The Kata Committee appreciates USA Judo support to the expansion to kata at the national and international competition levels. Special thanks to Vaughn Anderson, Aspen Shelton, and Connor Jenkins.

2025 Senior Nationals Kata Championship, Birmingham, AL

- This year, Itsutsu-no-kata and Koshiki-no-kata were added to align with IJF World Kata Championship divisions.
- Junior category age was changed to align with IJF age categories. (i.e., Junior = Under 21).
- Third year for the new national-level categories and divisions continued to successfully attract new (younger and developing) teams.
- Senior Nationals results are the main criteria to determine the USA Kata Team for the PJC Pan-American and IJF World Judo Kata Championships.
- Participation generally continues to increase. Teams report that the 'per team' price encourages additional registration in more katas.

Additional activities of note:

- US Kata Judges participated in IJF kata-circuit tournaments in Spain, France, and Germany.
- Nine (9) American judoka attended the Kodokan Summer Kata course in July 2025.
- Monthly kata analysis and discussion via Zoom were continued (started in September 2021).
 Discussions open to all. Participants include competitors, judges, coaches, instructors, and those just learning the kata. Sessions are 1.5 hours and generally attended by 20 30 participants. To be added to notifications, email JudoDTJackson@gmail.com
- Planned development of a Kata Advisory Committee in 2026
- The Kata Committee is the in process of: 1) creating resource list for learning kata, 2) updating the current kata judges list, 3) updating USA Kata Team document, and 4) creating a list of USA judoka knowledgeable in the katas who are willing to support any judo player seeking to learn a kata for promotion, increased judo studies, and competition.

Potential Kata growth areas for USA:

- IJF now maintains Athlete points for kata, based on World Championship, IJF Kata-circuit tournaments, and Continental Championships.
- In July 2026, Canada will host the first Pan-American IJF Kata-circuit tournament in Montreal.
- Expansion of Junior kata teams. USAJudo should consider adding Kata to Junior Olympics or other large internationally attended USAJudo tournament.
