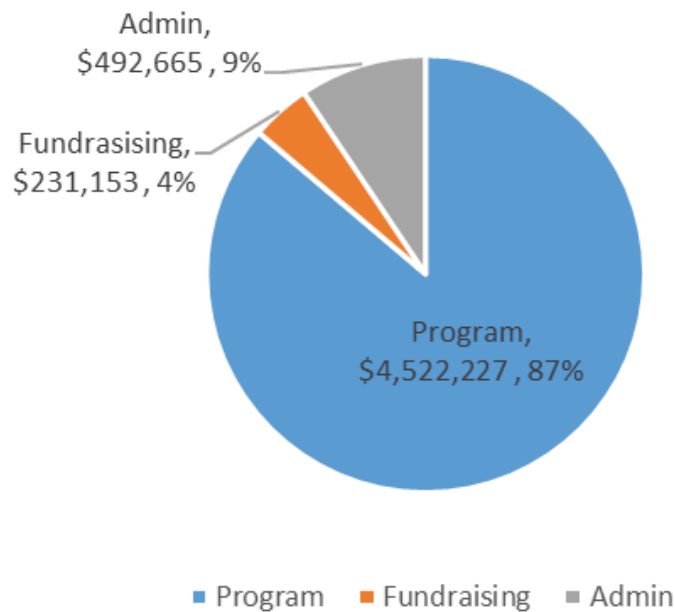

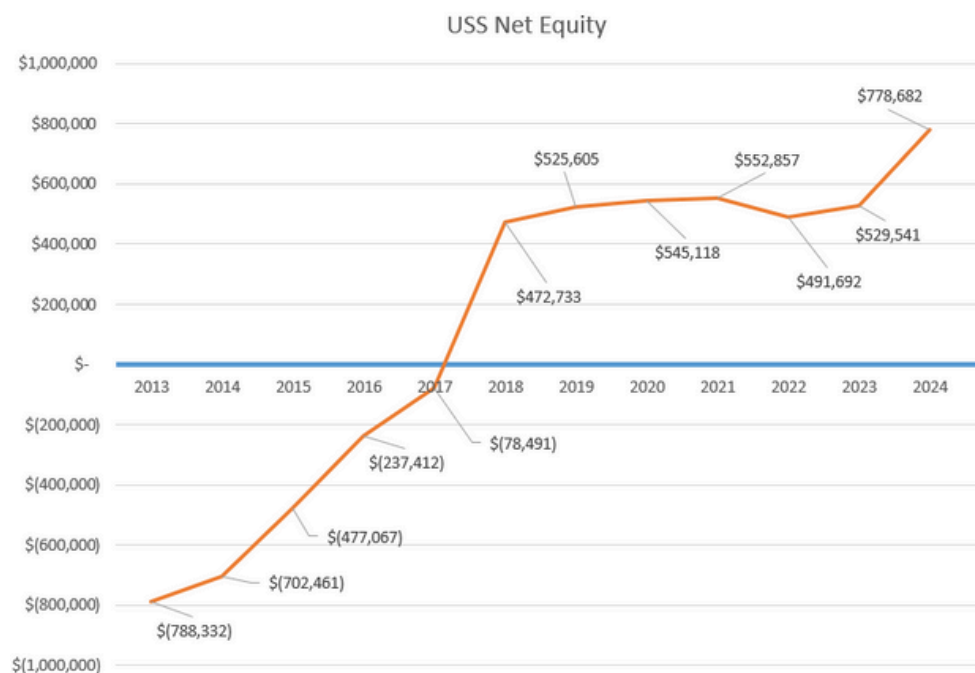
