1. SELECTION SYSTEM

- 1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:
 - 1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of participation in any of the events listed in 1.2.1.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games.

1.1.2. Minimum International Olympic Committee (IOC), standards for participation:

Any competitor in the Olympic Games, must be a national of the country of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Olympic Charter (Rule 41).

1.1.3. Minimum International Federation (IF) standards for participation (if any):

Athletes must be listed by name in the Olympic World Skate Rankings (OWSR) as of June 24, 2024. Rankings can be found here: https://www.worldskate.org/skateboarding/ranking-paris-2024.html

- 1.1.4. Other requirements:
 - Athlete must be a member of USA Skateboarding the National Federation in good standing at the time of nomination.
 - Athlete must successfully complete all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.

- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current <u>USOPC Background Check</u> <u>Policy</u>.
- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with the <u>USOPC</u> Athlete Safety Policy.

1.2. Tryout Events:

1.2.1. Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

The following qualification pathway is the method in which quota places are earned for the 2024 Olympic Games, in accordance with the qualification system established by World Skate and approved by the IOC: https://stillmed.olympics.com/media/Documents/Olympic-Games/Paris-2024/Paris2024-QS-Skateboarding.pdf

OWSR ranking points will be awarded at the following World Skate and IOC sanctioned competitions held over three (3) "Seasons", across two (2) Phases, between 22 June 2022 and 23 June 2024:

- World Championships
- Olympic Qualifier Series
- o Pro Tour Events
- 5-Star Events
- 3-Star Events

Competition Seasons / Events

Phase 1: Includes Seasons 1-3

<u>Season 1: 2022 - 22 June to 31 December 2022</u>

Rome Street: 26 Jun – 3 Jul 2022, Rome, ITA

Season 2: 2023 - 1 January to 31 December 2023

- 2022 Street World Championships: 25 Jan 5 Feb 2023, Sharjah, UAE
- 2022 Park World Championships: 5 -12 Feb 2023, Sharjah, UAE

- Rome Street: 18 25 Jun 2023, Rome, ITA
- Remaining Season 2 events: dates, and locations are TBD, but will be announced on USA Skateboarding website here, within 48 hours of event announcement.
 - O San Juan Park: May 21-28, 2023, San Juan, ARG
 - o Lausanne Street: September 10-17, 2023, Lausanne, SUI
 - O Rome Park World Championships: October 1-8, 2023, Ostia, ITA
 - Japan Street World Championships: December 10-17, 2023, Tokyo, JPN

Season 3: 2024 - 1 January to 23 June 2024

- Season 3 events: dates, and locations are TBD, but will be announced on USA Skateboarding's website here, within 48 hours of event announcement.

Phase 2: Includes Olympic Qualifier Series (OQS)

- Olympic Qualifier Series (2 Events)
 - OQS 1: May 14-19, 2024, Shanghai, China
 - OQS2: June 18-23, 2024, Budapest, Hungary

1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in 1.2.1.:

A) USOPC IMS Skateboarding will conduct the following process for all events in Phase 1, Seasons 2 and 3, starting with the Lausanne Street WST event:

For all events that are sanctioned by World Skate and count toward the OWSR (World Championships, Olympic Qualifier Series, Pro Tour Events, 5-Star Events, 3-Star Events) the selection of Park and Street athletes will be determined by the athlete's OWSR ranking.

Generally, World Skate provides automatic invitations to pre-seeded and open qualifier skaters. Pre-seeded skaters are typically the top five highest ranked OWSR athletes in each discipline and gender, while open qualifier skaters are ranked #6-30 in each discipline and gender.

Beyond the skaters who qualify through the pre-seeding rules as determined by World Skate, USOPC IMS - Skateboarding may invite additional skaters to participate in international competitions where ranking points may be earned. In these cases, USOPC IMS - Skateboarding will fill open positions in rank order based on OWSR, with the highest ranked U.S. athlete invited first.

B) For Phase 2 events, the Olympic Qualifier Series, the following process, including replacement athletes, will be conducted as follows:

The 2024 Olympic Qualifier Series team will be comprised of a maximum of twenty-four (24) athletes: six (6) athletes per event (Men's Park, Men's Street, Women's Park, and Women's Street), provided all available quota places are qualified in accordance with World Skate's Olympic Qualification System for Paris 2024.

Athletes will be selected by name according to the OWSR (following the conclusion of all eligible Phase 1 OWSR events) as of March 5, 2024 (Park) and March 11, 2024 (Street) with a maximum quota of six (6) athletes per NOC per gender for each event until the number of one-hundred seventy-six (176) athletes is reached for the series. This includes representation from each of the continents with at least one highest placed athlete per event, at least one highest placed athlete from the host country of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games (FRA), at least one highest placed eligible athlete from one of the OQS host countries (CHN and HUN), and at least one universality placed eligible athlete.

If an athlete quota place is not confirmed or is declined by the NOC, it will be reallocated to the highest ranked athlete not yet qualified by name on the OWSR as of March 8 (Park) or March 13 (Street), respecting the maximum quota per country, per event. This process will be conducted until the start of the first OQS event Technical Meeting in Shanghai, China.

C) The following process was conducted with the below outlined criteria for all events in Phase 1, Seasons 1 and 2, ending with the WST Rome 2023 event:

For all events that are sanctioned by World Skate and count toward the OWSR (World Championships, Olympic Qualifier Series, Pro Tour Events, 5-Star Events, 3-Star Events) the selection of Park and Street athletes will be determined utilizing the following methods in 2023 and 2024:

Generally, World Skate provides automatic invitations to pre-seeded skaters. Pre-seeded skaters are typically the top five highest ranked OWSR athletes in each discipline and gender.

Beyond the skaters that qualify through the pre-seeding rules as determined by World Skate, USA Skateboarding may send additional skaters to participate in international competitions where ranking points may be earned. In these cases, USA Skateboarding will fill open positions with National Team members first (in rank order based on OWSR, with the highest ranked U.S. athlete, invited first). USA Skateboarding's National Team is listed here and the selection criteria for being named to the team is provided here and the selection criteria for being named to the team is provided here. If any positions remain open, then USA Skateboarding may extend invitations based on the discretionary selection to those who have not already accepted an invitation (whether extended by World Skate or USA Skateboarding).

Discretionary selection will be utilized to determine unfilled spots in each event. The application of discretionary selection may allow elite riders who were injured, ill, or who experienced extenuating circumstances including but not limited to equipment failure, weather complications, travel delays, or canceled events during the qualification period, the opportunity to be considered for World Skate events. When applying discretionary selection, the USA SKB Athlete Event Selection Committee will consider a range of performance factors that will include the following in no particular order:

- Athletes who medaled at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics
- Athletes with a podium finish at the most recent USA Skateboarding National Championships
- Athletes who demonstrate an overall consistent ability to place top ten in high-level events (including National

- Championships, Street League, X Games, Dew Tour, and other events that exhibit high levels of competition and attendance)
- Olympic World Skate Rankings (OWSR) at the time of selection

USA Skateboarding's Athlete Event Selection Committee will be comprised of the following committee:

- USAS High Performance Director
- USAS Athlete Representative
- USAS General Manager

Conflict of interest

All members of the selection committee must comply with USA Skateboarding conflict of interest policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form for review USA Skateboarding's ethics committee prior to convening the committee.

Any member of the selection committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to USA Skateboarding's ethics committee prior to the start of the selection process and/or recuse him/herself from the review process and/or voting. A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business interest of the committee member poses a direct or indirect relationship, connection, or affiliation, past or present, with an athlete in contention for the applicable team selection that could compromise the committee member's ability to participate in the selection process in an unbiased manner. If a conflict exists, USA Skateboarding ethics committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting). For example, if it is determined that a committee member must recuse him/herself from voting, the ethics committee may still determine that a committee member who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance, for example a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the selection committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and so long as the committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision. The committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to USA Skateboarding's ethics committee. Reports may be made anonymously. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USA Skateboarding selection committee appointment process.

1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these Games (include maximum Team size):

The 2024 U.S. Olympic Team will be comprised of a maximum of twelve (12) athletes: three (3) athletes per event (Men's Park, Men's Street, Women's Park, and Women's Street), provided all available quota places are qualified in accordance with World Skate's Olympic Qualification System for Paris 2024 https://stillmed.olympics.com/media/Documents/Olympic-Games/Paris-2024/Paris2024-QS-Skateboarding.pdf

Athletes will be selected by name according to the OWSR (following the conclusion of all eligible OWSR events) as of June 24, 2024, with a maximum quota of three (3) athletes per NOC for each event until the number of twenty (20) athletes is reached, including representation from each of the five continents with at least one athlete per event.

3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

3.1. Prior to submitting submission of athlete entries by name to by the USOPC to the Organizing Committee of the Olympic Games, the USA Skateboarding-USOPC IMS - Skateboarding has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USA Skateboarding USOPC IMS - Skateboarding may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Skateboarding USOPC IMS - Skateboarding:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USA Skateboarding CEO USOPC SVP Chief of Paralympics & Internally Managed Sport.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Skateboarding-USOPC IMS Skateboarding. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Skateboarding-USOPC IMS Skateboarding, his/her injury will be assumed to be debilitating and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of the <u>USA Skateboarding-</u>USOPC Code of Conduct for Internally Managed Sports (https://www.teamusa.com/skateboarding-athlete-resources).
- 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1. of these selection procedures.
- 3.1.6. Violation of the USA Skateboarding USOPC IMS Skateboarding National and/or Non-National Team Agreement(s)

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the USOPC's Internally Managed Sport Dispute Resolution Hearing procedures https://www.teamusa.com/skateboarding-athlete-resources.

3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Organizing Committee of the Olympic Games, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable USOPC Code of Conduct for Internally Managed Sports, the USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply, contained in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms. The USOPC Games Delegation Terms are

specific to each Games and made available during the Games registration process; the USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process can be found here.

Once athlete entries have been submitted to the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable USA Skateboarding Code of Conduct, the USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply, contained in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms. The USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and made available during the Games registration process; the USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the Delegation Terms. 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USA Skateboarding USOPC IMS - Skateboarding policies, as applicable.
