

**U.S. PARALYMPICS POWERLIFTING
ATHLETE SELECTION PROCEDURES
2024 PARALYMPIC GAMES
MARCH 11, 2024**

1. SELECTION SYSTEM

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the 2024 Paralympic Games (the Games) team (the Team):

1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of nomination.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games (valid through March 8, 2025).

1.1.2. Minimum International Paralympic Committee (IPC) standards for participation:

Any competitor in the Paralympic Games must be a national of the country of the National Paralympic Committee (NPC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the IPC Handbook (Section 2, Chapter 3.1).

1.1.3. Minimum International Federation (IF) standards for participation (if any):

Paris 2024 Paralympic Games Qualification Criteria:

To be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must:

1. Hold an active World Para Powerlifting (WPPO) Athlete License for the 2022, 2023, and 2024 seasons;
2. Be internationally classified in an eligible Sport Class with a Sport Class Status of (i) Confirmed, or (ii) Review with a Fixed Review Date of 2025 or later;
3. Have completed all the requirements set out in the “World Para Powerlifting Qualification Pathway 2021-2024 (Section 1.2.1) and;
4. Be ranked in the World Para Powerlifting Preliminary Paralympic Ranking List closing 26 June 2024 (inclusive).

Exceptions may be granted to criteria 3 and 4 through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.

1.1.4. Other requirements:

- Athlete must successfully complete all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#).
- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport’s education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#).

1.2. Tryout Events:

1.2.1. Event names, dates, and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

Athletes are selected based on the Paralympic Ranking List Allocation per the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games Qualification Guide and must have completed all requirements per the Paris Pathway stated by World Para Powerlifting.

The World Para Powerlifting 2024 Paralympic Games Ranking List, here: <https://www.paralympic.org/powerlifting/rankings>, for each respective event here: <https://www.paralympic.org/powerlifting/events>, will be used to allocate slots. The Games Ranking List* (selecting Games Rankings from Ranking Type) will be based on results achieved during the Paralympic Games qualification period of 1 March 2022 to 26 June 2024.

1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in 1.2.1.:

Athletes must meet minimum eligibility requirements stated in the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games Qualification Guide.

- 1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these Games (include maximum Team size):

The qualification slot is allocated to the individual athlete, not to the NPC.

The maximum team size for the U.S. for the Games will be determined by WPPO.

Maximum Quota Allocation Per NPC:

An NPC may be allocated no more than eight (8) eligible male and eight (8) eligible female qualification slots, with a maximum of one (1) slot per individual medal event. Exceptions may be granted through the Bipartite Commission Invitation method.

Qualification System:

- A. The top eight (8) ranked eligible male athletes and the top eight (8) ranked eligible female athletes in each medal event on the World Para Powerlifting 2024 Paralympic Games Ranking List closing 26 June 2024 will obtain one (1) qualification slot.
- If an NPC achieves more slots than the maximum quota per NPC, the NPC will decide which athlete(s) should be offered the respective slot(s).
 - If U.S. slots exceed the maximum quota, athletes will be nominated to the Team based on the discretionary selection criteria listed in Section 2.

Bipartite Commission Invitations:

The IPC and/or WPPO may award Bipartite slots for the Games using the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation Method. The IPC/WPPO awards these Bipartite slots by name. Bipartite slots are allocated by the IPC based on the principles in no particular order:

- Allowing the participation of top athletes who may not have had the opportunity to qualify through other methods due to extraordinary circumstances;
- Ensuring the representation of athletes with high support needs;
- Enabling greater representation by gender;
- Ensuring medal events will have sufficient representation for event viability purposes; and/or
- Optimizing the presentation of a particular contest within its competition format and schedule.

U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting may, but is not required to, submit an application for Bipartite slot(s), depending on whether there are athlete candidates who meet the above principles and who are capable of a podium result in the near future. The U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting selection committee will meet on or before July 1, 2024, to determine athlete-by-name applications (if any) to be submitted for consideration by the Bipartite Commission and will submit all Bipartite applications to World Para Powerlifting on or before July 9, 2024. The U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting Committee will utilize the discretionary selection criteria outlined in Section 2, to determine the athlete-by-name applications. U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting will disclose the submission of a particular athlete to World Para Powerlifting for a Bipartite slot on its website (<https://www.usparapowerlifting.org/selection-procedures>). U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting will notify the athlete(s) if an application is submitted on their behalf.

If the IPC/WPPO awards a Bipartite slot to the athlete by name, U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting will accept the athlete to the Team, provided the athlete meets all eligibility provisions and other requirements set forth in these Procedures. U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting will disclose on its website the name of any athlete named to the Team through the Bipartite Invitation Allocation Method.

2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION (if applicable)

2.1. Rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

Discretionary Selection may be utilized to nominate athletes if U.S. slots exceed the maximum quota per NPC. Discretionary Selection may also be used for Bipartite selection.

2.2. Define the discretionary criteria to be used (if any):

A. Individual Events:

The U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting Discretionary Selection Committee will consider the following performance-related factors (in no particular order):

- The athlete's performances during the 2024 Paralympic Games qualification period.
- The athlete's current ranking in the World Para Powerlifting Paralympic Ranking List.
- The athlete's performance trajectory is favorable to future international success based on a top 8 finish at a WPPO sanctioned competition during the Games qualification period.

- Whether the athlete experienced an injury or illness that prohibited them from competing in multiple events during the qualification period.
- The availability of an open start right for the athlete's medal event.

2.3. Name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, or other decisions/recommendations directly impacting athletes in the selection process, along with a complete list of the members' titles:

U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting Discretionary Selection Committee:

Director, Internally Managed Sports

Manager, Internally Managed Sports

Athlete Representative

2.3.1. Process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee:

All members of the selection committee must comply with the [USOPC Conflict of Interest Policy](#), to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the USOPC's Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

Any member of the selection committee who has an actual, potential, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it consistent with the [USOPC's Conflict of Interest Policy](#) prior to the start of the selection process. A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business interest of the committee member poses a direct or indirect relationship, connection, or affiliation, past or present, with an athlete in contention for the applicable team selection that could compromise or could be perceived to compromise the committee member's ability to participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. If an actual, potential, or perceived conflict exists, the internally managed sport team should send the disclosure to the Chief Ethics & Compliance Officer and the Sr. Director, Compliance Investigations and Ethics (collectively, the Ethics team) to share with the Ethics & Compliance Committee for review and disposition. For example, if a Selection Committee member may be required to recuse him/herself from voting, but that individual may still be able to provide relevant or necessary information concerning athlete performance in a fair and impartial manner. The Selection Committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee during the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a

committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the USOPC's Ethics team. Reports may also be made anonymously through the [USOPC's Integrity Portal](#). No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the USOPC's internally managed sport selection committee appointment process.

3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 3.1. Prior to the submission of athlete entries by name by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee, U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is nominated to the Team by U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the Chief of Paralympics & Internally Managed Sports.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting, his/her injury will be assumed to be debilitating and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of the U.S. Paralympics Code of Conduct:

- 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1. of these selection procedures.
- 3.1.6. Removal by the IPC/IF of the event in which the athlete qualified for the team from the medal event program of the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.
- 3.1.7. Change in the athlete's sport class(es) following team selection, such that:
 - 3.1.7.1. the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified him/her for the team; and/or
 - 3.1.7.2. the athlete is deemed Not Eligible (NE) by the IPC/World Para Powerlifting.

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the [Internally Managed Sport Complaint Procedures](#).

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable IMS Athlete Code of Conduct, the USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply, contained in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms. The USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and made available during the Games registration process; the USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the USOPC Dispute Resolution Policy and Hearing Procedures.

- 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IPC, WADA, WPPO, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies, and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy, as applicable.

4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:

- 4.1.1. prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

Any qualification slots allocated and not used by the respective NPC will be reallocated to the highest ranked athlete (not yet qualified) in the same body weight category on the World Para Powerlifting 2024 Paralympic Games Ranking List.

- 4.1.2. after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.

6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Delegation Conduct Requirements, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Team (include as attachments or provide links):

- U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting Athlete Agreement
- IMS Athlete Code of Conduct
- Dispute Resolution Hearing Procedures

7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES

The USOPC approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting in the following public location(s):

8. DATE OF NOMINATION

Nomination of athletes, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes, and submitted to the USOPC on or before:

July 19, 2024

9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule, and duration of mandatory training and/or competition:

The location, schedule and duration of any mandatory training will be announced and posted on the U.S. Paralympics Powerlifting website at least 30 days prior to the start of the mandatory training and/or competitions. Mandatory training will be published [HERE](#).

While waivers for any mandatory training will not be unreasonably withheld, waivers will primarily be granted only for illness, injury, or other incapacity, or for personal/family emergency. All athletes nominated to the Team should arrange for appropriate time off from school, work, or other obligations well in advance of team activities. Requests for a waiver may be submitted in writing to the Director, Internally Managed Sports for review. A written response to all requests will be issued to the athlete within 72 hours of the request.

10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must adhere to all IPC, WADA, WPPO, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies, and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IPC, WADA, WPPO, USADA and USOPC rules, as applicable.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.



