Vision: USA Wrestling will strive to be the worlds best sports organization.





2014-2015 U.S. MEN'S FREESTYLE HIGHLIGHTS

At the 2014 World Championships, the U.S. men's freestyle team had two bronze medalists, Tervel Dlagnev (125 kg) and Jordan Burroughs (74 kg). Other top 10 finishers included Nick Marable (8th at 70 kg) and Jimmy Kennedy (10th at 61 kg). The USA tied for ninth in the standings with Ukraine. Burroughs had won every World and Olympic title since 2011, but injured his knee in an early round. The fact that he managed to medal on one leg was a remarkable feat. This was the first World Championships after the return of Bruce Burnett as National Coach, who has a proven track record of peaking athletes for World and Olympic competitions.

The 2015 age-group performances in men's freestyle were impressive with four World champions and nine medalists. At the Junior Worlds, Spencer Lee won gold at 50 kg, a year after winning a Cadet World gold. At the Cadet Worlds, three Americans won gold medals, Yianni Diakomihalis (58 kg), Jarod Verkleeren (63 kg) and Gable Steveson (100 kg). The men's freestyle pipeline is healthy with many talents.

2014-2015 U.S. WOMEN'S FREESTYLE HIGHLIGHTS

The United States has been a top nation in women's wrestling for the past three Olympic cycles. This continued at the 2014 World Championships, with three strong medal performances. Adeline Gray won her second career World gold medal with her victory at 75 kg. Two other past World medalists added to their medal haul, Elena Pirozhkova with a silver at 63 kg and Helen Maroulis with a 55 kg bronze. Also in the top 10 were Alyssa Lampe (5th at 48 kg), Alli Ragan (5th at 58 kg) and Whitney Conder (9th at 53 kg). National Women's Coach Terry Steiner's team brought home a third place trophy from the Worlds, always a great achievement.

In 2015, the Cadet World Team boasted four medalists, led by World champion Ronna Heaton at 49 kg. Other Cadet World medals went to Alleida Martinez (silver at 46 kg), Kayla Marano (bronze at 65 kg) and Alexis Bleau (bronze at 70 kg). The USA was third in the team standings at Cadet Worlds. At the Junior Worlds, Becka Leathers came home with a bronze medal at 55 kg, the only medal in a sixth-place team finish. The women's program is maturing and are now focusing on developing future stars.



2014-2015 GRECO-ROMAN HIGHLIGHTS

The 2014 World Championships was the first year under new National Greco-Roman Coach Matt Lindland who was hired in May 2014. A World and Olympic Silver medalist, he was part of the first group who came through the OTC Greco-Roman resident program in the late 1990's. For the first time since 2009, the United States won a medal in Greco-Roman at the Worlds when Andy Bisek claimed a 75 kg bronze medal. He beat the reigning Olympic and World champion from Russia during a strong effort. Another wrestler in the top 10 was veteran Spenser Mango, fifth at 59 kg.

The USA did not win a medal at either the Cadet or Junior World Championships in 2015. In addition to Senior success, Lindland is focused on recruitment and training of recent top-level NCAA talent in Greco-Roman and talent identification and relationship building within the Cadet and Junior age groups. Progress in those areas is already being seen, and team morale at all levels is very high.

STATE SERVICES




Revenue has grown in total dollars and equally important our Donor base (new donors) has grown as well.

USA WRESTLING SIGNS A HISTORIC TELEVISION PARTNERSHIP DEAL

USA Wrestling signed a historic partnership with NBC Sports Group and the Universal Sports Network for a record amount of national television coverage of the 2014-2015 wrestling events. Included was coverage of nine telecasts, five live telecasts, and **more than 12 hours of total coverage**, the most in history. The events shown on NBCSN and Universal Sports Network, included the Men's Freestyle World Cup, U.S. Open, Beat the Streets USA vs. Cuba Dual meet, U.S. World Team Trials (FS/GR) and Greco-Roman World Team Trials.

EVENTS

HOSTED 2015 MEN'S FREESTYLE WORLD CUP IN LOS ANGELES, CA



U.S. hosted the Men's Freestyle World Cup for the second straight year, April 11-12 at the Forum in Los Angeles, Calif. The United States hosted seven of the top teams in the world featuring Cuba, Mongolia, Russia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Iran and Turkey. With **over 5,000 fans in attendance**, the United States took on Iran in the finals of the World Cup. Iran ended up on the top of the podium with the U.S. taking second and Mongolia third.

FOLKSTYLE TOUR OF AMERICA

The Folkstyle Tour of America completed a successful 2014-2015 campaign with six events, including two first year events. Overall participation in the Tour of America has **increased by 8.5%** from the previous year.


