10. Nominating Committee Report – Doug Robbins, Chairman of the Board (verbal)

a. Election of Officers and Honorary National Directors:

Officers: Robbins stated that the existing officers have agreed to serve another term and the committee received no other nominations. Robbins opened nominations from the floor. None were forthcoming.

Chairman of the Board – Doug Robbins President – Bob Archambeau Vice President – Dale Stevens Secretary/Treasurer – Joel Johanningmeier

• **Motion** by Joel Johanningmeier and seconded by Cathy Williams to approve the slate of officers as presented above – **approved**

Honorary National Directors: Pat Byrne presented.

• **Motion** by Kelly Koehler and seconded by Matt Oberholtz to approve Pat Byrne as an Honorary National Director – **approved**

Seating of New Officers – They were seated.

Don Bucher (MW) to replace Kelly Koehler (SC) as a voting member of AWSA

11. President's Report – Bob Archambeau

The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Action Item: Bob Archambeau, USA-WSWS President, tasked all sport discipline presidents to establish a membership committee, if one does not already exist. The committee should establish goals and execute plans for membership growth in 2024 and future years. Each SD needs to take ownership for their futures and growing memberships. While membership support is a USA-WSWS HQ function, membership growth is beyond HQ staff responsibility.

12. Executive Committee Report – Bob Archambeau, Chair

The written report was included in the BOD packet.

13. Executive Director's Report – Nate Boudreaux, Outgoing Executive Director The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Boudreaux thanked the staff and BOD for a great 5 years. He stated the organization is in a solid financial position. Membership is flat. Sanctioning is on par with other years. The podcast is doing well and continues to gain traction. Social media has seen tremendous growth in the last 5 years, but we could be hitting saturation. Get on the Water and other learn to ski programs are crucial for growth. For the second year in a row USA-WSWS won

the USOPC DE&I Choice Award. The funds that come with the award will be used to continue our learn to ski programs like the Girls Learn to Water Ski Program and the Veterans Adaptive Learn to Water Ski Program. The National Team side was very busy this year and was very successful. SafeSport training continues. 76% of adult members are trained.

Boudreaux gave an overview of the financials. Last year we budgeted for a slight loss but we are projecting about \$36,000 of net income. He stated USA-WSWS budgets very conservatively on income and high on expenses. Boudreaux suggested if there is a surplus dividends be paid back to the sport disciplines.

Action Item: The new USA-WSWS Executive Director should consider paying a year-end dividend (based on the BOD approved funding allocation model in place at the time) back to the sport disciplines in years USA-WSWS finishes the year with a budget surplus.

Johanningmeier asked a few questions on the budget. Boudreaux responded.

14. Treasurer's Report – Joel Johanningmeier, Secretary/Treasurer (Verbal)

The written report with the budget and budget notes was included in the BOD packet.

Johanningmeier stated that Boudreaux went through the numbers and addressed his questions in the Executive Director's Report. The numbers will change once the 2023 financials are finalized.

• **Motion** by Connor Poggetto and seconded by Cathy WIlliams to accept the 2024 proposed budget as presented – **approved**

15. Insurance Report – Randy Melcher, EPIC

A written Premium Comparision summary from EPIC was included in the BOD packet.

The EPIC Services Fee went up by \$5,000. We previously negotiated down the fee. We still enjoy a great value in terms of what they offer as risk management consultants.

16. Committee Reports

All committee reports were unanimously approved by the BOD as submitted unless otherwise indicated.

- Awards Lori Krueger, Chair (absent): The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- Bylaws TBD, Chair: No report.

Action Item: Appoint special committee or task force to review and revise SD funding allocation and vote allocation model (follow up from 2023 meeting discussion). Current model is more than 2 decades old, and something new is needed for next 5-10 years sustainability and growth. Bob Harris agreed to serve on this task force. Doug Robbins agreed to chair this task force.

 Motion by Bob Harris and seconded by Karen Melnik to form special committee/task force to review and revise SD funding allocation and vote allocation model – approved

Action Item: Bob Archambeau, USA-WSWS President, to appoint Bylaws Committee Chair by first quarter BOD call.

• Ethics – Dale Stevens, Chair (absent): In 2023, the committee received an email asking for a discussion around ethics, compliance, and SafeSport. Guidance was provided in relation to the ethics policies and procedures as well as guidance on SafeSport. There were no deficiencies as it related to ethics and the matter has since been closed.

Action Item: The Ethics Committee/Legal will review and update the Code of Ethics. There is verbiage contained in there that requires individuals to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws. This verbiage is broad and should either be removed, defined further based on its applicability to our roles in USA-WSWS, or USA-WSWS needs to provide training on what exactly those laws are.

- International Activities TBD, Chair: No Report
- Judicial Jeff Smith, Chair (absent): No Report
- **Risk Management/Safety Harley Wallace, Chair (absent)**: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- Towboat George Lindy (absent) and Will Bush (absent), Co-Chairs: No Report (currently an inactive USA-WSWS committee.)
- USOPC AAC Andrew Adkison, AAC/USOC Representative (absent): Regina Jaquess submitted two items via email. There is concern about athletes who changed federations and their eligibility for Operation Gold money. A discussion was held with Steve Smith, the NGB attorney. Only athletes who are U.S. citizens qualify for Operation Gold funding. The other item of concern was Pan American Games. The status of water ski and wakeboard is still unclear.

 Waterways – Leon Larson, Chair: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Larson thanked WSIA for the work they do for waterway access. He continues to be active as the chair of the IWWF Environmental and Sustainability Committee and updated the IWWF Environmental and Sustainability Manual, the IWWF Safety Manual, and the USA-WSWS Waterways Education Manual and will keep those up to date as issues are worked on. A conversation was had about available resources to use in defending against restricting waterways access and boating rights.

17. Sport Disciplines' and Related Organizations' Reports

• Athlete Advisory Council (AAC) – Alex Lauretano, Chair (Verbal): No report but AAC needs a bigger pool of athletes.

Action Item: USA-WSWS SD Presidents to provide AAC a list of names of eligible athletes (national and international competitive level) as AAC needs more reps to fill the USOPC required positions on all committees and the BOD. Please provide list of names to Alex Lauretano at alex@lauretano.com

- USA Water Ski & Wake Sports Foundation Ed Hickey, President (absent): The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- Water Sports Industry Association (WSIA) James Krawczyk, Director of Operations (absent): No report.
- American Kneeboard Association (AKA) Kenny Stuart, President (absent): No report.
- USA Wakeboard (USA-WB) Cathy Williams, President (Verbal): Williams stated that in 2023 wakeboard had the first Wake Sports Festival in Auburndale, FL This event was also the Pan Am qualifier. She thanked Visit Central Florida for all their assistance in making the event a success.

In 2024 the IWWF Pan American Wakeboard Championships will be held in Auburndale, FL. The IWWF World Cable Wakeboard & Wakeskate Championships are planned for Choisy-le-Roi, France. The IWWF Wakesurf Championships are planned for Hong Kong.

• American Barefoot Club (ABC) – Lauren Ehlers, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Ehlers stated that ABC is looking forward to the IWWF World Open, Junior & Under 23 World Barefoot Championships being held in Auburndale, Fl this upcoming October. She also stated that the Eastern Region is struggling due to restricted water access. ABC is working hard on the webcast system so it can be shared with all sport disciplines. Ehlers expressed a desire to work with the new ED on a webcast system as they are working to do this in an inexpensive way. Junior development is a high priority for ABC, and they are working to get younger generations into leadership positions.

• National Collegiate Water Ski Association (NCWSA) – Christy Kingsmill, Chair: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Action Item: New USA-WSWS Executive Director to restore or replace the database for event registrars/scorers to access and verify membership and SafeSport status. The database needs to be backed up, independent, and accessible 24/7/365.

Action Item: NCWSA President will source an event app for NCWSA and all USA-WSWS SD's to adopt and share for use at sanctioned events to be used for event communications, schedules, updates, etc.

- National Show Ski Association (NSSA) Joel Shapiro, President (Verbal): Shapiro stated that membership is back to pre-pandemic levels. Boat insurance is still a struggle. New teams are coming in. NSSA refreshed their Member Development Committee to work with these new teams and assist with recruiting. The 2025 IWWF World Waterski Show Tournament will be held in Mulwala, Australia. Individuals will compete on Monday and the team competition will take place Friday Sunday. 2025 D2 Show Ski National Championships will be in Winter Haven, FL. 2025 Indmar Show Ski National Championships will be in Janesville, WI. Shapiro invited all in attendance to Think Tank. He acknowledged Lynn Novakofski for his recent induction into the IWWF Hall of Fame. He congratulated Grace Petzold on being named the IWWF Female Show Ski Athlete of the Year and Pete Hegarty on being named the IWWF Male Show Ski Athlete of the Year.
- National Water Ski Racing Association (NWSRA) Cheryl Ruston: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- USA Adaptive Water Ski & Wake Sports (USA-AWSWS) Matt Oberholtz (Verbal):
 Oberholtz stated that 2023 was a good year for USA-AWSWS. The U.S. Team won their 10th world title at the 15th Barbara Bolding/Jim Grew Fund Disabled Water Ski World Championships in September 2023. The USA Adaptive Water Ski Team was honored as the USA-WSWS Team of the Year. The 27th USA Adaptive Water Ski Team National Championships will be hosted in Auburndale, FL in September 2024 with Ann's Angels Adaptive Water Ski Foundation as the Local Organizing Committee. This will also serve as the Team Trials event for the 2025 World Championships. The 2025 Disabled Water Ski World Championships are tentatively being planned to take place in Australia.
- U.S. Hydrofoil Association (USHA) Charlie Buckley, President (Absent): No report
- American Water Ski Association (AWSA) Lyman Hardy, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

• Pan Am and IWWF Updates – Dana Garcia: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Garcia stated that she still feels there are communication issues at IWWF. Meeting minutes are not being shared and there is a lack of representation for the U.S. Garcia will continue to ask and seek info and Archambeau will assist.

18. Old Business

There was no old business.

19. New Business

Regional Communication to Members – Melnik initiated a discussion about the ability of EVPs to send pertinent communications to members in their region.

Hanson stated USA-WSWS is able to do this on behalf of SDs/EVPs through Sendgrid.

Melnik, Harris, Kingsmill, Janzig and Krueger noted that relying on USA-WSWS staff to send communications on their behalf impacts the timeliness of the message as some communications need to be sent immediately and cannot wait until the next business day.

Hanson stated that communications must include unsubscribe functionality to allow members to opt-out of these specific email categories.

Action Item: SD Presidents, and region EVP's need the ability to communicate directly to their memberships via email, text, and/or phone. The USA-WSWS BOD approved this in past years, however it is still not available to them. There are technical challenges, and some legalities which have been discussed. HQ staff does this through Sendgrid internally, but SD Presidents and EVP's need same ability on off hours either through Sendgrid or another option. New ED needs to provide this process and communicate to the SD Presidents and EVP's.

Action Item: USA-WSWS staff to restore email address and phone numbers to the officials list. LOC's need contact information to staff and sanction events. That is missing since the cyber attack in August 2023.

Sanction Event Drone Insurance – Boudreaux brought up the drone insurance program for sanctioned events and asked if they would like to continue paying for drone insurance. He stated the premium is approximately \$7,000 a year and only 3 clubs are taking advantage of it.

Many BOD members expressed that they were not aware USA-WSWS had a drone insurance program for clubs and questioned how clubs sign up to be covered under the insurance.

• **Motion** by Joel Johanningmeier and seconded by Connor Poggetto to continue the sanction event drone insurance in 2024 – **approved**

Action Item: USA-WSWS staff to ask EPIC insurance broker to provide additional information that can be posted on the website and distributed to members, clubs, and LOC's sanctioning events that explains the drone insurance program. LOC's need to know what private/primary drone operator insurance is required for use at events, and what USA-WSWS optional drone insurance covers, why it is valuable and how to complete the form to secure it.

Staff Retirement Plan – Boudreaux asked the BOD to approve updates to the Employee Manual regarding Safe Harbor 401k program. USA-WSWS moved to a Safe Harbor plan two years ago, that no longer requires a vesting period for employer contributions and matches start after 30 days of employment. The policy in the Employee Handbook needs to be revised.

6.3 RETIREMENT PLAN

A Retirement Plan is available to all full time USA Water Ski & Wake Sports employees. The cost of this plan is borne by the company. Upon meeting the eligibility requirements for participation (30 days after hire date), an employee has the ability to defer earned income into this Individual Retirement Account. The minimum and maximum amounts eligible to defer are defined in the policy and are based on existing federal regulations.

USA Water Ski & Wake Sports may provide a matching contribution to the plan, not to exceed 5% of the employee's annual salary. The employee must contribute an equal amount to the plan to receive a matching contribution. There is no vesting period for employer contributions.

• **Motion** by Geri Luiting and seconded by Joel Johanningmeier to revise employee handbook regarding 401(K) match. – **approved**

Officers: Stevens stated that the existing officers have agreed to serve another term and the committee received no other nominations. Robbins opened nominations from the floor. None were forthcoming.

Motion by Archambeau and seconded by Poggetto for approval of Dr Flynn for a second term.

11. President's Report – Bob Archambeau

The written report was included in the BOD packet.

12. Executive Committee Report – Bob Archambeau, Chair

The written report was included in the BOD packet.

13. Executive Director's Report – Nate Boudreaux, Executive Director

The written report was included in the BOD packet. Boudreaux gave an overview via PowerPoint presentation. Each staff member stood up and gave a report about items within their responsibilities.

Boudreaux stated that USA-WSWS is in the best financial position coming out of 2022 than it has been in a long time. A Bank First money market account was opened in 2022 and some of these funds were used in early January to pay insurance premiums. Paying our insurance in a lump sum saved the organization approximately \$5,500 in finance charges. In 2022, a total of \$539,542 was generated in grant and/or external funding. Over the past four years, \$1,011,644 was generated from external sources through the USOPC, government agencies (PPP loans and Employee Retention Credits) and grants.

John Lipscomb introduced his adaptive program. Boudreaux thanked John for his assistance in providing a template for how USA-WSWS could use the veterans grant to put on events in 2022 and says USA-WSWS will continue this in the next year on a smaller scale.

Melanie Hanson presented membership statistics from 2022. Membership numbers are almost back up to where they were before the pandemic. Boudreaux introduced the new demographic findings that have been collected with the new membership registration system.

Boudreaux presented social media statistics on behalf of Emily Hammer. There has been a large percentage of growth year over year.

Scott Atkinson presented the 2022 communications accomplishments. Polk County Sports Marketing provided funding for the 100th year anniversary magazine. All magazines from 1951 to 1970 were digitally archived for members thanks to Lynn Novakofski. By the end of the year, all magazines up to Sept. 2009 will be uploaded to the archive. Next project will be to digitize videos that USA-WSWS has on old cassette and VHS tapes. There has been an increase in website traffic from 2021 to 2022. Scott credits this to social media and monthly newsletters. The podcast was launched in 2022 with Tyler Boyd as the host. The USOPC will be revamping websites for the NGBs that will be more focused on the individual NGB.

Molly Crum gave an overview of the veteran adaptive learn to ski program. Adaptive events for veterans were hosted in 11 states in 2022 and saw more than 125 veteran with disability participants. Crum also reported on the Girls Inc. Learn to Ski program. Thirty-two girls participated in 2-hour sessions over 5 weeks. The program was a recipient of the USOPC 2022 DE&I Choice Award for excellence in diversity, equity and inclusion.

Chris Zukas, USA-WSWS newest staffer, shared three new marketing initiatives launching in 2023 that will utilize member stories and emphasize younger athletes in the sport. TikTok was mentioned as a new content outlet for social media and a question was asked from the floor concerning the application's reputation with privacy and security issues.

14. Treasurer's Report – Joel Johanningmeier, Secretary/Treasurer (Verbal)

The written report with the budget and budget notes was included in the BOD packet.

Johanningmeier gave an overview of the financials for 2022. Long-term investments are down because of the current state of the market.

Boudreaux stated that USA-WSWS typically budgets low on income and high on expenses, which in the past has been a successful model.

• **Motion** by Poggetto and seconded by Ribley to approve the 2023 proposed budget as presented – **approved**

15. Insurance Report – Randy Melcher, EPIC

A written report from EPIC was included in the BOD packet.

USA-WSWS requires that the organization be listed as an additional insured for all boats used in sanctioned events per our published Towboat Insurance Requirements for sanctioned events. We are receiving increased pushback from insurance companies regarding this requirement, especially in the case of club-owned, twin/triple rig, or modified boats. Many insurers don't want to insure a club-owned boat.

Poggetto facilitated discussion of commercial insurance versus personal insurance for club boat options. Boudreaux suggested that further discussions be conducted in the future about this among other disciplines if they are interested. Cheryl Ruston explained that ski racing boats cannot be covered by insurance. They are only covered within sanctioned events.

16. Committee Reports

All committee reports were unanimously approved by the BOD as submitted unless otherwise indicated.

- Awards Lori Krueger, Chair (absent): The written report was included in the BOD packet. Several board members suggested the use of more video footage at the awards banquet if applicable.
- **Bylaws Jeff Clark, Chair:** The written report was included in the BOD packet. Robbins thanked Jeff for his years of service as the Chair of the Bylaws committee. Clark said that he would stay on the committee as an appointed member in order to help with the transition. Clark presented the proposed changes to the USA-WSWS Safe Sport Handbook to include Safe Sport's Response and Regulation requirements.

Motion to approve Action Item #1 changes to the USA-WSWS Safe Sport Handbook – **Approved**

There are no changes from the USOPC for this year. All are currently included in the Bylaws.

Clark reminded the board that in the past it was agreed that every 10 years there would be a review of each of the Sport Disciplines. The 10-year period was based on the fact that the majority of our members are USA-WSWS members for 10 years and takes place on years ending in 7 (ex: 2007, 2017, 2027).

17. Sport Disciplines' and Related Organizations' Reports

- Athlete Advisory Council (AAC) Alex Lauretano, Chair (Verbal): No Report
- Water Sports Industry Association (WSIA): No Report
- American Kneeboard Association (AKA) Kenny Stuart, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- USA Wakeboard (USA-WB) Cathy Williams, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Williams introduced the plan for a cable club concept within USA-WSWS. IWWF defines cable as an independent discipline, so this would have the potential to become its own discipline within USA-WSWS. Williams said her challenge is that wake does not have clubs similar to water ski. Events this year include the Pan Am Games and Wake Sports Festival coming up in 2023. The Wake Sports Festival will be used as a Pan Am qualifier for wakeboard while including kneeboard, barefoot and hydrofoil exhibitions.

• American Barefoot Club (ABC) – Lauren Ehlers, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Ehlers stated that ABC hosted an IWWF event in San Marcos, TX. Livestreaming has been a struggle in the past due to the speed of the boats but has now become a great resource that shows what the skier is doing on the shore. Elite and Junior

World Championships are taking place in Australia in early February. Under 23 is a new division that was created in order to give these skiers a chance to ski in worlds since the 2020 tournament was cancelled.

• National Collegiate Water Ski Association (NCWSA) – Christy Kingsmill, Chair (verbal):

Kingsmill stated Iowa State University, one of their "powerhouse" schools, is not allowed to compete because their university defines them as a water sport and is not allowing any club water sports. The university brought in a third-party to assess all sport clubs at the school and disbanded the team as well as other sport clubs because of their involvement with water. NCWSA, Midwest Region, and Harley Wallace (Risk Management Committee) have been working on this issue as it could have the potential of happening at other schools. NCWSA plans to use Grace Stanke, former collegiate water skier and newly crowned Miss America, at events for promotion of the sport. Boudreaux mentioned the bridge between collegiate and AWSA and how the AWSA Midwest Region was able to introduce collegiate skiers to summer AWSA tournaments outside of their school season.

- National Show Ski Association (NSSA) Joel Shapiro, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- National Water Ski Racing Association (NWSRA) Cheryl Ruston: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Ruston announced membership numbers for ski racing are down and are being reviewed. NWSRA hopes to send 8-10 skiers to Worlds this year.
- USA Adaptive Water Ski & Wake Sports (USA-AWSWS) Matt Oberholtz: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Poggetto stated there has been an increase in membership over the last year due to the adaptive veteran clinics. Worlds will be held at Shortline Lake in Elk Grove, Calif. in September 2023.
- U.S. Hydrofoil Association (USHA) Charlie Buckley, President (Verbal): No report
- American Water Ski Association (AWSA) Lyman Hardy, President: Hardy stated over 600 participants skied in AWSA Nationals in 2022. This year, AWSA Nationals will be held in Okeeheelee Park in West Palm Beach, Fla. and run on four lakes over four days. Nationals bid form and contract have been updated. All Pro-Tour events in the U.S. will return to their previous sites. AWSA hired a contractor to run its social media platforms.
- Pan Am and IWWF Updates Dana Garcia: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Garcia stated that the USA is underrepresented at the IWWF and does not have a voice. Garcia has continued to push to have a bigger voice in decisions. Minutes from several IWWF meetings are not public and have not been shared with the U.S. Garcia gets the news on decisions without seeing the minutes from meetings.

18. Old Business

There was no old business.

19. New Business

 Calendar Year Membership Cycle vs. Rolling Membership Cycle – Johanningmeier brought up this discussion on behalf of NSSA. He stated that a bulk of show ski tournaments happens in June with the season beginning in April. During this time, membership statuses are needing to be checked constantly and club secretaries are having to check each of these requirements for everyone on the team.

Boudreaux said the challenge with our current set up is none of the dates assigned to a member – renewal date, Safe Sport training date, official ratings, etc. are the same and all expire at different times. He also said that nearly half (4,900) of membership transactions are on auto-renew.

Ribley stated that different start dates and expirations dates has made it a nightmare for club secretaries.

Hanson stated, if all dates are set to expire on December 31, not everyone is going to get the full 12 months of membership. Most members renew in the summertime, specifically in June.

Boudreaux stated that it would take approximately 150 hours of work on the backend of our new membership system to make any changes to the membership expiration date (\$7,500). Additionally, if a change like this is made, it would have a financial impact on the organization in the short term – the first year of the calendar year cycle.

Harris stated USA-WSWS doesn't know if auto-renewal helps yet, because this is the first year of it. This would solve one of the problems if everyone was on it. Hanson noted that members are not "current" even if their dues are paid through auto renewal. Members still need to log into the system and sign their annual waiver and ensure their Safe Sport training is valid as well.

Flynn mentioned the similarity between our challenges (multiple statues and dates for various things) and the NCAA Clearinghouse. Schools can view all collegiate athletes' information in one place via the Clearinghouse and something similar could be an option for USA-WSWS.

Stevens stated members would get upset about the concept of having to pay a full year of membership if they are only going to ski one tournament and this could turn away AWSA members.

Kingsmill stated this would be detrimental to collegiate skiers. Most collegiate skiers do not need to renew their membership until September, so they would essentially only be getting four months of membership.

Ruston stated that Ski Racing's big event is in late October, and it would be hard to get people to pay full membership if it's just going to expire in a few months.

ACTION ITEM: Archambeau to put together a task force to review the membership cycle based on the concerns of each Sport Discipline. There could potentially be different rules (expiration dates) for each discipline.

• Review the online sanctioning and registration tools from World of Water Skiers

Robbins stated there are tools within the World Water Skiers technology for local clubs to use for membership and promotion and could replace online registration, sanctioning, etc.

Boudreaux stated this would mainly be for sanctioning initially and would be generic, but would be customized to meet our needs.

Harris stated there should be a confidentiality agreement executed prior to any discussions.

Robbins stated all sport discipline presidents would need to send forward someone with IT knowledge to give insight to needed features.

- Motion by Archambeau and seconded by Koehler to reassemble the USA-WSWS IT Advisory Group to explore possible IT integration with World Water Ski platform – approved
- **Motion** by Byrne and seconded by Ribley to disenfranchise the time and date committee **approved**
- USA-WSWS Towboat Committee

Robbins suggested the current USA-WSWS Towboat Committee should be left as a "special committee" to be used on an "as needed basis" since the committee has been inactive. Hardy stated that the USA-WSWS towboat committee does not test AWSA boats as only AWSA does this.

20. Next Meeting

Robbins took roll and turned the meeting over to Boudreaux who gave a brief overview regarding the organization's current banking situation with Bank First. USA-WSWS has two accounts – an operating account and a money market savings account. Combined, these two

accounts currently have more than \$400,000+ in them. The FDIC only insures up to \$250,000 worth of deposits at one bank. It was discussed whether USA-WSWS should diversify some of its financial holdings to another bank or within Bank First via distributions to other institutions within their network to get under the \$250,000 FDIC insured limit and protect all of the organization's funds. Diversifying through other institutions in the Bank First network will cost a half to a full point of potential interest. Mike Molepske, Chairman/CEO of Bank First and USA-WSWS member, provided a brief update on the current status of the banking industry and offered a few options for the board to consider.

Motion by Shapiro and second by Johanningmeier to keep all current assets within Bank First – **approved**

Motion by Lee and second by Johanningmeier to diversify the investments within the Bank First holdings through their partner institutions to stay under the FDIC insured limit of \$250,000 to minimize the risk while maximizing the available interest options. The Executive Committee will act as the trustee and work with Bank First to determine the best way to allocate the funds – **approved**

Archambeau shared that he will be sending out 2023 USA-WSWS Committee appointments/rosters for approval by the board via electronic ballot shortly.

Boudreaux shared the first quarter "snapshot" financials with the board prior to the meeting (P&L, Balance Sheet and finance notes) along with the current bank balances as of March 31, 2023.

Boudreaux provided the following HQ updates:

• Administration

Boat Insurance – Many clubs are facing challenges with acquiring affordable towboat insurance for boats used in tournaments and/or modified boats used in show ski events to meet USA-WSWS sanctioned event criteria now that Global Marine/Chubb has refused to add the sanctioned event rider within their policies. A questionnaire was sent to all clubs, and we received information from 65 respondents. A call was conducted with EPIC (insurance broker) to discuss challenges and formulate solutions for member clubs. Ski Safe is the organization's official insurance partner and will write most policies. However, the premiums are typically more expensive. Unfortunately, USA-WSWS cannot dictate/influence what Ski Safe charges for premiums or what they are willing (or unwilling) to insure), but we will continue to advocate for the best

prices/coverages for our members. Through the information gathering process, we have identified a handful of other carriers, in addition to Ski Safe, willing to write policies that our member services team can share with members who inquire.

 Pan Am Games 2027 – Found out from the USOPC that the Pan Am Sports Program Commission will be making the recommendation to the Executive Board to ask the Pan Am Sports General Assembly in Santiago, Oct. 20-21, for water ski/wakeboard to be removed from the 2027 Pan Games in Barranguilla. This is not a surprise, but it is the first time we have seen something official on the topic. The talk has been that the Pan Am Games and other regional games would mirror their offered sports to those of the Olympic Games. For example, if squash is voted by the IOC to be included in the 2028 Olympic Games, Pan Am would put it in the sports program for the 2027 Pan Am Games as well. Boudreaux is working with IWWF and the IWWF Pan Am Confederation to lobby the decision makers in Columbia to select water ski/wakeboard as one of the country's selections as an included sport. A letter to key delegates in Columbia will be sent shortly along with an invite to the United States to attend a water ski event (likely the AWSA Nationals) and tour a cable wake park. IWWF is working on a public/private venture to construct a cable park in Columbia as part of our pitch.

Marketing

- Get on the Water Planning for the 2023 Get on the Water learn to ski program is underway and clubs can sanction events from June 1 – Aug 31 at no cost. The goal is to surpass last year's 50+ events and nearly 900 participants.
- Women's Certification Program in partnership with MasterCraft's Let Her Rip campaign gets underway on May 1. Any female USA-WSWS members during the months of May, June or July who become or recertify to be a trained driver, instructor or safety director will get their official/training fees comped by MasterCraft through the promotion.
- RTH-TV app The streaming app is live (still in beta and being updated weekly with more content from water ski/wakeboard as well as other partners) and can be found in the Apple store and on Roku TV. Currently, the water ski/wakeboard section has nine events from 2022 on the app and a water ski history section with several videos as well. We are still waiting on RTH-TV to upload the 2022 D1 Show Ski Nationals and 2022 IWWF Show Ski World Championships in addition to a few other events from last year as well as the most recent podcasts, the Wake Sports Festival and the HOF Induction Ceremony. Once these videos are added we will make a formal announcement to promote the app to members.

The Foundation HOF induction was streamed live on the app,. and there are plans to live stream other 2023 upcoming events via The Water Ski Broadcasting Company as well.

<u>Events</u>

- 2023 Wake Sports Festival USA-WSWS and USA Wakeboard hosted the inaugural event on April 14-15, 2023 in partnership with Polk County Sports Marketing on the new "Championship Ski Lake" in Auburndale, FL. The event was a USA Wakeboard Team qualifier along with a Pan Am Games Trials for the pro riders, where one male (Daniel Johnson) and one female (Mary Morgan Howell) were selected to the Pan Am Games team. In between events, there was a wake sports exhibition ski show that featured a ballet line, doubles skiers, barefoot skiers, kneeboarders and hydrofoil riders. The event was live streamed on the <u>USA-WSWS YouTube Channel</u>.
- USA-WSWS Adaptive Clinics (5) Five locations have been confirmed this summer for adaptive learn to water ski clinics. Each location received equipment last year via the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs Grant. USA-WSWS is covering operational costs (approximately \$1,000 per location or \$5,000 total) for the events in 2023.

Grew asked when we would hear about the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs application for an adaptive grant for 2024. Boudreaux stated that we should know if we were approved or not by September 30, 2023.

<u>Communications</u>

Website Redesign with USOPC – Content transition from the old site to the new site has begun. The Go live date is tentatively set for May 31, but realistically can be anytime between May 31 and July 1. Below is a screenshot of the homepage. The navigation will be the same as the current site but with a "fresh" and "cleaner" look. Administration

- Alcohol and Drug Policy The Risk Management Committee drafted an alcohol/drug policy for use at USA-WSWS sanctioned events. AWSA and Collegiate have specific language in their rule books regarding use of alcohol and/or mind-altering drugs during sanctioned events, but USA-WSWS does not have a formal policy that covers all Sports Disciplines. Below is the proposed language to add to the USA-WSWS Safety Handbook.
 - 4.03 No skier or official shall be allowed to participate in any sanctioned tournament, practice, clinic, or other sanctioned event if, in the opinions of the Safety Director, Chief Judge, or other event officials, the individual is under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other mind-altering substance, or if his participation would be a danger to himself or others. During the competition, the Safety Director, Chief Judge, or other appropriate event official may at any time request that the event be paused in order to address any skier's or official's action or condition. Alcohol, illegal drugs, marijuana, or other mind-altering substances may not be consumed by officials or participants prior to or during their participation in the event or in violation of the Local Organizing Club's rules.

<u>Marketing</u>

 Get on the Water – Summer Learn to Ski Clinics kicked off in June and run through the end of August. As of July 20, 32 clubs are set to host 80 sanctioned events with more than 900 anticipated participants. We worked with Radar to create this overview video -

- Women's Certification Program This was a promotion in which MasterCraft covered the cost for any female USA-WSWS member to become an instructor, trained driver, or safety coordinator during the months of April/May/June in partnership with their "Let Her Rip" campaign. The program was very successful with more than 50 female members taking advantage of the promotion, including 22 Safety Coordinators, 18 Level-1 Instructors, 13 Trained Boat Drivers, 5 Adaptive Instructors and 2 NSSA Class A Learner's Permits. Unfortunately, MasterCraft said they would not be able to support the initiative moving forward due to financial constraints.
- Rafflebox 50/50 Fundraiser In partnership with Rafflebox Technologies, <u>USA-WSWS launched a 50/50 fundraiser</u> that will directly benefit each of the nine sport discipline organizations as well as our learn to ski programs. The raffle launched on July 17 and runs through Aug. 28. The drawing will take place on Aug. 29.

- American Boating Channel (ABC) ABC launched a boating focused Free Ad-Supported Streaming Television (FAST) channel earlier this year. We worked with them to add USA-WSWS content (18 total videos) in the towed water sports category within the channel. A <u>press announcement</u> was made on June 28. The channel is currently on Fire TV and Roku.

 - **Website Redesign** The redesign of the new <u>www.usawaterski.org</u> launched in late June. Thus far, we have received positive responses to the new look site.
 - Hit It! Podcast Since inception, there have been a total of 12,200 downloads of podcast episodes. • This year's Hall of Fame Banquet was a memorable event and a successful fundraiser.

- We plan to have the 2024 banquet on April 6, 2024 at the Nora Mayo Hall in Winter Haven, Fla.
- Water Ski Artifacts The Foundation currently owns artifacts not being displayed at the Visitors Center in Polk County, Fla. They are stored in a cold storage warehouse and not easily accessible. Dr. Bob Reich has formed a committee to explore options for handling this material, and one of these options would be to lend some of this material to the Water Ski Cultural Museum in Oregon. We are also planning to have other material displayed in Lake City, Minnesota, the birthplace of water skiing.
- We have an agreement with Polk County to display museum material at the Visit Central Florida Welcome Center in Davenport, Fla. for an initial term of 5 years beginning in 2021 with additional one-year renewal options.
- The Foundation's License Agreement with Correct Craft to operate the Cable Park at Lake Myrtle has been modified and is now acceptable to both parties. The Foundation is no longer actively pursuing the sale of the property. The property is leased by a successful cable park operator, and its value is enhanced by Margaritaville (RV camp site) on one side and the completed 3-event water ski lake on the other side.
- We believe the Foundation can continue to add value to the sport of water skiing through the Hall of Fame and with our scholarship program. We are now exploring a Collegiate Team Grant Program initiative to further support college water skiing.

12. Executive Committee Report – Bob Archambeau, Chair

13. Executive Director's Report – Nate Boudreaux, Executive Director

The written report was included in the BOD packet. Boudreaux gave an overview via PowerPoint presentation. Each staff member stood up and gave a report about items within their responsibilities.

Boudreaux stated that USA-WSWS is in the best financial position coming out of 2022 than it has been in a long time. A Bank First money market account was opened in 2022 and some of these funds were used in early January to pay insurance premiums. Paying our insurance in a lump sum saved the organization approximately \$5,500 in finance charges. In 2022, a total of \$539,542 was generated in grant and/or external funding. Over the past four years, \$1,011,644 was generated from external sources through the USOPC, government agencies (PPP loans and Employee Retention Credits) and grants.

John Lipscomb introduced his adaptive program. Boudreaux thanked John for his assistance in providing a template for how USA-WSWS could use the veterans grant to put on events in 2022 and says USA-WSWS will continue this in the next year on a smaller scale.

Melanie Hanson presented membership statistics from 2022. Membership numbers are almost back up to where they were before the pandemic. Boudreaux introduced the new demographic findings that have been collected with the new membership registration system.

Boudreaux presented social media statistics on behalf of Emily Hammer. There has been a large percentage of growth year over year.

Scott Atkinson presented the 2022 communications accomplishments. Polk County Sports Marketing provided funding for the 100th year anniversary magazine. All magazines from 1951 to 1970 were digitally archived for members thanks to Lynn Novakofski. By the end of the year, all magazines up to Sept. 2009 will be uploaded to the archive. Next project will be to digitize videos that USA-WSWS has on old cassette and VHS tapes. There has been an increase in website traffic from 2021 to 2022. Scott credits this to social media and monthly newsletters. The podcast was launched in 2022 with Tyler Boyd as the host. The USOPC will be revamping websites for the NGBs that will be more focused on the individual NGB.

Molly Crum gave an overview of the veteran adaptive learn to ski program. Adaptive events for veterans were hosted in 11 states in 2022 and saw more than 125 veteran with disability participants. Crum also reported on the Girls Inc. Learn to Ski program. Thirty-two girls participated in 2-hour sessions over 5 weeks. The program was a recipient of the USOPC 2022 DE&I Choice Award for excellence in diversity, equity and inclusion.

Chris Zukas, USA-WSWS newest staffer, shared three new marketing initiatives launching in 2023 that will utilize member stories and emphasize younger athletes in the sport. TikTok was mentioned as a new content outlet for social media and a question was asked from the floor concerning the application's reputation with privacy and security issues.

14. Treasurer's Report – Joel Johanningmeier, Secretary/Treasurer (Verbal)

The written report with the budget and budget notes was included in the BOD packet.

Johanningmeier gave an overview of the financials for 2022. Long-term investments are down because of the current state of the market.

Boudreaux stated that USA-WSWS typically budgets low on income and high on expenses, which in the past has been a successful model.

USA-WSWS requires that the organization be listed as an additional insured for all boats used in sanctioned events per our published Towboat Insurance Requirements for sanctioned events. We are receiving increased pushback from insurance companies regarding this requirement, especially in the case of club-owned, twin/triple rig, or modified boats. Many insurers don't want to insure a club-owned boat.

Poggetto facilitated discussion of commercial insurance versus personal insurance for club boat options. Boudreaux suggested that further discussions be conducted in the future about this among other disciplines if they are interested. Cheryl Ruston explained that ski racing boats cannot be covered by insurance. They are only covered within sanctioned events.

- Athlete Advisory Council (AAC) Alex Lauretano, Chair (Verbal): No Report
- Water Sports Industry Association (WSIA): No Report
- American Kneeboard Association (AKA) Kenny Stuart, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- USA Wakeboard (USA-WB) Cathy Williams, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Williams introduced the plan for a cable club concept within USA-WSWS. IWWF defines cable as an independent discipline, so this would have the potential to become its own discipline within USA-WSWS. Williams said her challenge is that wake does not have clubs similar to water ski. Events this year include the Pan Am Games and Wake Sports Festival coming up in 2023. The Wake Sports Festival will be used as a Pan Am qualifier for wakeboard while including kneeboard, barefoot and hydrofoil exhibitions.

• American Barefoot Club (ABC) – Lauren Ehlers, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.

Ehlers stated that ABC hosted an IWWF event in San Marcos, TX. Livestreaming has been a struggle in the past due to the speed of the boats but has now become a great resource that shows what the skier is doing on the shore. Elite and Junior

World Championships are taking place in Australia in early February. Under 23 is a new division that was created in order to give these skiers a chance to ski in worlds since the 2020 tournament was cancelled.

• National Collegiate Water Ski Association (NCWSA) – Christy Kingsmill, Chair (verbal):

Kingsmill stated Iowa State University, one of their "powerhouse" schools, is not allowed to compete because their university defines them as a water sport and is not allowing any club water sports. The university brought in a third-party to assess all sport clubs at the school and disbanded the team as well as other sport clubs because of their involvement with water. NCWSA, Midwest Region, and Harley Wallace (Risk Management Committee) have been working on this issue as it could have the potential of happening at other schools. NCWSA plans to use Grace Stanke, former collegiate water skier and newly crowned Miss America, at events for promotion of the sport. Boudreaux mentioned the bridge between collegiate and AWSA and how the AWSA Midwest Region was able to introduce collegiate skiers to summer AWSA tournaments outside of their school season.

- National Show Ski Association (NSSA) Joel Shapiro, President: The written report was included in the BOD packet.
- National Water Ski Racing Association (NWSRA) Cheryl Ruston: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Ruston announced membership numbers for ski racing are down and are being reviewed. NWSRA hopes to send 8-10 skiers to Worlds this year.
- USA Adaptive Water Ski & Wake Sports (USA-AWSWS) Matt Oberholtz: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Poggetto stated there has been an increase in membership over the last year due to the adaptive veteran clinics. Worlds will be held at Shortline Lake in Elk Grove, Calif. in September 2023.
- U.S. Hydrofoil Association (USHA) Charlie Buckley, President (Verbal): No report
- American Water Ski Association (AWSA) Lyman Hardy, President: Hardy stated over 600 participants skied in AWSA Nationals in 2022. This year, AWSA Nationals will be held in Okeeheelee Park in West Palm Beach, Fla. and run on four lakes over four days. Nationals bid form and contract have been updated. All Pro-Tour events in the U.S. will return to their previous sites. AWSA hired a contractor to run its social media platforms.
- Pan Am and IWWF Updates Dana Garcia: The written report was included in the BOD packet. Garcia stated that the USA is underrepresented at the IWWF and does not have a voice. Garcia has continued to push to have a bigger voice in decisions. Minutes from several IWWF meetings are not public and have not been shared with the U.S. Garcia gets the news on decisions without seeing the minutes from meetings.

18. Old Business

There was no old business.

19. New Business

• Calendar Year Membership Cycle vs. Rolling Membership Cycle – Johanningmeier brought up this discussion on behalf of NSSA. He stated that a bulk of show ski tournaments happens in June with the season beginning in April. During this time, membership statuses are needing to be checked constantly and club secretaries are having to check each of these requirements for everyone on the team.

Boudreaux said the challenge with our current set up is none of the dates assigned to a member – renewal date, Safe Sport training date, official ratings, etc. are the same and all expire at different times. He also said that nearly half (4,900) of membership transactions are on auto-renew.

Ribley stated that different start dates and expirations dates has made it a nightmare for club secretaries.

Hanson stated, if all dates are set to expire on December 31, not everyone is going to get the full 12 months of membership. Most members renew in the summertime, specifically in June.

Boudreaux stated that it would take approximately 150 hours of work on the backend of our new membership system to make any changes to the membership expiration date (\$7,500). Additionally, if a change like this is made, it would have a financial impact on the organization in the short term – the first year of the calendar year cycle.

Harris stated USA-WSWS doesn't know if auto-renewal helps yet, because this is the first year of it. This would solve one of the problems if everyone was on it. Hanson noted that members are not "current" even if their dues are paid through auto renewal. Members still need to log into the system and sign their annual waiver and ensure their Safe Sport training is valid as well.

Flynn mentioned the similarity between our challenges (multiple statues and dates for various things) and the NCAA Clearinghouse. Schools can view all collegiate athletes' information in one place via the Clearinghouse and something similar could be an option for USA-WSWS.

Stevens stated members would get upset about the concept of having to pay a full year of membership if they are only going to ski one tournament and this could turn away AWSA members.

Kingsmill stated this would be detrimental to collegiate skiers. Most collegiate skiers do not need to renew their membership until September, so they would essentially only be getting four months of membership.

Ruston stated that Ski Racing's big event is in late October, and it would be hard to get people to pay full membership if it's just going to expire in a few months.

ACTION ITEM: Archambeau to put together a task force to review the membership cycle based on the concerns of each Sport Discipline. There could potentially be different rules (expiration dates) for each discipline.

• Review the online sanctioning and registration tools from World of Water Skiers

Robbins stated there are tools within the World Water Skiers technology for local clubs to use for membership and promotion and could replace online registration, sanctioning, etc.

Boudreaux stated this would mainly be for sanctioning initially and would be generic, but would be customized to meet our needs.

Harris stated there should be a confidentiality agreement executed prior to any discussions.

Robbins stated all sport discipline presidents would need to send forward someone with IT knowledge to give insight to needed features.

- Motion by Archambeau and seconded by Koehler to reassemble the USA-WSWS IT Advisory Group to explore possible IT integration with World Water Ski platform – approved
- **Motion** by Byrne and seconded by Ribley to disenfranchise the time and date committee **approved**
- USA-WSWS Towboat Committee

Robbins suggested the current USA-WSWS Towboat Committee should be left as a "special committee" to be used on an "as needed basis" since the committee has been inactive. Hardy stated that the USA-WSWS towboat committee does not test AWSA boats as only AWSA does this.

Thank you, Nate Boudreaux, for the five successful years that you led our organization. In those five years we faced some highly unusual challenges and dealt with significant issues that took an incredible amount of time and effort. We appreciate all that you have done and best wishes in your next role.

2023 was a crazy year to deal with. It forced us to take our eyes off the ball on occasion. We need to get back to supporting our purpose...

Website - Successfully transitioned to a new website server/host for the second time in three years, moving an extraordinary amount of content. We had an intro call with the USOPC and Next League on Jan. 19 and launched a new website on June 13, a completely new system to learn and configure. In 2023, the website generated **125,418** unique visitors. *Note: The site suffered a network disruption for six weeks from Aug-Sept that caused many of the high trafficked pages of the site to be offline.*

E-Newsletters - USA-WSWS produces three e-newsletters each month (AWSA version, NSSA version and USA-WSWS version) with customized content targeted to each audience. Open rates continued to climb, improving from 47% in 2022 to 49.6% in 2023.

Magazine - One of the goals this year was to make all archived issues of *The Water Skier* available online and that goal was met early in 2023. All issues are now available in the Members Portal via Digimag or PDF dating back to 1952. We once again remained under budget for the year. We are fortunate to have some talented athletes and freelancers who volunteer to contribute instructional articles and photography, and we have developed relationships with some talented paid freelance writers and photographers who understand our non-profit budget constraints.

Hit It! Podcast – Hosted by Tyler Boyd and sponsored by Visit Central Florida, the monthly podcast features current and former stars from each of the Sports Disciplines. Recorded 12 podcasts in 2023. Total number of downloads for 2023 was 11,317, which represents a 63% increase from 2022.

Programs

Get on the Water program - USA-WSWS recognizes that new skiers are essential to keeping towed water sports thriving. *Get on the Water* was a three-month promotion from June-August that provided affiliated clubs with free sanctioning and free guest memberships. In 2023, **33** clubs hosted **92 events** (51 in 2022 – 80% increase from 2022) with **1,203 participants** (689 in 2022 – 75% increase from 2022) from June-August 2023.

Adaptive Water Ski Clinic program – The Adaptive Learn to Water Ski Program presented by S-Lines consisted of four (4) events hosted by water ski clubs around the country. The program welcomed sixty-six (66) people with disabilities to water skiing.

Girls, Inc. Learn to Ski program - Through a grant from the Women's Sports Foundation and Sports 4 Life, we were able to host a free learn to ski program for minority girls in Central Florida. The program was hosted by Cypress Gardens Show Ski team and Central Florida Show Ski team from June-July 2023, and each host club hosted a total of five, 2-hour sessions. A total of **32 girls** participated in the program. Five girls are still skiing regularly at practice with their ski club and one girl participates in Central Florida Show Ski Team shows.

For the second consecutive year, we were awarded the USOPC Choice Award for program excellence in Diversity, Equity and Inclusion which included a \$5,000 grant.

National Teams

- IWWF U17 Waterski World Championships The U.S. U21 Water Ski Team won the overall team gold medal and five U.S. athletes combined to earn six individual medals in respective events at the 11th IWWF World Under 21 Waterski Championships, June 14-17, at Boca Laguna in Chapala, Jalisco, Mexico.
- IWWF U21 Waterski World Championships The U.S. Junior Water Ski Team won the overall team gold medal and three U.S. water ski athletes earned individual medals in respective events at the 19th IWWF World Under 17 Waterski Championships, Jan 5-8,

at Lago Los Morros in San Bernardo, Chile. The United States tallied 7,810.76 points in winning the gold medal for the 13th time in the history of the biennial event.

- IWWF Elite Water Ski Worlds The U.S. Elite Water Ski Team won the overall team gold medal and eight U.S. water ski athletes won individual medals in respective events at the 38th IWWF World Waterski Championships, Oct. 10-15, at Jack Travers' International Tournament Skiing and Sunset Lakes in Groveland, Fla. The United States tallied 8,291.04 points in winning its first world team title since 2017 and 28th since the inception of the biennial tournament.
- IWWF Senior Pan American Championships All six U.S. Senior Pan American Championships Teams won overall gold medals and 42 U.S. athletes combined to earn 81 individual medals at the 2023 IWWF Pan American Senior Waterski Championships, Sept. 21-24, at Skyview Lake in Harmony, N.C. The U.S. teams consisted of 32 water ski athletes from six – 35+, 45+, 55+, 65+, 70+ and 75+ – age divisions.
- **IWWF Disabled Worlds** The USA Adaptive Water Ski Team won the gold medal at the 15th Barbara Bolding/Jim Grew Fund Disabled Water Ski World Championships, Sept. 11-17, at Shortline Lake in Elk Grove, Calif. Canada earned the silver medal and Great Britain earned the bronze medal. U.S. team members earned a total of 27 individual medals, including 11 gold, 10 silver and 6 bronze.

2024 Budget/Finance Notes

Overall, with a conservative budget (low on income/high on expense), we are projecting a small loss in 2024 (-\$6,973). This is not uncommon. In 2022, we budgeted for a \$39,000 loss and ended the year with a surplus. In 2023, we budgeted a \$33,000 loss and we are tracking for break even or a small surplus.

3012 Active Membership – This projection is always a moving target due to deferred revenue. Based on similar membership numbers and with deferred revenue, we are projecting \$870,000.

3112 Licensing/USOPC digital media agreement – This number is cut in half from the USOPC for 2024 (\$25,000 vs. \$50,000). We anticipate this being the last year of the agreement.

5116 Travel/Marketing – Significant more events for Chris Zukas to attend and manage in 2024 including Wake Sports Festival and Pan Am Wakeboard Championships.

5354 Team USA Misc. Expense – Once again we are budgeting to provide Team USA gear (polos, sun shirts and backpacks) to various teams competing in IWWF World Events.

5364 Towboat Testing Miscellaneous – A \$10,000 distribution to AWSA is included in this line item which wasn't accounted for previously.

3516 National Tournament Entry Fees – Per the latest version of the AWSA/LOC agreement, USA-WSWS is taking less money from the entry fees (5%) with more going back to the LOC. Our take was 10% in 2023.

5548 Webcast Production – Budgeting \$7,500 to allocate to AWSA for webcast in 2024. This overall spend is less about \$10,000 as Polk County Sports Marketing will now be paying for the NSSA show ski webcast directly (and not having USA-WSWW pay for the production with funds from the PCSM sponsorship).

3535/5524 Other Events – This includes income and expense associated with the Wake Sports Festival, 2024 Pan Am Wakeboard Championships and another TBD pro event hosted by PCSM to be held on the new lake in Auburndale.

4018/6018 Merchandise Income and Expense – Projecting less income from merchandise sales at events (via Fine Designs). This was hit and miss in 2023 and we expect more of the same in 2024.

5282 Marketing/Sport Development – This includes a \$5,000 payment to AWSA Jr. Development.

3125/5299 Grant Income – This is the US Department of Veteran Affairs grant to conduct the veteran adaptive clinics. We net about \$2,000 of "income" on this program.

7012 Bank Charges and Investment Fees – In previous years, the management fees from UBS were taken out of the total investment earnings. Altruic suggested we budget annually for these fees in this account.

7019 Development Computer Systems – Budgeting some additional funds (\$10,000) to upgrade Officials program.

8064 Contract Work – Budgeting \$7,500 for special video projects with TWBC.

2023 USA Water Ski and Wake Sports Risk Management Report

Submitted by Harley Wallace, Committee Chairman

The Risk Management Committee engaged in two rules discussion at the request of staff this year. Both discussions resulted in a policy recommendation from the Risk Management Committee.

In July Risk Management was asked to evaluate our current alcohol policy and consider adopting stronger language that would clearly prohibit officials from consuming alcohol while still officiating at an event. This discussion resulted in the following policy recommendation, which was sent to the Executive Director for inclusion in the November Conference call. If this language was not adopted in a conference call, it should be considered for adoption at the January Board meeting.

Alcohol Proposal:

Add the following language to the USA-WSWS Safety Manual.

4.03 No skier or official shall be allowed to participate in any sanctioned tournament, practice, clinic, or other sanctioned event if, in the opinions of the Safety Director, Chief Judge, or other event officials, the individual is under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other mind-altering substance, or if his participation would be a danger to himself or others. During the competition, the Safety Director, Chief Judge, or other appropriate event official may at any time request that the event be paused in order to address any skier's or official's action or condition. Alcohol, illegal drugs, marijuana, or other mind-altering substances may not be consumed by officials or participants prior to or during their participation in the event or in violation of the Local Organizing Club's rules.

Risk Management was also asked to evaluate the current lightning safety guidelines that are available for our officials and members to reference. After discussion within the committee, Risk Management is proposing the following suggestions:

Lightning suggestions:

Replace the lightning fact sheet in the safety clinic materials with the more comprehensive one that NOAA has on their website. This fact sheet is attached to this report.

Add the following sentence to the Safety Manual Rule 4.0 that states "For lightning safety recommendations reference the material included in the USA-WSWS safety clinic and posted on the safety resource page of the USA-WSWS website."

Recommend to HQ that our clinic material, including the lightning safety fact sheet, is available on the USA-WSWS website under Safety Resources so everyone has access to it.

Safety National Program

It's a common situation — a thunderstorm is approaching or nearby. Are conditions outside safe, or is it time to head for safe place? Not wanting to appear overly cautious, many people wait far too long before reacting to this potentially deadly weather threat.

Anyone who is outside in the summer needs to understand some basic information about lightning. Each year, thunderstorms produce an estimated 20 to 25 million cloud-to-ground lightning flashes in the United States — each one of those flashes is a potential killer. Some of those flashes strike directly under the storm where it is raining, but some of the flashes reach out away from the storm where people perceive the lightning threat to be low or nonexistent, and catch people by surprise.

Based on cases documented by the National Weather Service in recent years, about 30 people are killed by lightning each year and hundreds more are injured, some suffering devastating neurological injuries that persist for the rest of their lives. About two thirds of the deaths are associated with outdoor recreational activities.

Officials responsible for sports outdoor activities need to understand thunderstorms and lightning to make educated decisions on when to seek safety. Without this knowledge, officials may base their decisions on personal experience and or a desire to complete the activity. Unfortunately, decisions based on past experience or a desire to complete the activity can put the lives of those involved at risk.

For organized outdoor activities, the National Weather Service recommends that organizers have a lightning safety plan and follow it without exception. The plan should give clear and specific safety guidelines to eliminate errors in judgment. These guidelines should address the following questions.

- When should activities be stopped?Where should people go for safety?
- When should activities be resumed?
- Who should monitor the weather and make the decision to stop activities?
- What should be done if someone is struck by lightning?

Before an activity or event, organizers should listen to the latest forecast to determine the likelihood of thunderstorms. There are many good sources of up-to-date weather information including NOAA Weather Radio. If thunderstorms are forecast, organizers should consider canceling or postponing the activity or event. In some cases, the event can be moved indoors. Once people start to arrive at an event, the guidelines in the lightning safety plan should be followed. Officials should monitor weather conditions, weather radar, and lightning detection technology for developing or approaching storms. Below is some information to consider when making a lightning safety plan. In addition, NOAA has developed <u>lightning safety toolkits</u> for organizations and venues to use in making a plan. Below are some of the considerations in making a lightning safety plan.

When should activities be stopped?

In general, a significant lightning threat extends outward from the base of a thunderstorm cloud about 6 to 10 miles. It's important to account for the time it will take for everyone to get to safety. Here are some criteria that could be used to stop activities.

- If you see lightning. The ability to see lightning varies depending on the time of day, weather conditions, and obstructions such as trees, mountains, etc. In clear air, and especially at night, lightning can be seen from storms more than 10 miles away provided that obstructions don't limit the view of the thunderstorm.
- If you hear thunder. Thunder can usually be heard for a distance of about 10 miles provided that there is no background noise. Traffic, wind, and precipitation may limit the ability to hear thunder to less than 10 miles. If you hear thunder, though, it's a safe bet that the storm is within ten miles.
- If the skies look threatening. Thunderstorms can develop directly overhead and some storms may develop lightning just as they move into an area.

Where should people go for safe shelter?

There is no place outside that is safe when a thunderstorm is in the area. Stop the activity immediately and get to a safe place immediately. Substantial buildings with wiring and plumbing provide the greatest amount of protection. Office buildings, schools, and homes are examples of buildings that would offer good protection. Once inside, stay away from windows and doors and anything that conducts electricity such as corded phones, wiring, plumbing, and anything connected to these. Note that small outdoor buildings including dugouts, rain shelters, sheds, etc., are NOT SAFE. In the absence of a substantial building, a hard-topped metal vehicle with the windows closed provides good protection.

When should activities be resumed?

Because electrical charges can linger in clouds after a thunderstorm has seemingly passed, experts agree that people should wait at least 30 minutes after the last thunder before resuming outdoor activities.

Who should monitor the weather and make decisions?

Lightning safety plans should specify that someone be designated to monitor the weather for lightning. The lightning monitor should **not** be the coach, umpire, or referee, because these people will be busy and can't adequately monitor conditions. The lightning monitor must know the plan's guidelines and be empowered to assure that the guidelines are followed.

What should be done if someone is struck by lightning?

Most victims can survive a lightning strike; however, they need immediate medical attention. Call 911 for medical help. Victims do not carry an electrical charge. In many cases, the victim's heart and/or breathing may have stopped. CPR or an AED may be needed to revive them. Continue to monitor the victim until medical help arrives. If possible, move the victim to a safer place inside away from the threat of another lightning strike.

From: Leon J. Larson Waterways Education Committee Chairman

Re: Report to the Board, Winter 2024

The Waterways Education Committee has addressed several issues over the past year as Covid restrictions have continued to ease and waterways activities increase. Most were resolved with positive results. The assistance of the Water Sports Industry Association on some of these issues was appreciated.

I continue to be active as Chair of the IWWF Environment and Sustainability Committee. Currently I have updated the IWWF Environment and Sustainability Manual, the IWWF Safety Manual and the USAWS-WS Waterways Education Manual. These documents are available on the IWWF and the USAWS-WS web sites. The IWWF appointment is paramount to the continued access to waterways issues and developments worldwide. My position on the USAWS-WS Risk Management Committee also helps resolve some of the waterway's issues as they pertain to safety.

I also continued my involvement on the Underwriters Laboratories Personal Floatation Device (PFD) Standards Panel. PFD classifications are in the process of being reclassified. Progress on this is almost complete. I continue with the Coast Guard (CG) and the manufacturers to obtain a special use designation for our lightweight neoprene vests that have become so popular but are not yet Coast Guard approved.

The annual meeting of the National Marine Manufacturers Association (NMMA) was held in May 2023 and held virtually. The 2023 Green Sports Alliance (GSA) Summit was held in Seattle, and I was able to attend. Affiliation with these organizations supplies essential contacts and sustainability information essential to the committee's operation. The ability to network with other stakeholders is invaluable. IWWF membership in GSA has been maintained. The GSA is moving toward a more international presence with affiliates in both Europe and Asia.

The Waterways Education Manual and the Gronlund case file are available electronically and continued to help in several of the cases. I continue to keep the committee members active by passing on local issues to them for action and keeping them informed of National issues as well. They have responded well. Most of the issues were resolved favorably, some are still pending. The Committee will continue to upgrade the Waterways Education Manual as new information becomes available.



- 5. Tow Lines & Skier Supplied Handle in Slalom and Jump. Rule Revised

5.09: Tow Lines

d) The competition supplied handle shall be made of 2.50cm to 2.80cm. outside diameter non-slip surface or coating material. There shall be no sharp edges or projections. Handle ends must have protective caps. The attaching ropes must in all cases go through the handle and must be attached so there is no possibility of movement between the rope and handle when in use. The minimum certified breaking load of the handle shall be 408kg applied at the rate of 290kg for a minute at two load points 9cm apart at the centre of the handle with the ends supported at the rope holes. The handle shall be attached to the rope so that it is perpendicular to the direction of the line. The handle

measurement is the end-to-end length of the handle and must conform to the dimensions shown in the diagram below. The handle must be similar in design and construction to the picture below.



5.11: Skier Supplied Handle in Slalom and Jump

For Slalom and Jump each competitor may furnish his own handle. The skier supplied handle must conform to Rule 5.09 other than the outside diameter. For a skier supplied handle, there is no minimum or maximum outside diameter. The skier shall notify the Jetty Marshall, at least three skiers before his turn, of his wish to change handles. It's the skier's responsibility that the handle is in tolerance before and remains within tolerance after skiing. The handle must comply with all rules and safety requirements.

Change unanimously approved.

6. Tricks- The Trick Working Group has had a meeting. No Report to date. Consider points, degrees of difficulty etc. Recognized that the current point allocation system does not properly recognize the degree of difficulty

7. Number of People in the Boat For Tricks. Rule Revised

9.01: General Trick Event Rules

For the boat, see (5.01), for the tow lines see (5.10), for the tolerances see (6.02). There may be 2 or 3 people in the boat for tricks at the discretion of the CJ before the event starts and the same conditions must remain throughout the Competition.

The eyeTrick judging technology and method is approved for use in all classes of Competitions subject to the modifications to rules: 9.12, 9.15, 9.18 and 9.20.

Change unanimously approved.

8. New Tricks

The following new tricks has been submitted for approval: BFLSLB – Video was reviewed. Points awarded – 850 BFLSLO – Video was reviewed. Points awarded – 900 FFLF – rFFLF – Video was reviewed. Points awarded for reverse trick – 850 FFLSL5F – Video was reviewed. Points awarded – 950

9. Trick Course- Rule Change

Rule 9.02: Trick Course and Passes

Two buoys approximately 230 metres apart shall establish the approximate area of the beginning of the trick pass from each direction (see 9.24). The boat shall pass either side of the entry buoy at the choice of the skier. Where it is not feasible for a boat to pass on either side, the Homologator, with the agreement of the Chief Judge, may designate that the boat path will be on one side only and shall document such in the Homologation Dossier. The boat should follow a straight path parallel to the Trick Course. The end of the pass shall be

signified by the 20-second time interval only. Each skier shall be allowed two passes through the trick course during which time he may perform as many tricks as he desires.

Change unanimously approved.

10. Jump Boat Path Rule- The Rule Will be added to the Rule Book, however tolerances will not be applied. This is for data collection- one more year. The Cut, Flight, and Cumulative sectors were clarified. Ryan Dodd explained the need to avoid the boat being pulled towards the ramp during the cut phase and to avoid a continuous pull sideways during the flight.

10.11: Boat Path

The skier shall tell the boat driver the path and speed to pass the ramp. The boat shall follow a path through the jump course at the specified distance from the right-hand side of the ramp within the prescribed boat path tolerances. The boat path should have minimal deviation toward the jump ramp while the skier is cutting to and through the jump ramp.

Path Definition

"SPLIT" is the default and defined as middle line between the 15 metre and the 19 metre timing buoys (17 metre line).

Split = Default Split +/- 1 = Split +/- 0.3 metre or 1 foot Split +/- 2 = Split +/- 0.6 metre or 2 feet Split +/- 3 = Split +/- 0.9 metre or 3 feet

Skier options are "Split" with +1, +2, +3 for wide or -1, -2, -3 for narrow.

Boat Path Measurement System

A Boat Path Measurement System, (BPMS) is required for all Record Capability(R), and Rankings Lists(L) events. All jump passes shall be monitored for PATH, CUT, FLIGHT and CUMULATIVE deviation. Data will be collected via WaterSkiConnect during the 2024 ski year. Deviation tolerances and re-ride situations will be established for the 2025 ski year for distance equal to or greater than:

- Record Capability(R), Rankings Lists(L), and Pro events.
 50 metres and greater distances.
- Titled Events (World or Confederation) 40 metre and greater distances.

BPMS may be RTK-GPS or Video based. The use of RTK-GPS systems is preferred and strongly recommended. The BPMS will be installed and calibrated according to the homologation guidelines under the responsibility of the Homologator.

The Chief Judge will assign a Judge or Driver to monitor the BPMS.

Skier requested Path.

The skiers requested boat path shall be measured when the pylon is at NT, (52m from ST) point where the jumper is in a glide ready to turn and cut to the ramp. If the measured deviation is greater than 40cm from the requested boat path, an optional re-ride shall be awarded.

Example: The skier requested path is "SPLIT". The measurement at NT is more then +/- 40cm, an optional reride shall be awarded.

Cut

The CUT Deviation is measured at the pylon when the boat is between 15/19 NT (52m) and 15/19 MT. The CUT calculation is the difference between the values at NT and MT. NT being the point where the jumper is in a glide ready to turn and cut to the ramp. MT being the point where the skier approximately leaves the ramp.

Example: NT is -5cm and MT is +25cm, the difference is a +30cm swing. A positive number would indicate the boat moved away from the ramp. A negative number would indicate that the boat moved towards the ramp during the skiers cut. It is also used to calculate the Cumulative Deviation.

If the CUT Deviation is NEGATIVE (towards the ramp) and is greater than XX cm: (Deviation Values to be Determined Later) If the CUT Deviation is POSITIVE (away from the ramp) and is greater than XX cm: (Deviation Values to be Determined Later)

Flight

The FLIGHT Deviation is the maximum deviation measured at the pylon when the boat is 15/19 MT (82m) and 15/19 ET. The FLIGHT calculation is the difference between the boat position values at MT and ET. MT being the point where the jumper approximately comes off the top of the ramp and begins lift. ET being the point 51 metres down course from the ramp. The calculation is the value at ET minus the value at MT. Example: MT is +30cm and ET is +50cm, the difference is a 20cm swing.

If the FLIGHT Deviation is NEGATIVE (towards the ramp) and is greater than XX cm:

(Deviation Values to be Determined Later)

If the FLIGHT Deviation is POSITIVE (away from the ramp) and is greater than XX cm:

(Deviation Values to be Determined Later)

Cumulative Deviation

The CUMULATIVE Deviation is the sum of the CUT And FLIGHT Deviations. If the CUMULATIVE Deviation is NEGATIVE greater than XX cm: (Deviation Values to be Determined Later) If the CUMLATIVE Deviation is POSITIVE greater than XX cm: (Deviation Values to be Determined Later)

BPMS failure

If during a competition event, a required BPMS fails, end course video (monitored in the Judges' tower) may be used until such time as BPMS is re-established. The Homologator shall note in the Homologation Dossier the event(s) when failure occurred.

Exception: BPMS Not Available – Use of End Course Video

Where use of BPMS is not feasible, the Chief Judge may alternatively, with the concurrence of the Chief Homologator, use End Course Video for monitoring boat path. A Judge or Driver shall be assigned to monitor all jump passes using end-course video and award re-rides for requested boat path. The end course official and the Chief Judge (or the Chief Judge's designee) must agree on any determination. With this situation, the homologation level will be Ranking List(L). The Homologator shall note in the Homologation Dossier the reason(s) that BPMS was not utilised. Where BPMS is not available, end course video shall be uploaded to the respective Confederation for viewing.

End Course Video Requirements

When end course video is used, at a minimum, video shall be recorded for all jumps 50m and greater. See Rule 25 – Homologation Guidelines for video set up and required towboat visible markings.

In instances of potential world records, it is recommended that a standalone end course camera be used as a backup.

Path Review – BPMS / End Course Video


All passes are subject to review for compliance to rules (1.09) (9.01) and this rule including boat path cumulative deviation. Any passes that do not conform may result in the associated score being modified or removed from the IWWF standings lists.

Change unanimously approved.

11. Official Jump Course

The Tech Committee has presented the following document recommended some small changes to tolerances, if the request will be accepted also the Jump course diagram need to be update.

10.16: Official Jump Course



The ramp must be parallel to the jump course and slightly open.

The tolerance for standard jumping is between $+1.00^{\circ}$ and $+2.50^{\circ}$ open.

The tolerance for ski flying is between $+5.00^{\circ}$ and $+7.00^{\circ}$ open.

Open means that the low end of the ramp is turned toward the jump course. The basis of the jump course is the 15ST - 15MT line.

Any marker buoys used for video distance measurement or spectator reference buoys must be a minimum of 8m from the ramp centreline for safety purposes so that they will not interfere with the skier while landing.

JUMP COURSE DIMENSIONS AND TOLERANCES

The" X Axis" is a straight line passing through the 15ST and 15MT buoys. All width dimensions are from the "X axis". The "Y Axis" is a perpendicular line to the Course "X Axis" passing through the 15MT buoy (0,0). All length dimensions are from the "Y Axis".

* It is recommended that all course buoys to be within +/- 5 cm vs +/- 10 cm to ensure course is visually straight per recommendation in rule 25.04

Pre-Gate boat guide buoys are required unless the Chief Judge with the concurrence of the Chief Homologator determine that pre-gate buoys are not feasible, in which case, the Homologator shall note such in the homologation dossier. Placement of the Pre-Gate Buoys should take into consideration and not interfere with the skier's counter cut. An optional turn buoy is recommended ad approximately 350m from the "Y Axis" and 20m from the "X Axis".

The document has been discussed and approved as emended above. Due to this decision also rule 25.04 a) will be emended as follow.

Rule 10.17: Optional Course Turn/Guide Buoys deleted.

25.04: Jump Homologation Guidelines:

- a) Jump Survey
 - 1) Survey methodology and equipment See technical specification (25.05).
 - A jump course must be surveyed (full survey) within 10 days of the event and validated by the Homologator within
 3 days of the event. It is the responsibility of the Homologator to ensure that the buoys have not moved prior to the event. If there is any doubt, the Homologator should make another full survey.
 - 3) The Course X Axis is a straight line that runs through the 15ST buoy and the 15MT buoy.
 - 4) The Course Y Axis is a perpendicular line to the Course X Axis passing through the 15MT buoy (0,0).
 - 5) The Jump Axis is a straight line, passing through the ramp centre, which is parallel to the Course X Axis.
 - 6) The boat path centreline is a line from the middle of the 15ST/19ST gates to the middle of the 15ET/19ET gates.
 - 7) The 15ET buoy and 15EC buoy must be within +/- 4cm of Course X Axis (15ST-15MT) and must visually be straight.
 - 8) The 19ST, 19MT, 19ET and 19EC are parallel to the Course X Axis, must be visually straight and should have a width of 4m +/- 5cm to appear visually straight.
- 9) In instances where the jump course and the slalom course are integrated, it is suggested they are parallel.

18. Definition of Officials Classification – Harmonization of Officials Across the Federations

3.06: Harmonisation of Officials Grades

The World Waterski Council recommends that Confederation and National Federation adopt the following officials' naming protocol.

There will be 4 levels of Officials:

- a) Level 1 (D1, J1, H1, S1)
 - Requires Confederation Testing Approval
 - Can Chief or be an appointed official at World Titled, Confederation Titled, Record "R" and Rankings "L" Events. (Currently - E&A Judge, Pan Am Judge, etc.)

Level 1 Judges will be subject to periodic re-evaluation and or testing by peers in order to retain their qualifications. The test will be prepared and taken under Confederation supervision. If they do not 'pass' re-evaluation, they are automatically downgraded to Level 2.

b) Level 2 (D2, J2, H2, S2)

- Requires Confederation Testing Approval.
- Can Chief or Officiate at Confederation Titled, Record "R", Rankings "L" events.
- Can officiate at World Titles Events by exception.

(Currently - Senior USA, E&A Level 2, Aus/NZ Level 2, etc.)

c) Level 3 (D3, J3, H3, S3)

- Requires National Federation Testing/Approval.
- Can only officiate at Rankings "L" competitions.

(Currently - Regular USA, E&A Level 3, Aus/NZ Level 3, etc)

Limitation of L3 Officials to "L" events: Please refer to rule 25.09.

d) Level 4 (D4, J4, S4)

- Requires National Federation Testing/Approval.
- Can only officiate at National competitions.
- Assistant /Entry Level officials

(Currently – Assistant USA, Aus/NZ Level 4, Canada, etc) Note:

- 1) Single event and Two event officials are recognized at all levels.
- 2) Officials appointed for World Titled and Confederation Titled Events must be qualified in all 3 events.

Driver: A driver cannot have 2 roles in the same event, (cannot be at the same time: Driver and Judge, Driver and Scorer or Driver and Homologator), but can have, if qualified, different roles in different events.

Where the duplication causes a conflict, the final decision will be taken by a simple majority of the event Judges. Any duplication of duties is limited to two functions but should be avoided if possible.

 - a) Ramp heights- Agreed that at a World Event, series 4+ Jumpers should be grouped by ramp height and series 1/2/3 by performance.
 - *b) SEEDING- reworded for clarity*

14.12: Entry and Administration

.....

a) Establishment of seeding for the World Championships:

Seeding will be established using the Weekly Ranking List published 30 days before the start of the first event and the same dated list from the prior year where the skiers rank is the higher of the current list or the previous year's list with a 25% penalty. Where seeding ties exist when comparing the current and prior year list, the skier ranked from the current year will take the higher seed, followed by the skier from the previous year. If a tie still exists, then skiers seeding will be subject to a random draw.

For example: If the first day of competition skiing is Oct 12th the Weekly Ranking List published as of September 12th shall be use as well as the September 12th Weekly Ranking List of the prior year with a 25% penalty. **Examples:**

Skiers with no performances on those lists list will be subject to a random draw in the lowest series unless he has at least two scores after the most recent ranking list. In that case the average to his two best scores will be used to position him in the seeding.

The number on the previous year Ranking List will be used with a 25% penalty.

1) Establishment of seeding for the top 5 overall men and women:

The top 5 overall men and the top 5 overall women attending the championships, and obtained as above, shall all ski in the same seed group in each event.

The appropriate seed group for each event will be determined by taking the seed group of the highest placed top 5 overall skier and placing all 5 in that same series in addition to the original group size.

2) Establishment of seeding for other individually qualified overall skiers who are not on the single event ranking list:

An overall skier may have an overall ranking, but not be on the event list. In this case the performance level will be used to pick the seed number. If it is from the previous year, the same 25% penalty shall apply. This will determine the seed group. That skier will be added to that seed group as the first skier on the water from that group.

3) Preliminary Round draw:

The skiers will then be divided into groups. The group size will normally be 10 men and 10 women but may be changed before the start of the championships by the Chief Judge. For Jump, to determine the order of skiing, up to series 4 Rule <u>10.01</u> applies. For series 3, 2 and 1 skiers will remain in their seeding group and in within each series skiers jumping at a lower ramp height will ski before those jumping at a higher ramp height. (however see Rule <u>10.01</u> for jumping order). It is recommended that Series 1 and 2 for women and Series 1, 2 and 3 for men be scheduled so that these skiers will have similar conditions.

The starting order for the preliminary round will be made using reverse order of the combined seeding list achieved as described in rule 14.12 a). ranking list scores.

b) Final round starting order

The order of the skiers qualified for the final round in any event shall be the reverse of their order of placement in the preliminary round of that event.

The order of competitors tied in placement shall be settled by random draw.

For Jump, while respecting the above, skiers jumping at low ramp hight will ski before those jumping at the higher height.

The document has been discussed and approved as emended above.

VI. Final Items from Meeting

Decrease the number of Judges to run an L event.

Some duties can already by doubled up but not considered that the absolute numbers should be reduced.

B. Officials Uniforms – Recommended Navy Blue or Black.

Key Callouts

- Despite not boosting any posts this year, our growth has been excellent across all platforms, except Instagram, which we know is the typical pattern. Instagram is where our audience is least engaged.
- Although we know it's least engaged, I really focused on growing Instagram this year, and was hoping to move the needle a bit more. Activating on stories, implementing hashtag and following strategies, were not significantly impactful, indicating that more of our audience prefers engaging on/is more engaged on Facebook. However, I don't want to dial back our efforts on Instagram, as I feel that this could certainly change over time, and am open to any ideas you or the team might have for new ways to engage on IG.

2023 Key Callouts:

- Data I used to previously include on this report, like full-year impressions and engagements across lifetime posts, are no longer available in Facebook's native insights platform. It would be great to see if the budget could support a third-party analytics tool.
- Despite losing monetization for about 4 months this year, and having less video views than last year, we were able to far surpass video views earnings from any previous year. We were able to earn an increased CPM because of our video roll-out strategy, showing sustained engagement to advertisers, allowing Facebook to value our CPM higher. While this amount is still small, I look forward to growing it in 2024
- We are showing signs of hitting our saturation point on Facebook. I would expect our follower increases to start leveling off or decreasing YOY, especially as younger audiences embrace newer platforms

Total achievements over the last 4 years of FB account management:

- Followers increased by 21,000
- Video views increased by 60 million

Key Callouts

- We greatly increased our reach this year, indicating that our hashtag and tagging strategy has helped to increase post dispersion. These kinds of things are important to consider when planning things like guests for the podcast, who we put on the cover of the magazine, etc.
- In general, our audience is less engaged on Instagram than on Facebook. Despite a greater focus on stories this year, the landscape for stories has evolved and people are more likely to bypass a whole set of stories if the first one doesn't instantly hook a user. I'm applying these insight to how we publish stories in 2024.
- It's hard to compare Instagram metrics to Facebook metrics since Instagram only measures data for posts done that calendar year. Often posts published previously have a resurgence of attention (and we want that) but Instagram's built-in analytics can't measure that. It would be great to see if we can implement a metrics program for 2024 (if in budget).
