ATHLETE SELECTION PROCEDURES
Prince George 2024 Para Biathlon World Championships
November 7, 2023

1. SELECTION SYSTEM

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:

1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of selection.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the event.

1.1.2. Minimum International Federation (IF) standards for participation (if any):

To compete at the 2024 Para Biathlon World Championships all athletes must:

- Meet all eligibility criteria set out in the Para Nordic International Competition Rules (ICR) found at: <https://www.fis-ski.com/en/para-snowsports/para-nordic/documents> ;
- Have a valid 2023/2024 FIS license issued in accordance with the art. 203 of the ICR;
- Be internationally classified with a Sport Class Status Confirmed or Review(R) with a Fixed Review Date 2024 or later (i.e., Review 2024 or later);
- Have achieved race points in at least one race of the 2023/2024 season by 15 February 2024;
- Be born in 2008 or earlier.

To compete:

- Athletes must be ranked and have a maximum of 270 overall points or less on the FIS Ranking List in Para Biathlon or on the FIS Ranking List Para Cross-Country Skiing as of 15 February 2024.

1.1.3. Other requirements (if any):

- Athlete must be in good standing with U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing (USPN) at the time of nomination.

- Athlete have competed in an official FIS Para Biathlon race between March 1, 2023-February 15, 2024.
- Athlete must successfully complete all World Championships registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Any athlete aged 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#).
- Any athlete aged 18 or older as of the end of competition at the World Championships will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport’s education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#).

1.2. Tryout Events:

1.2.1. Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in 1.2.1.:

- All FIS Para Nordic Continental Cup level races (or below) are open to athletes with a valid FIS Para Nordic License and an international classification Sport Status Class of Confirmed (C) or Review (R) 2024 or later.
- Participation in World Cups require qualification published here: <https://www.usparanordic.org/selection-criteria>

1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these World Championships (include maximum Team size):

- All athletes who achieve the selection criteria will be selected to the team. There will be no maximum team size.

2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION (if applicable)

2.1. Rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

The purpose of discretionary selection is to allow U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing the ability to nominate the best physically, psychologically, and technically prepared athletes to the World Championships Team who are capable of a podium result, who can positively impact Team performance, or those who are considered to be on track to produce a podium result in future Paralympic competition and are not captured through objective measures. The U.S. Paralympics Discretionary Selection Committee

for Nordic Skiing will evaluate and recommend athletes to be nominated to the Team via discretionary criteria.

2.2. Define the discretionary criteria to be used (if any):

A. Nordic Skiing athletes:

The following factors, not in priority order, may be considered in the discretionary selection of up to five (5) total athletes of either gender:

- Podium result outside of the selection period in World Cup, World Championships, or Paralympic Games competitions.
- Recent positive direction or improving trend of competition results.
- Illness or injury during the selection period.
- Indication of medal potential in future Paralympic competition, including in a relay event.

B. Guide athletes

The Discretionary Selection Committee will nominate guide athletes to the Team through discretionary selection. Guide athletes are used for the B1-3 sport classes (visually impaired). The total number of guide athletes nominated is contingent upon the overall number of athletes in the B1-3 sport classes nominated to the team.

The below factors, in no priority order, will be considered in the selection of a guide athlete:

- The speed of the guide athlete in relation to the athlete being guided. The guide athlete must be faster than the athlete.
- Voice command and positioning experience.
- Preference of the qualified athlete.
- Demonstrated expertise of the guide athlete—must have expertise and experience in the assigned athlete’s specific event(s).
- Knowledge and understanding of the FIS Para Nordic Rules pertaining to guide athletes. <https://www.fis-ski.com/en/para-snowsports/para-nordic/documents>

Guide athletes will be held to the same standards and code of conduct as outlined in these Procedures. The guide athlete position is contingent on the nomination and participation of the designated athlete to be guided. If the designated athlete is removed, or will not compete, the guide athlete will be removed unless otherwise reassigned to another athlete by the Discretionary Selection Committee.

- 2.3. Name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, or other decisions/recommendations directly impacting athletes, along with a complete list of the members' titles:

U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing Discretionary Committee:

- Athlete Representative, U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing
- Director, U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing
- Director, Paralympic Performance, U.S. Paralympics

- 2.3.1. Process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee:

All members of the selection committee must comply with the USOPC Conflict of Interest Policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USOPC's Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

Any member of the selection committee who has an actual, potential, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it consistent with the USOPC's Conflict of Interest Policy prior to the start of the selection process. A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business interest of the committee member poses a direct or indirect relationship, connection, or affiliation, past or present, with an athlete in contention for the applicable team selection that could compromise or could be perceived to compromise the committee member's ability to participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. If an actual, potential, or perceived conflict exists, the internally managed sport team should send the disclosure to the Chief Ethics & Compliance Officer and the Sr. Director, Compliance Investigations and Ethics (collectively, the Ethics team) to share with the Ethics & Compliance Committee for review and disposition. For example, if a Selection Committee member may be required to recuse him/herself from voting, but that individual may still be able to provide relevant or necessary information concerning athlete performance in a fair and impartial manner. The Selection Committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee during the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USOPC's Ethics team. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USOPC's internally managed sport selection committee appointment process.

3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 3.1. An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USPN may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USPN:
 - 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing Director.
 - 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by U.S. Paralympics Nordic Skiing, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
 - 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
 - 3.1.4. Violation of the U.S. Paralympics National Team or Non-National Team Athlete Agreement.
 - 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1. of these selection procedures.
 - 3.1.6. Removal by the IPC/IF of the event in which the athlete qualified for the team from the medal event program of the World Championships.
 - 3.1.7. Change in the athlete's sport class(es) following team selection, such that:
 - 3.1.7.1. the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified him/her for the team; and/or
 - 3.1.7.2. the athlete is deemed Not Eligible (NE) by the IPC/IF.

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USOPC Bylaws, Section 9.

- 3.2. An athlete may be removed from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IPC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy, as applicable.

4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:

There will be no replacement of athletes.

5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

USPN will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six months past the last date of competition of the World Championships.

6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Code of Conduct, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the USPN World Championships team.

7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES

The USOPC-approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by the USPN in the following public location(s):

These procedures will be posted as soon as possible, but not more than five business days following notice of approval by the USOPC.

8. DATE OF NOMINATION

Nomination of athletes, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes on or before:

February 15, 2024

9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule and duration of mandatory training and/or competition:

There will be no mandatory training or competitions.

10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must adhere to all IPC, WADA, FIS, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IPC, WADA, FIS, USADA and USOPC rules, as applicable.

The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USPN. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.

14. ATHLETE OMBUDS OFFICE

The Athlete Ombuds Office provides cost-free, independent and confidential advice regarding athlete rights, grievance procedures and any other related guidance pertaining to selection procedures and can assist in mediating disputes between athletes and their NGB/PSO.
